

Unemployment Rate Levels,

Job Forecast Discouraging

WASHINGTON (AP) - The nation's unemployment rate held steady in April at 7.5 per cent, ending five straight months of decline, the government said today. The leveling off of the jobless rate indicated further improvement will be more difficult in the months ahead. A bright spot in the job report was that total employment jumped by another 700,000 in April to a new high of 87.4 million, a sign of strong business growth.

However, because the number of Americans finding work nearly offset the big increase in job seekers last month, the jobless rate was unchanged. In April, another 720,000 went looking for work, raising the size of the civilian labor force to 94.4 million.

Nominee Is Controversial

HOUSTON (AP) - The Democratic nominee for a seat on Texas' Supreme Court has never been a judge, is being sued for \$700,000 and says God told him to run for office. Don Yarbrough, a 35-year-old Houston lawyer, scored a surprising victory over Charles Barrow, chief justice of the San Antonio Court of Civil Appeals, in last Saturday's primary election. Yarbrough got 794,095 votes to Barrow's

Since Yarbrough has no Republican opponent in the November general election, his victory in the primary could be tuntamount to winning the November election - welcom someone organizes a strong write-in campaign.

Budget Measure Pending

WASHINGTON (AP) - Congress is on the verge of enacting a 1977 budget ceiling that envisions heavy spending for creation of jobs and other programs to stimulate the economy

The proposed \$413.3-billion budget includes \$100.8 billion for defense, which is only \$300 million less than President

On the domestic side, the budget agreed to by Senate-House conferees on Thursday anticipates that Congress will extend last year's individual tax cuts into 1977 and reject Ford's proposal to increase the payroll tax that finances the Social Security system.

LOS ANGELES (AP) - It was 1:35 a.m. when the sound glow at the window. A cross was burning on her lawn. The 29-year-old black woman living in a white neighborhood of suburban La Mirada on Thursday became the latest target in a wave of racial attacks which have alarmed authorities and spread fear through integrated

The FBI, concerned about possible civil rights violations, entered the case after four cross burnings, an effigy hanging and the skinning of a cat were reported in the Los Angeles area.





Three Students Arrested

In Terrorist Bombing Case

Is The Draft On Way Back?

Plainly the belief that a political state should whenever it deems convenient impose slave labor conditions on whole segments of its population does not die easily. When the military draft was "ended" a half a decade ago the cynics realized that the idea behind it wouldn't go away. Indeed, they saw that the Selective Service bureaucratic machinery remained fixed, if not well-oiled, and poised for the kill.

What finally persuaded the government to stop drafting people — this, remember, during wartime - was the Gates Commission established by President Nixon to investigate the feasibility and desirability of an all-volunteer armed service. The panel showed convincingly that by introducing competitive pay scales and benefits the army could indeed recruit an adequate, and even more muscular, defense force.

The Selective Service chiefs, naturally enough, fussed that the principle simply wouldn't work, so intent were they on keeping the Selective Service System intact. Now a former Selective Service director, Curtis Tarr, has headed up another commission, this one established by Congress, to dispute the Gates Commission's arguments which arguments, so far, have proved perfectly

In a time of economic hardship, the Tarr group tells us, a volunteer military can better compete in the general market because, subsidized by taxpayers, it can cut into unemployment roles. However, in times of economic growth, the panel continues, it will be harder for the military to attract volunteers; in an expanding economy the military will be the private sector's weak sister,

Rhubarb! Such a conclusion, at best, is based on economic illiteracy. An expanding economy, according to the most cogent macroeconomics, benefits everybody. There is no reason to suppose the military will be cut out of the pie in the event of a Canaveral-like gross national product. The Tarr argument is patent falsehood.

Moreover, this diction conflicts with the latest job-related statistics from industry. With the economic recovery moving ahead, according to Industry Week, still fewer unskilled jobs are available to young men and women. The conspicuous competitor, the remedy the free market in its wisdom has developed, is the military, which will train people for jobs.

What the Tarr Commission argues, fundamentally, is that the morality of individual freedom does not work even when things in general are improving, that when life is sunniest the state will have to resort to coercion. The bureaucrats will have to do better than that before they attempt to justify slave labor.

Management, Too!

Remember the great Con Ed crisis of 1974, and the dire prediction that it would turn all the widows and orphans tearully out into the streets?

Consolidated Edison, the nation's largest investor-owned utility, fell on hard times last year, passed its dividend and had to sell two generating plants to New York state to restore its cash flow. Con Ed was all but broke.

Recently the utility announced a 41 per cent increase in fourth quarter earnings and brought its dividend back nearly to the 1973 level. The company cited regulatory concessions, less inflation, and lower fuel costs but modestly did not mention better management. That always does it.

DISC Dips; Business

American companies dealing in substantia export business are worried about a slipping DISC. The initials in this case stand for "Domestic International Sales Corporation." A bill passed by Congress in 1971, designed to

encourage exports and help offset the tax advantages and subsidies foreign governments give their companies, allowed U.S. corporations to set up DISCs. Under the program, they can defer the taxes on a certain percentage of their profits generated by the overseas sales of products made in this country, so long as the profits are plowed back into export activities. New legislation has been introduced in Congress, however, that would amend the DISC DISC opponents claim that the program cost the U.S. Treasury \$1 billion in lost revenues last Industry spokesmen counter that this

revenue wasn't "lost" - it was deferred, or was more than recovered in other ways. Some \$1.6 billion in export sales was generated last year with the help of DISCs, they workers and more tax revenues, both on the income earned by employes performing those jobs and on the income earned from the sales. According to the director of international sales for one aerospace manufacturer, if his company's exports were to decrease by 10 per cent it would mean a drop of at least 1,000 in the number of its U.S. workers.

Earthquake Kills 300,

Injures 1,000 Italians

VENICE, Italy (AP)- About 300 persons were believed killed in a severe earthquake that jolted northeast Italy Thursday night, devastating dozens of towns and villages in the Tagliamento river valley near the Yugoslav border. Rome reported rescue workers recovered 138 bodies. The ministry said about 160 more persons were trapped in the rubble and feared dead. More than 1,000 persons were reported injured.

Wekiva River Squatters Ordered To Leave

The Wekiva River squatters may be enjoying one of their last weekends on the river. After years of legal skirmishing, the Florida Department of Natural Resources has set in motion a program to remove the squatters' camps, which are all on state-owned land in the

Wekiva basin Delbert Euga of Sanford has already begun

notifying the squatters, who'll be given 30 days to remove personal possessions from the river

"All state laws will be enforced beginning today," Euga said Friday. "And that includes people who pollute the river with beer cans."

The squatters' camps will be removed in three phases, with the ones in the worst condition being demolished first. Euga said some of the better camps might be kept by the state for the use of park rangers who will eventually live on

The Wekiya is in line to become Florida's first officially designated "wild and scenic" river — a designation which has been delayed by the squatters' camps, which must be removed before the Wekiya is eligible for federal

The state won legal title to the lands in a lawsuit that dragged on for five years before it was finally settled in 1974.

"This isn't going to happen overnight,

Euga warned. "It's going to take a couple of months. We've got problems with the Wekiva besides the camps. There are aquatic weed problems and the whole bottom of the river is

Euga, a member of the Florida Council o Conservation and the Environment, credited Rep. Vince Fechtel (R-Leesburg) with a big part in helping win the fight to save the Wekiva. 'Without his support we would never have gotten this far," Euga said.






