Ruling On Millage: No Change Here

The ruling by a U.S. District Court judge that Florida's 10-mill limit on local property taxes is unconstitutional will not be a freedom for city and county boards to tack on any new millages.

This was opined today by Sanford City Manager W. E. Knowles, when asked about the action of Federal Judge Joe Eaton at Miami that reaffirmed the right of the Legislature to limit local government spending but stated the existing statute is illegal because it allows only property owners to vote on millage increases.
