



JACKBENVILLE, July 10 Speeial—Cash grants to recipients of public assistance in Plorida for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1941, aggregated \$6,925,641, secording to announcement today of

the Etate Welfare Board.

Of the total, \$5,628,999 was poid to recipients of Old Age Assistance, \$903,520 to recipients of Aid to Dependent Children, and \$393,022 to recipients of Aid to the Blinds.

Total appropriation of state funds for the entire welfare program was but \$3,300,000 for the year. Expenditures were for cash grants to eligible recipients, operation of the Child Welfare Department and Child Welfare Services, WPA and NYA certification, distribution of surplus commodities and clothing, and participation in the school lends program. 


