## ...They Might Be, Too

New regulations in the federally funded Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) program to become effective in January could eliminate the jobs of some participants, including Winter Springs City Planner Dick Rozansky and Lake Mary City Planner Reggie Alford on Jan. 31.

Frank Powell, supervisor controller with the Seminole County office, said today persons employed under CETA and being paid \$10,000 annually prior to Oct. 1 could receive a supplement to his salary of up to \$1,000 from the employer's treasury.

But if the supplement placed the salary over \$11,000 annually, those employees must be terminated from the program prior to Jan. 31.

More dates were added to Rozansky's job earlier this year by the city. His salary including the \$10,000 now is \$11,200 and he is due for another five percent increase at the end of this month, according to Winter Springs City Clerk Mary Norton.

Meanwhile in Lake Mary, Alford's \$10,000 CETA

Lake Mary City Clerk Dick Pearson said today he will probably not be working for the city after Jan. 3, the beginning of the new term of office for Mayor Walter Swanson.

City Council Thursday night voted 5-2 to recommend Swanson appoint a new city clerk. Councilman Pat Southward, Bert Perich and Harry Terry voted to hire a new clerk. Councilman Cliff Baker and William Griffin voted in the minority.

The council cited inefficiency in the performance of duties as the

primary reason for making Pearson's removal.

Pearson reportedly forgot to schedule meetings, contact officials when requested and keep minutes of council meetings up to date, according to members of the council.

Pearson said he was aware of council dissatisfaction. "I expected some dissatisfaction, but it's not my nature to do office politically," said Pearson. Specifically, Pearson said he knew of "gripes" about the minutes.

"I don't think anybody who can satisfy this council," he said.

The clerk is mentioned by the mayor with the removal of the council, according to city Attorney Gary Massey. However, the council does not have the power to fire the clerk. That power lies solely with the mayor.

Pearson admitted he had already planned to resign his post and had hoped he could do so before the council took their action Thursday.

"I had asked that the clerk's review be on the record," Mrs. Swanson said today. "I had asked that the clerk's review be on the record," Mrs. Swanson said today.

## Golda Dies At 80



JERUSALEM (UPI) — Former Prime Minister Golda Meir, the first lady of Israel politics, died today in a Jerusalem hospital at the age of 80.

The state-run Israeli radio said Mrs. Meir died in the Hadassah Hospital—where she had been under treatment for pneumonia. She had spent most of the past four months in the hospital.

The state-run radio told Mrs. Meir died at 8:30 a.m. EST of a malignant blood disease.

The government announced it will hold a special mourning period Saturday night after the end of the Jewish Sabbath.

Mrs. Meir, born Golda Mabovitch in Kiev May 3, 1898, lived through Israel's entire history from its founding to its toughest year in 1973, when she was initially ousted under Egypt's crossing of the canal into the Sinai and Syrian thrusts on the Golan Heights.

She served Israel in virtually every post — head of the Jewish Agency for Palestine, Israel's shadow government before independence.

The Israeli radio said Deputy Prime Minister Yigal Yadin will hold a special meeting of the Israeli Cabinet Saturday night in mourning for the wily political grandmother who survived pogroms in Russia and poverty in Milwaukee to become prime minister of the Jewish state and steer it through its toughest war.

A Hadassah Hospital spokeswoman said that Mrs. Meir had "suffered for 12 or 13 years from malignant lymphoma and has received radiation and chemotherapy."

When Mrs. Meir died she was probably less than a month away from her dream of seeing the Jewish state sign its first treaty ever with an Arab state, taking a huge step to end its

## Ali Coming To Seminole To Help 'Childrens Village'

World Heavyweight Champion Muhammad Ali is scheduled to come to Central Florida Jan. 26 and 27, 1971 to benefit a proposed Children's Village of Florida for retarded children and adults to be built in Seminole County.

The announcement was made by Mrs. James L. Jones, president of the Seminole County Association for Retarded Children Inc., who said both of Ali's appearances will be sponsored by the organization's parent's council.

"We have long wanted for the people of a date to be here when they could come here," said Mrs. Jones. "When he called two weeks ago to surprise me he said, 'This is someone you've been wanting to hear from for a long time.'" and we have just

"We could not work out the exact details of when the money will be raised, but we have plans to hold a fund-raising of the date to build a center, but one will probably be primarily for adults and the other children," she explained.

"The fact that a lot of people are coming to help build other people, too," she added.

The funds will be expensive, according to Mrs. Jones, as a lot of money is needed to kick off the project. "We are holding a couple of parties and are trying to build enough money," she said.

Purpose of the events will be to raise funds for the Phase I development of a training and recreational center to be located in Seminole County for retarded persons residing in Central Florida. The project has long been a dream of Mrs.

Mrs. Jones said the association's objective for the coming year will be to begin a \$150,000 endowment fund; purchase property for The Children's Village; begin an athletic program; expand the center to 100 beds; and begin a program and special events program for a limited number of retarded adults.

They also hope to begin the Little Red School House, a program formerly operated by the Seminole County Association for Retarded Children Inc.

The Children's Village would serve as a permanent home of the Little Red School House and would have three group living cottages for normal to mildly retarded children. There would be two cottages and three additional cottages where

## Grumman Hqs. Set Afire

By Iran Mobs; No Injuries

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — Anti-American demonstrators today set fire to the headquarters of the Grumman Aircraft Co. as hundreds of wives and children of U.S. servicemen stationed in Iran were flown out on a voluntary basis.

Diplomats said several citizens were working inside Grumman's three-story office building in Isfahan, the ancient capital of Persia, when demonstrators shouting anti-American slogans set it on fire. "Everyone inside escaped unhurt," one diplomat said.

## Begin in Oslo For Nobel Prize

OSLO, Norway (UPI) — Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin arrived today to receive the 1978 Nobel peace prize on Sunday but the man he shares it with — Egyptian President Anwar Sadat — remained at home.

Sadat had originally planned to come to Oslo, but decided to stay away in view of the deadlock in the Israeli-Egyptian peace talks. He is represented by Fayed Marei, a presidential assistant.

## Syrian Tank Bombed

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) — A powerful explosion today smashed a Syrian tank into "a mass of burning black metal" and ripped through five other vehicles, halting an army convoy and possibly killing several people, witnesses said. It was the third bombing in three months on the Damascus-to-Beirut highway that the Syrians use to send fresh troops into Lebanon to serve on the Arab deterrent force.

## Pope Sets Statue Blessing

VATICAN CITY (UPI) — Pope John Paul II will bless the children of Rome on Dec. 17 to bless statues used in Nativity scenes during the Christmas season.

## Europe's Grain Crop Healthy

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Grain crops in Eastern Europe's turned out to be larger than summer conditions indicated, agricultural officials say. The total output is estimated at 93.5 million tons, equal to the 1977 crop.

## Exiles Return To Cuba

HAVANA, Cuba (UPI) — More than 100 Cuban exiles returned to their homeland today to meet President Fidel Castro and sign formal agreements for the release of more than 3,600 political prisoners.

salary is being supplemented by the city with \$1,200 additional money, Alford said.

While the persons may be obtained from the CETA program, their salary schedules can be picked up by the cities involved, according to Alford.

The new complex regulations may appear confusing, said Nevell. The county commission has scheduled a workshop for 3 p.m. Tuesday on the new federal guidelines.

Nevell said the new guidelines say that the average salary for a CETA employee will now be \$7,200 annually, but that limitation will apply only to those who were included in the program since Oct. 1.

He said that the CETA program under four separate titles, in Seminole County now has 881 participants with a total funding from the federal government of \$7 million.

Nearly all of the employees work in county government. No statistics are available on the total number of CETA employees in other governmental units in the county.

## For Charity: They Walk, And Walk...

Bill and Juanita Davis of Lake Tahoe, Calif., left Durango, Colo., on July 9 on a 3,000-mile hike for charity.

Eleven pairs of shoes, counting blisters, five months and 1,600 miles later they arrived in Sanford.

They passed through towns on the way from Orlando — where they were guests of Disney World — to Daytona Beach.

They were pushing their belongings in a foot locker to which they had added wheels and a handle. Davis said this was their sixth rig. "Each one gets smaller and lighter. A previous one was gasoline bombed by a gang of young punks as they were coming out of Texas into Louisiana. We lost everything," they said.

In spite of what they call "push handles" and scrawny encounters with a motorcycle gang, "The Devil's Disciples" the Davises say most of the people they have met have been helpful and cooperative.

Davis, 43 and his wife, 38, accept no rides except in an emergency, and take plods from the people they meet for each mile they walk. "We do not take any money for the charity ourselves, but send a copy of the pledge to the whoever amount they wish to pledge," said Davis.

"Many times we wished we'd never begun, but for the plods already received we feel it worthwhile," said Mrs. Davis. "People are welcome to stop and talk and take pictures and we don't solicit them for anything — we're legitimate." Their goal is \$1 million in pledges for charity.

Mr. and Mrs. Davis, who have been married for seven years, walked 8,000 miles two years ago as a personal tribute to the pioneer spirit of days gone by and in observance of the Bicentennial. They also made a 1,000 mile charity trek.

# Management Study For School District

Seminole County school district officials expressed optimism today about the results of management study which will be done on the school district in early January.

The study will be done by a group of accountants and business executives from various businesses throughout the state. The committee was appointed by House Speaker Hylton Brown.

"The speaker called me yesterday and said we were selected because we are a fast growing county and because we are medium sized," said Superintendent William Layer.

The businessmen will be analyzing the performance and efficiency of the various school districts, according to Brown's chief aide Bill Ryan. The panel will focus on all areas of the school district ranging from classroom programs to the operation of the district office, according to Ryan.

The panel was meeting today to determine some of the specific areas they would be looking at, according to Don Lamonica, an analyst for the House Education Committee.

"I'm not sure specifically what they will be looking at, but generally they will be viewing the overall policy of the school district and offer recommendations based on their business experience," he said.

He noted that some of the recommendations will be to balance against various state and federal laws which exist on the public level, which do not exist in the private sector.

Specifically, he cited such areas as home rule and salaries. Under the home rule statute passed by the legislature the local school district has a free hand to establish policies as long as they do not conflict with already existing state laws.

Employee salaries are set in collective bargaining contracts negotiated between the employee associations and the school board. "We really don't know what to expect, but we are looking at it positively and if they make positive remarks it will be good, but if there are any negative comments you can be sure we will correct them," said Roger Harris, assistant superintendent of business and finance for the school district.

Some of the areas the team may examine are efficiency in purchasing and storing of supplies and materials.

In the first area, Harris noted the school district has for many years "depended on the experience of people in the system who have used a particular product."

If the school district is going to order equipment "we would try to get the best product for the money by going to people with the experience in dealing with the equipment and have them help us develop the specifications," Harris noted.

In the area of storage, Harris noted the school system tries to follow the policy of "seeing how much turnover we have of an item on the shelf."

"Certainly we would like to have 75 percent or more turnover of an item so that by the end of the school year we would be just about out of it." He added periodic reviews are made of items ordered "and if they are low turnover, they are withdrawn from the shelves."

To show his point, Harris noted that many items would be removed from the warehouse inventory because of low turnover.

parish status in the Arab world.

"You always called me an old lady. I want to live to see that day of peace," she told Egyptian President and old adversary Anwar Sadat on his historic visit to Jerusalem in November 1977.

Prime Minister Menachem Begin was in Oslo, Norway, at the time of Mrs. Meir's death to receive his share of the 1978 Nobel Peace Prize with Sadat, Egyptian President Sadat shared the prize with Begin but decided not to go to Oslo to receive it personally.

An Israeli spokeswoman in Oslo said Begin had been told the news at Mrs. Meir's death. Mrs. Meir entered the hospital Aug. 27 complaining of back and leg pain.

Mrs. Meir, a grandmother of five, retired in 1974, but kept her position as elder stateswoman of the Labor Party, meeting frequently with her successor, Yitzhak Rabin, and other leaders.

But a series of ailments including osteoarthritis, nerve problems in her shoulder and chest pains that doctors insisted were not heart attacks kept her in and out of hospitals.

She remained a chain smoker to the end, but refrained from lighting up on television in order not to set a bad example for Israeli youth.

The announcement of Mrs. Meir's death came 10 minutes after she had died.

## Jobless Rate Unchanged;

### Employment Registers Gain

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The nation's unemployment rate held steady at 5.8 percent during November, the government said today.

In its monthly report, the Labor Department said the November figure was unchanged from October, when the jobless rate dropped to its lowest point in four months.

However, today's report said the total number of employed persons increased, during November and the employment-to-population ratio hit a record high.

## Firebomb Convictions Out?

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The judge reviewing the 1972 trial of the Wilmington 10, spurred on by the Justice Department, apparently is considering whether to throw out their firebombing convictions. U.S. District Judge Franklin Dupree Jr. of Raleigh, N.C., has ordered prosecutors in the trial to provide defense lawyers with a document showing major changes in the testimony of a star prosecution witness, according to Justice Department officials.

## Rev. Jones Suicide Plea Taps

Just hours before today's first session of a grand jury in San Francisco investigating the death of Rep. Leo Ryan, D-Calif., who was shot to death during a visit to the Jonestown, Guyana, commune, the FBI disclosed a tape recording had been found in which the founder of the commune, the Rev. Jim Jones reportedly made a final exhortation to his more than 900 followers at their mass suicide ritual.

The FBI made no comment on the content of the tape, but The New York Times reported today U.S. government officials in Guyana who listened to the tape said it contained a recording of Jones warning mothers at the commune to "keep your children under control" while poison was forced down their throats by syringe.

Thomas M. Mazzeo says that is why he's using Playboy magazine for \$700.

He says they used a picture of him water skiing on a lake near his hometown of Pittsfield, which advertised him as a playboy with a "lust for life."

Mazzeo claims the magazine used the ad — which is hanging in airports, bus terminals, and major newspapers across the country — without his consent or knowledge — from April to October 1977.

So he filed suit against them in Berkshire County Superior Court.

Mazzeo, a kitchen installation contractor and custom woodworker, said a picture of him water skiing was used by Playboy without his consent or knowledge — from April to October 1977.

His attorney, Morris M. Goldings of Boston, said the picture had been taken by a professional photographer, then used by Playboy without a release from his client.

"The magazine enriched itself unjustly at Mazzeo's expense," Goldings said.

Playboy's promotional director, Walter Joyce, said the New York advertising agency Epstein Rabbey worked on the magazine's promotional campaign "Lust For Life" and got the picture from a "stock house" he couldn't identify.

"It had been supplied to them by a photographer who had been a friend of Mazzeo's," Joyce said. "Apparently he (Mazzeo) saw it in the New York Times and said, I suppose, 'Wow' because the photographer was supposed to get from him a signed release.

"The stock house is supposed to get a signed release from a photographer. They did not," Joyce said. "So the suit is on that basis. The picture is presumed to be a clear picture."

Mazzeo's complaint states the use of the caption photo has falsely identified him as a playboy reader and as a prominent and example of the way of life associated with and promoted by the defendant's magazine and other business ventures.

"This way of life includes permissive attitudes toward sexual behavior, drug use, and other activities," the complaint says.

Joyce described the "Lust For Life" campaign as an effort "to present our Playboy readers as intelligent, young, aware, alive kinds of people who would be attractive advertising products."

# Digging The Bible-I King Herod Lived In Ancient Splendor

According to the Gospel of Matthew, Herod the Great ordered the murder of all male babies in and around Bethlehem upon Jesus' birth. He did so, says Matthew, fearing a monarch had come to topple him from power.

Herod's reign was marked by much cruelty. But modern biographers dismiss his "slaughter of the innocents" as having no basis in fact.

Herod's contemporaries, in fact, regarded him as a man of intellect and refinement. Egypt's Queen Cleopatra is supposed to have been infatuated with him.

Moreover, he was an able ruler. During 33 years on the throne of Judea, he accomplished in the remarkably short span of his reign a number of things which he had designed himself.

Hidden for 1,700 years beneath desert wastelands, his ruins have been uncovered by several noted archaeologists among them James B. Pritchard of the University of Pennsylvania and, most recently, Ehud Netzer of Jerusalem's Hebrew University.

The excavation is now nearly complete. It reveals a long-vanished lifestyle of exceptional splendor and luxury and confirms Herod's reputation as one of the great builders of antiquity.

Located on the Jericho plain near the Biblical "Valley of the Shadow of Death," the site was first developed as a water palace during the second century B.C.

Rulers of the Maccabean (or Hasmonaean) dynasty preceding Herod devised an elaborate system of aqueducts to bring water to the area. What had once been barren land was suddenly transformed into a paradise of fiver gardens, balsam, date palm and persimmon groves.

In 37 B.C., Herod overthrew the Maccabees. He then launched a grandiose scheme to enhance their winter palace site. Before his death, he expanded it into a stunning complex of elaborate residences, pavilions, sunken gardens, ritual baths and overcast swimming pools.

One of these pools, excavated by Netzer, was the scene of a celebrated royal murder plotted by Herod.

Shortly after assuming his throne, the king was prevailed upon by his beautiful wife, Maccabean princess Mariamne, to put her 17-year-old brother, Aristobolus III, in the holy post of high priest.

The handsome Aristobolus was a favorite of the people. At his first public appearance as priest, during the Feast of Tabernacles in 36 B.C., he was greeted with overwhelming affection. Herod, fearing a return of the Maccabean and loss of his crown, decided to rid himself of his young rival.

Jewish historian Josephus, writing little more than a century later, describes what followed.

Aristobolus and Herod were being entertained by the ruler's mother-in-law at a family gathering in the old Maccabean palace. Herod urged Aristobolus to join some of the king's friends in the swimming pool. As darkness fell, these friends — on prior orders from Herod — began playfully holding the boy's head under water — "as if in sport," reports Josephus, "and they did not let up until they had quite suffocated him."

Near this death pool, Herod later built what is presumed to be his private villa. He is believed to have murdered several other Maccabean palace inmates, burying his central section beneath rubble to form an artificial mound. Along the mound, he placed a great reception hall in the ruins of this palace. Large stone columns had once lined three sides of the magnificent hall, and its floor had been embellished with intricate designs in mosaic and marble.

Herod died following a lengthy illness that might have been cancer. Half-crazed with pain during his last days, he summoned to the palace Jewish leaders from every part of the country. Upon their arrival, he had them arrested and imprisoned.

ANSWER: The Bible explains it this way: "For ALL have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).

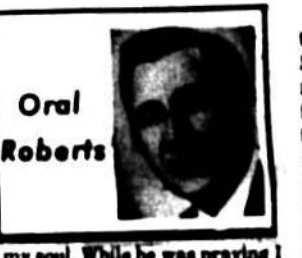

## His Dream: Sailing Into Retirement

Noah had nothing on Marian Rhodes.

But Rhodes is not building his "ark" in anticipation of a monumental flood.

It's for his retirement.

Rhodes, 408 Palm Springs Drive, Longwood, spends his leisure time custom-building a 44 1/2 ft.-by-13-ft. ketch sailboat in his backyard.

When he retires from his job at Martin-Marristia in five or six years, he plans to set sail in the "Carole Ann" for a four-or-five-year trip around the world with his wife, Carole, and children.

The project is a challenge to Rhodes. "I'm learning as I go," he concedes. "I'd never worked with fiberglass or finish carpentry before."

"I got a satisfaction and sense of accomplishment doing this that I don't get at the office pricing new business proposals."

He enjoyed the sea-going life in the U.S. Navy during World War II and as a merchant seaman and dreamed of owning his own sailing yacht and making long voyages.

Through the years as he supported and helped raise his children, Rhodes held on to his sailing dreams.

The original plan was that when retirement time arrived and the children had all moved away, Rhodes and his wife would sell their home and buy a sailing yacht.

"Six years ago I got the notion that I might be able to build a sailboat, even though I had never attempted such a project," he said. "I researched the various

building methods thoroughly and convinced myself that I could do it."

Rhodes bought a set of plans from a naval architect two years ago and got started. Sixteen hundred hours of labor went into completing the hull.

A strongback and frame were built to give the craft its support, while the fiberglass was applied and it was laminated for strength.

A polyester-resin was plastered over the fiberglass. A cradle was built around it before it was turned over by a crane.

Seven hundred hours of sanding the hull helped to teach him patience. "I've got to be satisfied with it before I quit," he stated as he explained the difference between a home-made and a custom-made boat.

About 8,000 pounds of scrap steel will be installed in the hull. The engine mount will hold a six horsepower diesel auxiliary motor. When the inside is complete, the craft will be hauled to the coast, where the deck gear, masts, and sails will be installed.

Rhodes hopes the launching of the "Carole Ann" will be within two or three years.

He estimates that the ketch, which would cost about \$125,000 factory-made, will cost him \$30,000 to \$40,000 in materials. Inflation has increased his costs by 25 percent since he began the project.

Before complete retirement, Rhodes plans some short "shakedown

cruises to the Bahamas and around Florida as he learns to sail his boat.

Rhodes believes "it is true that events do not always follow a predetermined plan, but... it is important and necessary that we have plans for the future and especially for our retirement years."

Carole Rhodes, kindergarten teacher at Red Bag Lake Elementary School, is supportive of her husband's plans.

Dear Dick: Can you please tell me who sings the theme song on the "Grimy Adams" TV show? L. Lehmann, Pueblo, Colo.

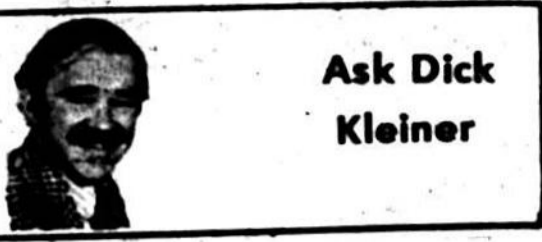
You should have put that question in the past tense, because Adams has grizzled his last grizzly. But the song was written and performed by Thom Pace.

# John Ritter: Was Born Chuckling

HOLLYWOOD — You could say the reason John Ritter is in such a jolly mood most of the time is that he has a pretty firm grip on the brass ring.

After all, he's one-third (and perhaps a bit more) of one of the hottest TV shows of them all, "Three's Company" on ABC.

And there seems to be nowhere for his career to go but up, what with his apple good looks, his large popularity and his ability to get the most out of the lines in his script.

But, actually, Ritter's good mood pre-dates the current success by some 25 years. He grew up chuckling, and he has rarely stopped since that day in the cradle when he realized laughing was a lot of fun.

Probably the only thing he gets serious about is his involvement with the United Cerebral Palsy campaign. This is a personal thing with him, because his brother, Tom, was a victim of cerebral palsy. (Tom is now an attorney in Nashville).

Ritter's mother had been involved with UCP since its inception, serving in several executive capacities, and his father, the late country singer, Tex Ritter, frequently gave concerts to raise money for UCP.

So John is carrying on the work and, this year, will host the nation-wide UCP TV telethon on Dec. 30-31.

But that's about John Ritter's only serious moment.

He looks on life, otherwise, as a place to have fun, and always has. In fact, his boyhood was a series of his gags and his parents' reaction to those gags, which was generally unfavorable.

"As a boy," he says, trying to suppress the giggles the memories bring back, "I was always pulling something or other, to get my parents to laugh. It wasn't easy."

With his innocent face, he was able to walk around and put people on, without them knowing they were being put on.

"I'd love to start conversations with strangers," he says, "and engage them in a form of improvisation. They never know that they were involved in an improvisation of course, but I

did. So I would talk about anything.

"Once, for example, I began talking to a fellow outside the men's room in a bar. I maneuvered him into a long and deep discussion about throwing up. It was very enjoyable — but I can't do that any more, because most people know me. There are very few strangers now."

He says almost everybody wants to know something about one of his co-stars, the new sex symbol, Suzanne Somers. Ritter's sense of humor persists, and he usually pulls a battered tissue from his pocket.

I tell them that the tissue was in Suzanne's purse for three weeks," he says, "and I offer to let them have it for \$20."

He says he likes to go out to a movie, with his wife, or to run out and buy a quart of milk if they need one.

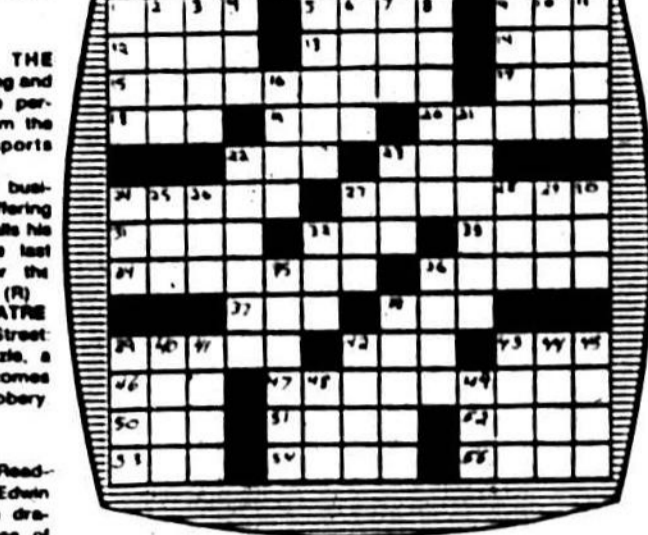

# Agatha Christie Case: One For Federal Court

Moviemakers will not have to call in the likes of Hercule Poirot or Miss Marple to solve the mystery of Agatha Christie's famed 11-day disappearance.

In a decision of great importance to film producers, a federal court denied a motion to stop

distribution of the movie, "Agatha," for alleged falsification and invasion of privacy.

The plaintiffs in that motion alleged that the film violated the late Dame Agatha's rights by portraying her as an emotionally unstable woman, who during her disappearance, engaged in a plot to murder her husband's mistress.

The judge held that the producers of "Agatha" did not represent the film as anything more than fiction, and the considerations of freedom of speech outweighed any possible invasion of privacy.

Had it not been for Elvira Presley, Christie would never have even made it to court.

## Dellums To SEEDCO: Carter Ignoring Democratic Humanistic Platform

U.S. Rep. Ronald V. Dellums, D-California, called on the people of the nation to make President Jimmy Carter's life "so miserable for the next two years it will be guaranteed that he will not return to office for another four years."

"Did we elect Jimmy Carter, the individual, or Jimmy Carter the standard-bearer of the Democratic Party?" asked the congressman.

Pointing to the humanistic platform of the Democratic party adopted in convention two years ago, Dellums said the platform has gone by the boards in the Carter presidency and Carter, by ignoring the platform, broke his word to the people.

"The president's program flies in the face of the Democratic Party platform," he said.

"I remember the nation electing Richard Nixon, an individual, to office and he almost stole the whole country," he said.

Speaking at the Seventh Annual Friendship Dinner Banquet of the Seminole Employment Economic Development Corp. (SEEDCO) at the Sanford Civic Center Friday night, Dellums attacked the Carter proposal to cut 15 percent "an incredible amount of money" from the federal budget, saying those cuts will be made from human services—housing, education, health and welfare.

At the same time, said the congressman, the president is proposing to raise the military budget by three percent over and above inflation.

Comparing U.S. military strength to that of the Soviet Union, Dellums said the United States military strength is an superior that it will be a long time before Russia can catch up. "Robert McNamara (then secretary of state) said 10 years ago if we could destroy 30 percent of the Russian population and 70 percent of its economy, it could never come back again as a major industrial

## No Study Needed, Sanford Policemen Tell Candidate

About 16 Sanford policemen told a city commission candidate they disapprove of his efforts to establish a committee to survey the department's management because, they said, such a survey is not needed.

That's what David Farr, commission candidate for seat three, said he encountered when he met with policemen Friday. Farr said he went to the department to clarify his position and to give his reasons for asking the department be surveyed.

"My main purpose in asking for a panel to look at the police department is to put the matter to rest," Farr said.

He said he initiated the committee request after being

told by people with whom he spoke during his campaign that there is a feeling the police department has problems.

Farr however, confirmed the problems said to exist are primarily the same as those said to exist several months ago but which were examined by at least four separate agencies, all of which concluded they were unable to substantiate the claims with the exception of a few minor departmental operation procedures problems.

Farr also said none of those who told him there may be problems in the department were able to cite specific examples of what those problems might be, or who, if anyone, in the department has

any problems.

He did say, however, there was one specific incident he was concerned about in which a police officer allegedly declined to interfere in a disturbance because those involved reportedly had "friends on the department."

"I must admit there are no specific problems I could see a committee to examine, but I feel since it's being talked about it should be looked at so the department can be exonerated and the matter laid to rest."

"I would be more interested in having such a committee look at the department as a whole, and as to how it's managed I assured the policemen with whom I spoke that I am not after anyone's

job, but that if a committee looked at the department and found any individuals functioning improperly, perhaps they should be removed," Farr noted.

Farr said the policemen he spoke to Friday indicated they feel such a survey is unnecessary because in their opinion there are no problems and they are disgruntled because the department continues to be an unnecessary target being unfairly held in an unfavorable light in the public eye.

Farr said his meeting with the policemen lasted about 45 minutes, and that his feeling was "I don't think they agreed with me, but I think they understood what my motive is."
