R. R. Caboose Real Backyard Toy For Ohioan

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — D.B. Frampton Jr. has laid 23 feet of standard gauge railroad track in his backyard — and is setting an honest-to-goodness train caboose on it.

"I guess I always wanted one," said Frampton of suburban Beavly, who is in the railway supply business, as a crew deposited the red Baltimore & Ohio caboose just outside the yard.

As the railroad car, built in 1927 and complete with four bunks, a pot-bellied stove and a water tank, was removed from the flatbed truck by crane, Frampton said he plans to recondition it.

"We'll have to wait until Tuesday or Wednesday until the ground gets better and we can get two lift trucks in" to set the caboose on the track, he said.

Frampton said he was traveling through central Pennsylvania recently when he saw a lumber company train which had been converted into a scenic railroad.

"I asked them where they got the caboose and they said they got it from the B&O," he says. "I went to the B&O at Somerset, Pa., and picked out one of six they were going to scrap."

The B&O agreed to transport the caboose freight free by "dead-heading" it on a train. Frampton wouldn't say how much the purchase cost him except it was "very reasonable — it's costing me a lot more to get it in here," gesturing to his backyard.

"It will be red — a real red," he says.

"I'm going to name it after the train in the Pope comic strip — the Fort Mudge, Okefenokee & Hartford. That's always tickled me."

Kirk Inaugurated; Calls Legislative Session

TALLAHASSEE (AP)—Claude R. Kirk Jr., who led a massive Republican tide of victory on his second bid for elective office, took the oath of office today as Florida's 36th governor since statehood in 1845.

Kirk said his first official act as governor will be to sign a proclamation calling for the legislature to meet next Monday for a special 20-day constitutional revision session.

The oath of office was administered by Florida Supreme Court Justice Millard Caldwell at the traditional noon hour.

Also taking the mantle of leadership with Kirk were six Cabinet members, all Democrats. They were Secretary of State Tom Adams, Atty. Gen. Earl Faircloth, Treasurer Brown and Williams, Comptroller Fred O. Dickinson, Education Superintendent Floyd T. Christian and Agriculture Commissioner Doyle Conner.

These Cabinet members, elected to four-year terms, will share executive responsibilities with Kirk and all with the governor have been errors or omissions he will correct them."

For growth and security, progress and prosperity are not questions of political faith, but of devotion by all of us to a common cause. Whether a conservative Southern Democrat, as I, or a Republican, as he was Florida's first, and we have a single esoteric purpose to build an ever-greater state where the weak are safe and the strong are just," Burns said.

Burns said that Kirk and every public official "will have my cooperation and support" though he is returning to private life.

Kirk's inauguration brings about the curtain on a Democratic Party monopoly of the governor's chair since 1911. Governor B. Hart, a Republican, was inaugurated Jan. 7, 1913 and died a year later. The Democrats had won the governorship ever since.

Kirk regarded a lightly knit Republican group and called to a stunning victory on Nov. 8 over Democrat Robert King High. Kirk spent \$50,000 on his general election campaign and the amount he predicted it would cost.

Kirk is a native of San Bernardino, Calif., but has had several homes. He lived in Chicago for a while and spent his teenage years in Alabama. He attended Emory University in Atlanta and Duke University at Durham, N.C.

He graduated with honors from the University of Alabama Law School. His mother, Mrs. Claude R. Kirk Sr., is an assistant clerk with the Alabama House of Representatives.

On School Mix Order 'Seminole Complies'

Seminole County schools have met all 1966-67 guidelines for desegregation and have been approved by U. S. education officials, it was reported today by R. T. Milwee, school superintendent.

A revised set of guidelines was received in today's mail by Milwee on the heels of a U. S. District Court of Appeals decision at New Orleans upholding federal desegregation in the South must end by the start of the 1967 term.

"Seminole already is complying with the order," Milwee said, "although we have yet to study this revised set of guidelines just received."

Milwee pointed out that Seminole County school children have a "freedom of choice" in selecting the schools to which they wish to attend. In this respect, Coons High and Goldsboro have white teachers on the faculties but all-Negro school population.

The superintendent said desegregation moved smoothly in Seminole County schools, in compliance with federal laws, and with only one incident.

The U. S. District Court of Appeals in New Orleans last week upheld federal desegregation in the south must end by the start of the 1967 term.

At the same time ex-Governor Haydon Burns said he doesn't feel a court decision upholding disputed federal school desegregation guidelines will "have any effect on any community in Florida."

However, State School Supt. Floyd T. Christian said it will be impossible as flying to the moon to complete desegregation by next fall.

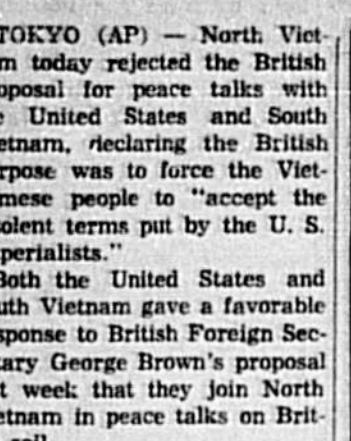

N. Vietnam Rejects Peace Talks



TOIKYO (AP) — North Vietnamese rejected the British proposal for peace talks with the United States and South Vietnam, declaring the British purpose was to force the Viet namese terms to "accept the imperialist terms put by the U. S. imperialism."

Both the United States and South Vietnam gave a favorable response to British Foreign Secretary George Brown's proposal last week that they join North Vietnam in peace talks on British terms.

North Vietnam's official newspaper Nhan Dan reiterated Communist terms for peace to assist and support the war against a conference.

"Such a foul act on the part of the British government completely runs counter to the responsibility of Britain as a co-chairman of the 95 Geneva Conference on Vietnam," it said.

Queen Caught In A Bind Over Kissing' Cousin

LONDON (AP) — Queen Elizabeth II was caught up in a crisis of conscience today over her first cousin's desire to marry "the mother of his illegitimate son after his wife divorces him."

An announcement Monday by attorneys for the Earl of Hereford, 43 and 18th in line of succession to the throne, came as a bombshell to the British public and uncovered one of the best-kept royal secrets.

The statement said Hereward's Austrian-born countess is suing him for divorce on grounds of adultery with Patricia Tuckwell, a dark-haired Australian divorcee who once worked as his secretary.

The attorneys said the earl would not defend his wife's suit, that "the and Miss Tuckwell would wish to marry if and when they are legally free to do so," and that Miss Tuckwell had a son by him in July 1964.
