The B&O agreed to transport the caboose freight free by "dead-heading" it on a train. Frampton wouldn't say how much the purchase cost him except it was "very reasonable - it's costing me a lot more to get it in here," gesturing to his backyard. "It will be red - a real red."

"I'm going to name it after the train in the Pogo comic strip - the Fort Mudge, Okefeenokee & Hartford. That's always tickled me."


