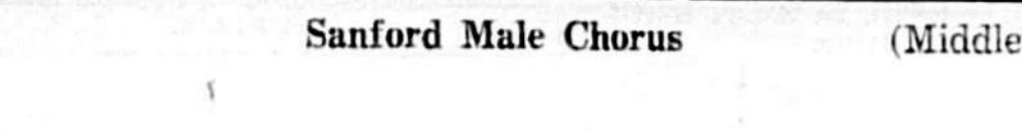

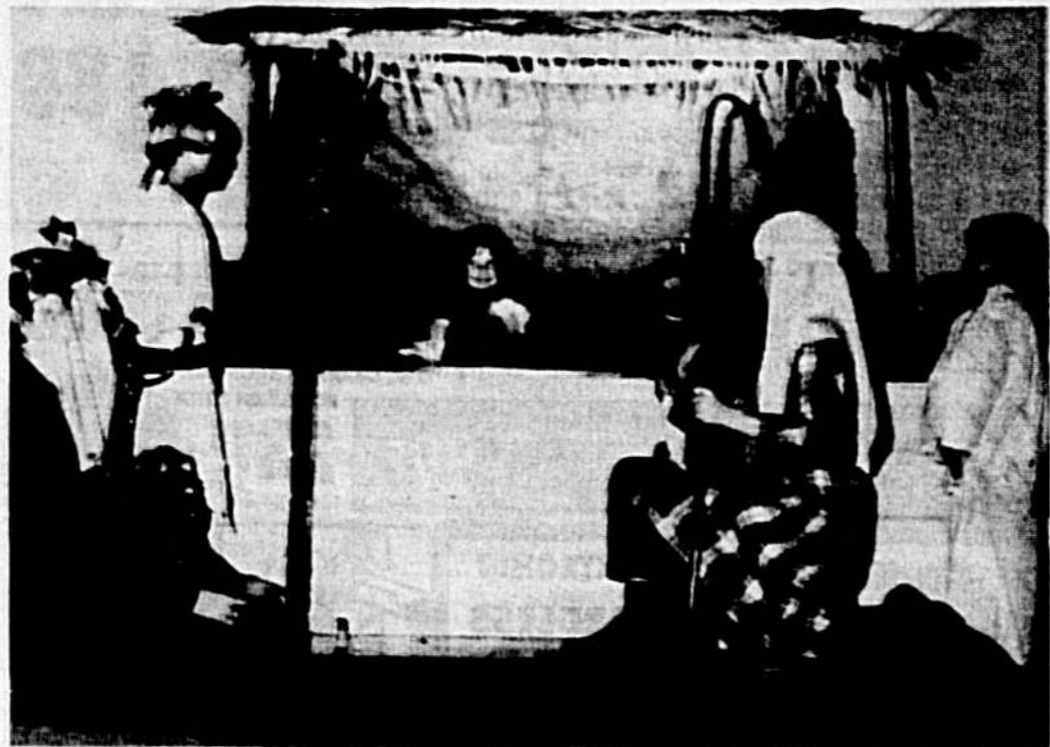

1/2 lb. candied mixed fruit
1/2 lb. candied cherries
3 lb. dates
1/2 lb. blanched almonds
1/2 lb. shelled pecans
3/4 cup sifted flour
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
1 cup butter
1 1/2 cups sugar
2 eggs

Put dates, cut all fruit into small chunks, chop almonds coarsely and toast until golden, chop pecans. Sift flour, making soda, salt and cinnamon together. Cream butter and sugar until mixture is smooth. Beat in eggs thoroughly, then stir in sifted dry ingredients and all fruits and nuts. Drop cookie batter from teaspoon on ungreased cookie sheets and bake in 400-degree oven for 10 minutes. Do not overbake. Cool slightly before removing from cookie sheet. Makes about 120 cookies.

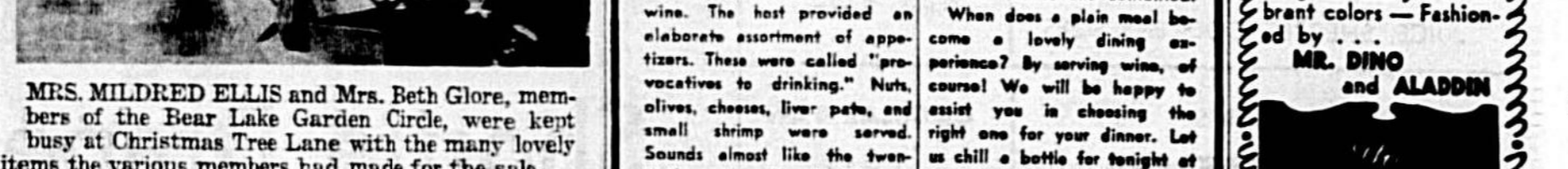

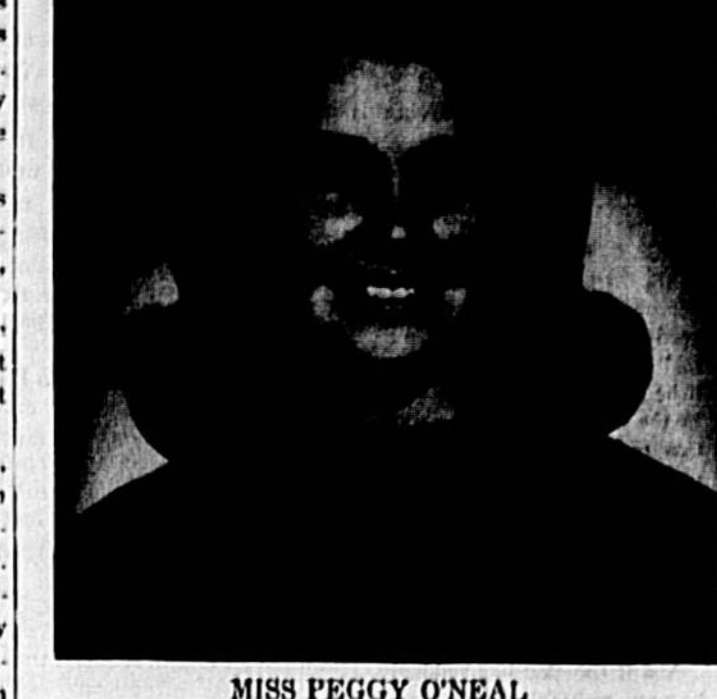
