### A Matter Of Discipline

Lieutenant General Ben Lear who is recognized as one of the most capable "brass hats" in the United States Army seems definitely to have put his foot in it, in so far as the more talkative members of Congress are concerned, when he ordered an entire division to march an extra 15 miles as disciplinary action growing out of an incident which occurred on a Memphis golf course.

The General, it seems, was playing golf when the division marched by. So were a number of bare-legged Memphis belles in shorts. The soldiers noticed the girls, as probably the General had also, and forgot for the moment that they were supposed to be soldiers on the march. But the crowning insult came when one of the soldiers, falling to recognize the General in mufti, yelled "Hey, buddy, don't you want a caddy?"

Imagine a buck private in the rear ranks calling his corps commander "buddy." Such conduct certainly merits the guard house for breach of military discipline... or a Distinguished Service Cross for exceptional courage in action. Such a soldier would have no hesitancy in charging a German machinegun nest. But in this instance the General did not recommend a medal.

We suppose there is something to be said for the General's point of view. If soldiers cannot maintain discipline when passing a golf course in one of their home towns, what would they do if an army of occupation they were marching through the streets of Dakar, or of Berlin? Soldiers have to be trained for all contingencies and certainly this is one of them.

Nevertheless, Congressmen are warning Gen. Lear not to let it happen again.

### Women Can Help

Although we hear a good deal about fifth columnists and saboteurs, there are literally millions of people in the United States who are the exact opposites of these wreckers of democracy and who are wondering these days what they can do to help the defense program along.

Of particular interest to women, therefore, is the pledge now being circulated by a well known women's college club, which begins, "This I will do," and continues as follows:

- 1. Fight unwaveringly for the principles of democracy in my town, my state and my nation.
- 2. Fight for the education of women in democratic ideals and democratic realities so that all women, working from the American home, can help to safeguard the spirit of democracy in a world in which democracy is under increasing attack.
- 3. Fight for the stimulation of increased spiritual faith and spiritual vision without which no democracy can long endure.
- 4. Fight against all undemocratic forces in American life, whether such forces be foreign-inspired or home-born in the hour of the nation's stress.
- 5. Fight those philosophies of government which would reduce men to soulless automatons and women to kitchen slaves and mere incubators for the state.
- 6. Fight, if war should come, with the same courage and sacrifice with which our American men will fight, so that our lines on the home front, as well as on the battle front, shall prove impregnable.
- 7. Fight, always and forever, for American justice, tolerance and freedom so they may stand unhindered and unimpeded as the hope and glory of the world.

**AGED WARMED NOT TO EXCEED ADDED FOODS UNTIL '42**

TALLAHASSEE, July 10. — (Special)—The state's new food laws will prohibit the sale of aged, warmed, not to exceed added foods until 1942.

The new laws, which are part of the state's food control act, prohibit the sale of any food that has been aged, warmed, or otherwise treated in a way that would make it unsafe for consumption.

The law applies to all food products, including meat, poultry, and seafood.

### Both Men, Women Needed For Work As FBI Agents

MIAMI, July 10.—(Special)—R. G. Dunner, special agent in charge of the Florida Division of the FBI, announced last week that more G-men and G-women are urgently needed and that applicants who could meet the qualifications should communicate with him at 1800 Biscayne Building, Miami. Dunner explained that despite

the need for a larger force, there has been no letdown on the strict requirements and he pointed out that applicants must pass rigid tests. They must be in excellent physical condition and survive a thorough investigation as to loyalty, integrity and ability. Appointments, he said, were based on personal qualifications and merit. Stenographic applicants, which includes women as well as men, are required to take tests and must be able to take dictation at the rate of 120 words a minute and qualify as typists. Typists

must pass typing test of 45 words a minute. There is a need at this time for specialists with positions open to men between the ages of 23 and 35, who have college degrees in special sciences. Salaries begin at \$2,000 with ample opportunity for advancement. Stores with soda fountains were literally prepared to meet the demand and clerks were kept busy all day long throughout the town. It was what appeared to be a never-ending

stream of eager customers. One cafe owner reported the sale of 110 pounds of hamburger, extra beef loins, weighing 33 pounds each, 165 dozen rolls, 185 cases of beer, four cases of eggs and 50 extra gallons of milk.

Well, after devastating civil war, Franco, not without some assistance from the Axis, won the day. He's now the ruler of Spain. He's a Catholic. He's a monarchist. He's a nationalist. He's a patriot. 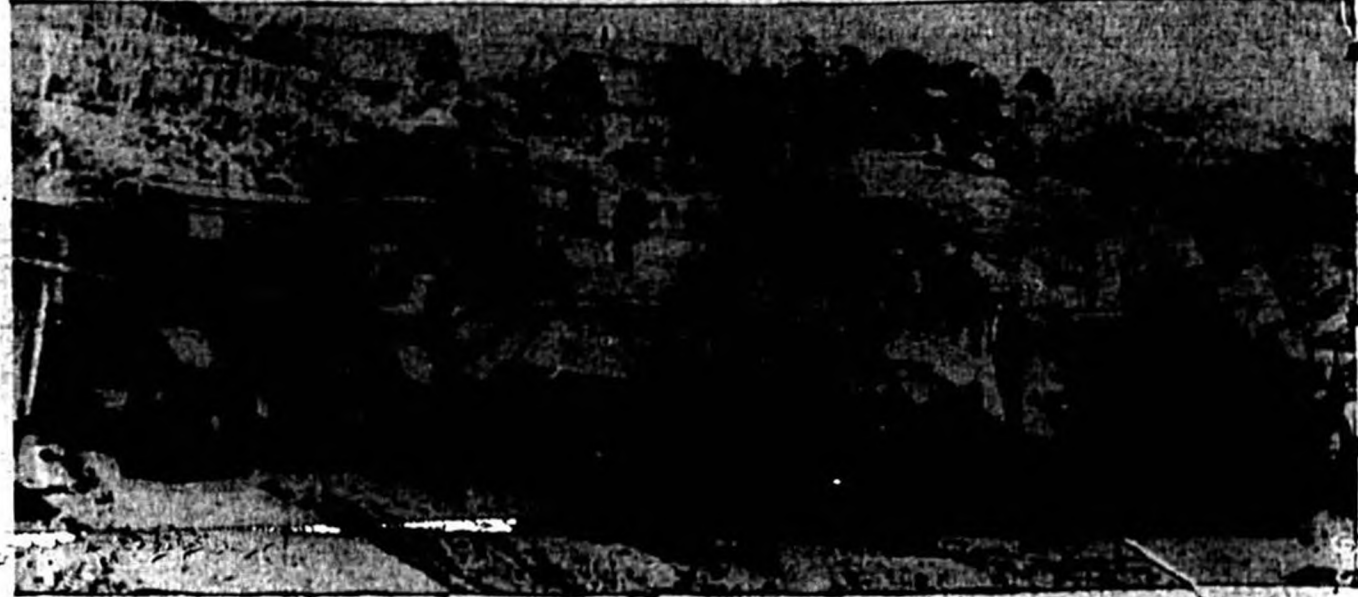

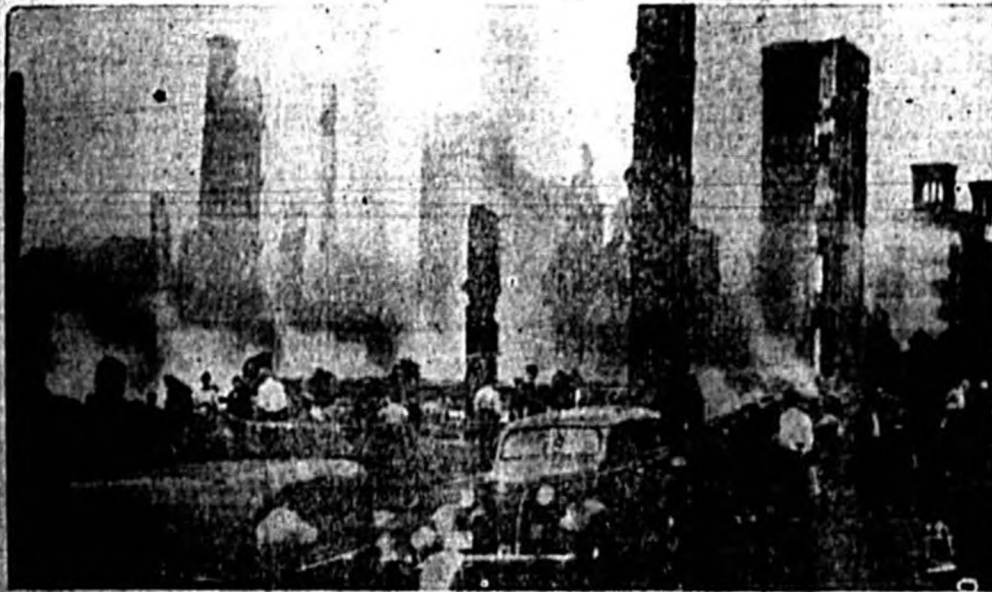

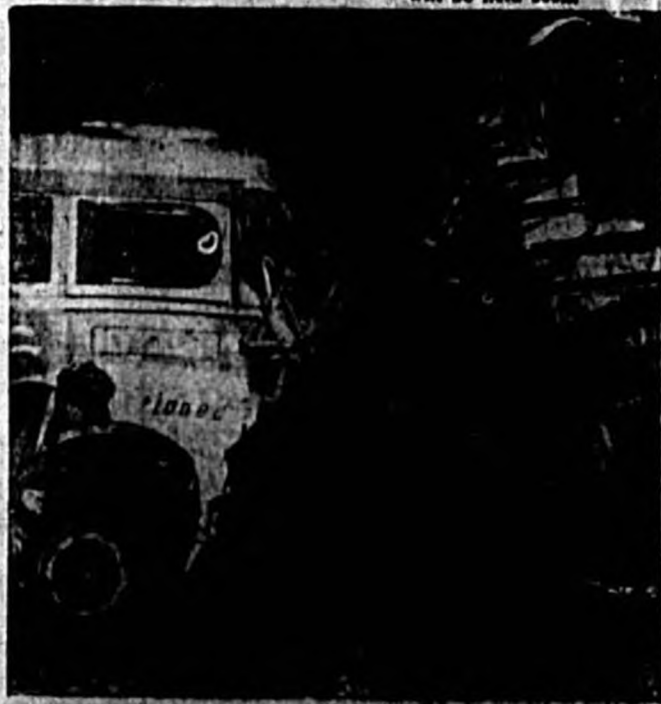

### County Defense Councils Asked To Man 800 Raid Observation Posts

TALLAHASSEE, July 10.—(Special)—County defense councils in Florida were called upon today to recruit and organize 17,840 observers to man 800 raid observation posts in the state within two weeks time.

This request went out from the State Defense Council offices here together with sets of instructions, individually prepared, for each observation post. The instructions were made up at Drew Field, Tampa, under the supervision of Brig. Gen. Walter H. Frank, commanding officer, Third Interceptor Command, Third Air Force, who flew to Tallahassee in an Army plane, bringing the envelopes of data to be turned over to the BDC here.

Completion of the air raid warning service in Florida will place this state second in the nation and first in the southeast in such defense organization.

Lieut. Gen. Albert H. Blanding of St. Augustine, BDC chairman for civil protection and former commander of the National Guard, is spending several days in the State Defense Council of view directing distribution of the instructions and organization details.

General Blanding pointed out that observation posts will be designated spots from which volunteer observers will watch and listen for approaching planes. Each will be located within a few seconds run from a telephone. No towers or other structures or equipment will be provided but volunteers may use their own field glasses if they wish. Observers will be trained by, and will work under the direction of the Army air command.

Details of recruiting and selecting persons from the rolls of those who registered recently for volunteer defense, and all other details of instruction will be

handled by the civil protection and labor and personnel divisions of the county councils.

Florida's air defense is the responsibility of the Third Interceptor Command, charged with the protection of the southeastern portion of the United States, south of Virginia and east of New Mexico.

Similar operations will be organized in all the states of the nation.

The thousands of trained watchers who would be called upon in an emergency will not go on duty immediately. They will be put through an intensive training for a few days out of each year, and will be ready to go into action, if and when needed.

Ferrets who registered recently for volunteer civilian defense work in this field of volunteer activity should call at the headquarters of their county defense council for further advice or detailed instructions.

Latest scientific devices in air attack and defense, perfected after independent studies by air experts of the United States and Great Britain, will be used in the air defense of the sunshine state.

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### Census Figures Show Increase In Population

TALLAHASSEE, July 10.—(Special)—Florida's urban population for 1940 had an increase of 77.8 percent over the 1930, while the rural population in 1940 exceeded the 1930 rural by 22.3 percent, according to George T. Gross, executive secretary of the Florida State Planning Board.

In actual figures, there is an increase of 228,613 in urban and 242,190 in the rural classification.

Breaking this down into white and non-white, the study made by the State Planning Board discloses that there was a 35.1 percent increase in the white urban population and a 36.1 percent gain in non-white urban population. In the rural classification, there was a 22.3 percent increase in the white rural and but a 1.8 percent gain in the rural non-white population.

Indicative of the trend away from the farm, Gross pointed out, is the fact that the rural non-farm white population in-

creased 40.9 percent while the white rural farm gained but 11.8 percent. For the non-white, the trend was reversed, as there was a loss of .7 percent in the non-white rural non-farm and a gain of 4.9 percent in the non-white rural farm.

It will be recalled that Florida's total population, according to the 1940 Census, is 1,897,414. This shows a gain of 23.3 percent over 1930. This study of the State's total population, 1,894,365 are white and 618,049 are non-white. There was a gain of 33.7 percent in the total white population but only an 18.8 percent increase in the non-white. The 1940 Census further shows that the total white population comprises 72 percent of the State's total, while the non-white is an even 27 percent, as against 89.8 percent for the negroes in 1930. Figures listed by the census department give the total population—urban and rural—total population—urban and rural.
