## ...They Might Be, Too

New regulations in the federally funded Comprehensive Employment Training Act (CETA) program to become effective in January could eliminate the jobs of some participants, including Winter Springs City Planner Dick Rosansky and Lake Mary City Planner Reggie Alford on Jan. 3.

Hank Norrell, manpower controller with the Seminole County office, said today persons employed under CETA and being paid \$10,000 annually prior to Oct. 1 could receive a supplement to his salary of up to \$1,000 from the agency.

But if the supplement placed the salary over \$11,000 annually, those employees must be terminated from the program prior to Jan. 3.

More dues were added to Rosansky's job earlier this year by the city. His salary including the \$10,000 now is \$11,000 and he is due for another five percent increase as of this month, according to Winter Springs City Clerk Mary Norton.

Meanwhile in Lake Mary, Alford's \$10,000 CETA

salary is expected to be increased to \$11,000 by the mayor with the consent of the council, according to city Attorney Gary Massey. However, the council does not have the power to fire the clerk. That power lies solely with the mayor.

Norrell said today he will work with Pearson on a smooth departure.

"Big can either resign or I will appoint someone, whatever he wants," Norrell said today.

Pearson admitted he had already planned his exit and had helped his replacement do so before the council took their action.

### Happy Ending

The smiles graphically portrayed on the front page of The Evening Herald Thursday told the story.

They belonged to one-time adversaries Sally Harvey and Ann Finch.

Both women had been vying for recognition of their particular faction as the bona-fide bargaining agent for SECA (Seminole Educational Clerical Association).

The story reached a happy ending Wednesday evening. After more than six months of negotiations with the Seminole County School Board — negotiations that had been bogged down much of the time with the jurisdictional dispute and other internal strife — the issue finally was settled.

All that remains now is approval of the pact by the school board and the SECA membership. Such approval can't come too soon.

We commend members of both factions of SECA who — in the final analysis — opted to put the welfare and concern of the union's membership over their personal campaigns for recognition.

"I'm ecstatic and that covers it all," said Mrs. Harvey.

"I glad we reached agreement and more important glad that a unified group was able to go back to the table," observed Mrs. Finch.

So are we.

### Disability Payments

The number of citizens drawing disability benefits under Social Security has doubled since 1970 — to 2.9 million and rising. That's going on?

There's no sign of an epidemic of disabling accidents or illnesses. What is happening is that another federal program has drifted out of control.

Adding disability insurance to Social Security looks necessary when the bridge was created in the late 1960s.

Social Security could provide some economic security to workers after retirement, adding a bit to the payroll tax could also provide protection against loss of income from a disabling accident or illness before retirement.

After all, only a small percentage of the work force ever becomes disabled.

Yet the number of people drawing disability benefits has leaped far ahead of projections and the cost is going off the charts — from \$1.1 billion in 1970 to an estimate of \$14 billion this year.

At the heart of this financial disaster is a set of misinterpretations about government programs and human beings.

"Accepting public benefits no longer bears the stigma it once did," says Joseph Califano, secretary of Health, Education and Welfare.

It's more than that. Congress ignored another facet of human behavior. The more liberal the definition of disability, the more generous the benefits provided, the more people will consider themselves disabled and the longer their disability will last.

Social Security benefits were increased sharply early in this decade.

Now develops that some workers receive more in disability benefits than they could earn if they were working. Can such a person be blamed for lack of motivation in overcoming a disability to get back to work, or in seeking retraining for a different kind of job?

There were other misinterpretations.

One did not anticipate how much subjective judgment by doctors and lawyers would enter into interpreting definitions of disability.

Nor did it foresee court decisions which have broadened eligibility for benefits.

All this poses an unpleasant task for the next Congress. It must tighten definitions of disability in the Social Security law, overhaul a cumbersome and expensive administrative structure, and either trim back benefits or otherwise encourage more beneficiaries to return to work.

It is always better to trim back a social safety net than to expand it, though that is what Congress did in 1970, however.

Reform of disability insurance can help forestall the ballooning cost of Social Security which is becoming a political liability for both Congress and the administration.

### Facing Refugee Problem

**WASHINGTON** — The worst thing about the plight of the Vietnamese "boat people" — left those who survive the perils of the sea and those who do not — is the depressing familiarity of their saga.

Some 2,000 refugees stranded aboard a freighter off Malaysia, and more than 200 of those less fortunate compatriots who died when their smaller boat capsized, had made headlines around the world.

But they are not the first of their kind nor the last to struggle underappreciated in their homeland and risk drowning danger on the open seas only to find that the welcome they had hoped to find in the "free" world has been harshly withdrawn.

More than three years after the Communists took over Indochina, every nation within walking distance of Southeast Asia — Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos — has opened its doors to refugees from that nation, with more arriving daily.

Thailand and Malaysia have borne the brunt of the refugee tide and, with ample problems of their own, both nations have grown understandably edgy about offering a haven to the fleeing Indochinese.

And while the United States has a special responsibility to those helpless refugees, we have not always lived up to that obligation.

Adding disability insurance to Social Security looks necessary when the bridge was created in the late 1960s.

Social Security could provide some economic security to workers after retirement, adding a bit to the payroll tax could also provide protection against loss of income from a disabling accident or illness before retirement.




## Kidney Stones: Have Doctor Identify Them

**DEAR DR. LAMB** — I have a problem with kidney stones and am enclosing a few I have passed recently. I am 66 years old. I had surgery when I was 5. A stone was removed and a few days later I was cystoscoped and another was removed.

I was not bothered again for 41 years. At that time I had kidney colic and had surgery again. A stone was removed and about eight days later kidney colic occurred once more. Since I have passed 36 stones. For the past year or two, I average about two per month.

I don't have kidney colic now, but I have a lot of backache and other discomfort. Sometimes there is blood when the stone is being passed. If you can help me in any way it would be very much appreciated.

**DEAR READER** — The small stones you send me obviously are small enough to pass and that's fortunate. The most important thing that you can do is have your doctors find out for certain what kind of stones you have. The fact that you had stones when you were 5 years old and are a frequent stone former is a bit unusual.

Your doctors need to know the chemical composition of the stones so they can decide what best to treat you. In some forms of stones it is important to cause the urine to become alkaline. The alkaline urine will dissolve the stones and may make even fat-dried ones even smaller to the point that they can pass. Maintaining an alkaline urine in these cases will prevent the formation of new stones.

However, stones of different chemical composition may require an acid urine and, in that event, the treatment is directed toward producing an acid urine to prevent stone formation.

Even what you should do about your diet depends a lot on the composition of the kidney stones.

If the stone formation is associated with a kidney infection, you might need to restrict calcium intake. These kinds of stones occur more often in women. Stones that are formed in the absence of any infection seldom require a restriction of calcium intake.

One can't be certain that your backache and other discomfort aren't related to kidneys. I would urge you to seek a physician who will examine the kind of stones you have and formulate treatment on that basis.

## His Dream: Sailing Into Retirement

Noah had nothing on Marian Rhodes.

But Rhodes is not building his 'ark' in anticipation of a monumental flood: It's for his retirement.

Rhodes, 490 Palm Springs Drive, Longwood, spends his leisure time custom-building a 44½ ft.-by-13-ft. ketch sailboat in his backyard.

A strengthback and frame were built to give the craft its support, while the fiberglass was applied and it was laminated for strength.

A polyester-resin was plastered over the fiberglass. A cradle was built around it before it was turned over by a crane.

Seven hundred hours of sanding the hull helped to teach him patience. "I've got to be satisfied with it before I quit," he stated as he explained the difference between a home-made and a custom-made boat.

About 8,000 pounds of scrap steel will be installed in the hull. The engine mount will hold a six horsepower diesel auxiliary motor. When the inside is complete, the craft will be hauled to the coast, where the deck gear, masts, and sails will be installed.

Through the years as he supported and helped raise his children, Rhodes held on to his sailing dreams.

The original plan was that when retirement time arrived and the children had all moved away, Rhodes and his wife would sell their home and buy a sailing yacht.

He estimates that the ketch, which would cost about \$125,000 factory-made, will cost him \$30,000 to \$40,000 in materials. Inflation has increased his costs by 25 percent since he began the project.

Before complete retirement, Rhodes plans some short shakedown



No Study Needed, Sanford  
Policemen Tell Candidate

About 14 Sanford policemen told a city commission that they disapprove of his efforts to establish a committee to survey the department's management because they said such a survey is not needed.

That's what David Farr, commission candidate for seat three, said he encountered when he met with policemen Friday. Farr said he went to the department to clarify his position and to give his reasons for asking the department be surveyed.

"My main purpose in asking for a panel to look at the police department is to put the matter to rest," Farr said.

He said he initiated the committee request after being

told by people with whom he spoke during his campaign that there is a "feeling" the police department has problems.

Farr, however, confirmed the problems said to exist are primarily the same as those said to exist several months ago, which were examined by at least four separate agencies, all of which concluded they were unable to substantiate the claims with the exception of a few minor departmental operation procedures problems.

Farr also said none of those who told him there may be problems in the department were able to cite specific examples of what those problems might be, or who, if anyone, in the department has

any problems. He did say, however, there was one specific incident he was concerned about in which a police officer allegedly declined to interfere in a disturbance because those involved reportedly had "friends on the department."

"I must admit there are no specific problems I could ask a committee to examine, but I feel since it's being talked about it should be looked at so the department can be exonerated and the matter laid to rest."

"I would be more interested in having such a committee look at the department as a whole, and as to how it's managed. I assured the policemen with whom I spoke with me, but I think they understand what my motive is."
