



VA Pensioners Income Returns

Annual income reports are now due from some 80,000 VA pensioners in Florida, Mrs. Marie Hunt, service officer, announced today. "Veterans and widows affected have until Jan. 31, to get

the reports to the VA." report-Social Security benefits are considered income for VA purposes. Many people are concerned over the effect the increase in Social Security will have on their VA benefits. Mrs. Hunt issued a reminder that pensioners should only report what they actually receive -not what they think the in-

crease will be in 1968. "The President and the Congress have committed themselves to legislation which will insure no one winds up with less total income because of the Social Security increase," Mrs. Hunt added.

Concluding, Mrs. Hunt, said: "If, for example, a person had \$1,000 income in 1967 from Social Security, he should report that and also \$1,000 expected in 1968. When the Social Security increase becomes effective. the VA will make any necessary adjustments automatically." Further information and assistance is available at the Service Officer. Court House.

Boy Survives **Transplant**

CAPE TOWN, South Africa (AP)-A 10-year-old hoy who received a kidney from Denise Darvall, donor of Louis Washkansky's transplanted heart, was reported in astisfactory condition today and his doctors said the transplanted organ was functioning

The boy, Jonathan Van Wyk, is a patient at Cape Town's Bremer Hospital. Mrs. Gertie Van Wyk said she is confident her see will be discharged soon. "I was very, very serry to hear of Mr. Washkansky's death," she said; "particularly after he had made such fine progress. My heart goes out to his wife and family."

team at Cape Town's Groote Schuur hospital had made fer more heart transplants early next year. Shortly after Washkansky's operation, a Brooklyn, N.Y., heart surgeon, Dr. Adrian Kantrowitz, performed a transplant on a 21/2-week-old boy but the new heart failed after six hours. Kantrowitz said he could not explain the failure of the operation but he still believed in the

said Edward Darvall, father of healthy heart replaced Washkansky's failing organ in the historic operation. "After the operation there was at least part of my daughter still alive in Mr. Washkansky. But now she is completely dead." His daughter, Denise Ann. suffered fatal brain damage when struck by a car Dec. 2 and Darvall gave immediate permission for her heart to be used in the transplant. "I'll pull through." Washkansky kept insisting after the oper-


