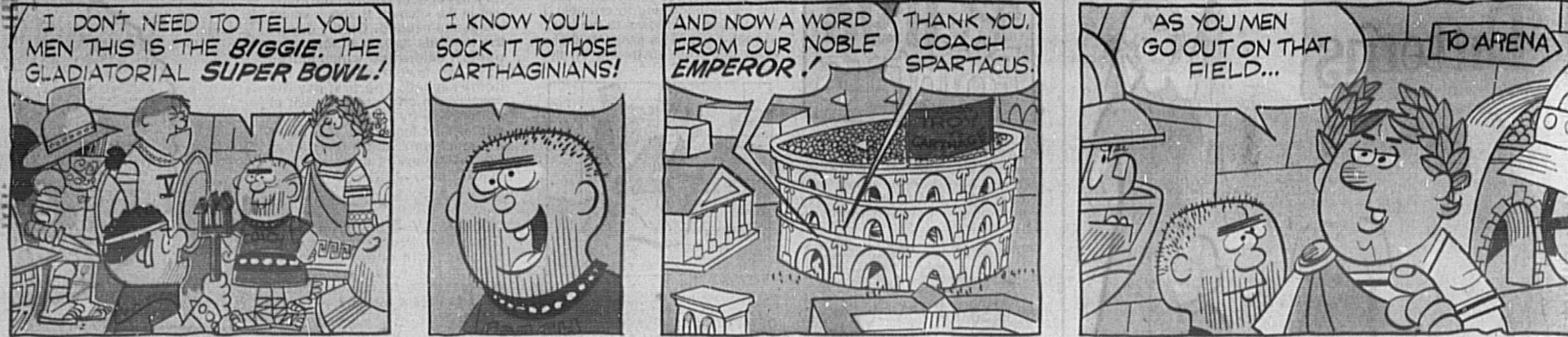

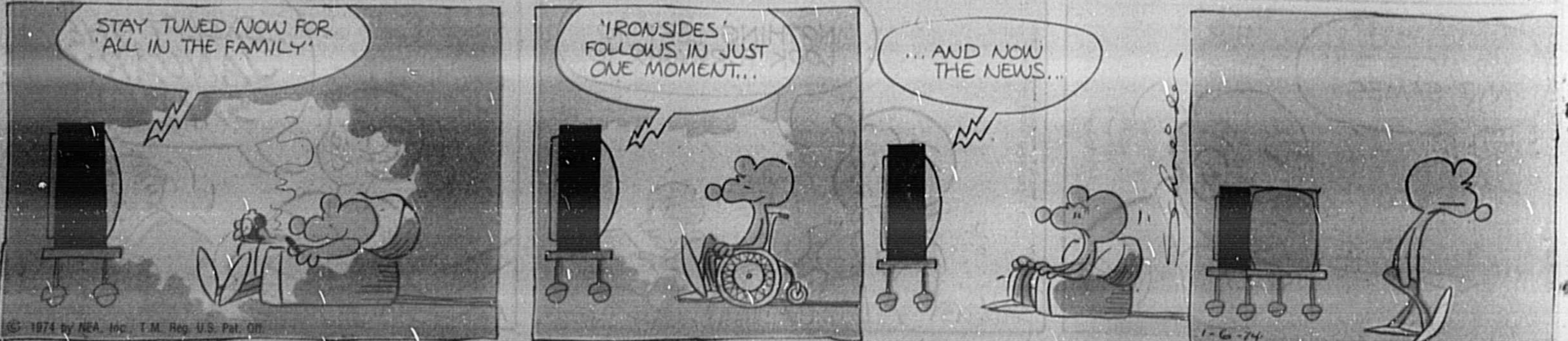

Local Woman Jailed On Murder Charge

A 31-year-old woman remained in county jail without bond today, charged with first degree murder and use of a firearm in commission of a felony in the Sunday shooting death of Ira Patterson, 41, 1823 Knox Avenue, Sanford.

Sanford police detective Capt. Charles Fagan arrested Helen Rouse, 1705 Peach Avenue, several hours after police found Patterson slumped over in a car on Yale Drive in the Academy Manor subdivision.

Investigators declined to say how they linked the Rouse woman with the slaying. Officers said today the death weapon has not been found.

Police had been alerted to a suspicious car parked with its headlights on at 12:50 a.m. on the rubble-littered street where newly constructed houses have been targets of extensive vandalism.

Patrolman Jerry Dillard found the body when he approached the 1971 Pontiac sedan to investigate, police said. Reposa 300 the car's bright beam headlights were on and the left rear tire was flat.

Seminole medical examiner G.V. Garay pronounced Patterson dead at the scene and conducted an autopsy later Sunday.

Fagan said the dead man had been shot two times, once in the head and once in the neck, with a small caliber weapon, apparently by someone standing outside the vehicle.

Complaints Filed By Parents

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP)—Dozens of concerned parents called school officials in the Jacksonville area Monday with complaints about Daylight Saving Time.

Party Leader Vows Fight For Power

BELFAST, Northern Ireland (AP)—Brian Faulkner resigned today as leader of the Unionist party, but remained chief executive of the Northern Ireland government and vowed to continue his fight for sharing power with the Catholic minority.

"I believe it would be wrong to continue in leadership of a party organization which has rejected the policies on which my colleagues and I fought the Assembly elections," Faulkner said in his resignation statement.

His decision, followed last week's decisive defeat in his party's caucus in the 78-seat Assembly.

If it splits, his coalition with the Catholic-based Social Democratic and Labor party would be in danger, and along with it Britain's hope for peace in the troubled province.

Faulkner's problem now will be to retain full support of his 28-strong caucus in the 78-seat Assembly.

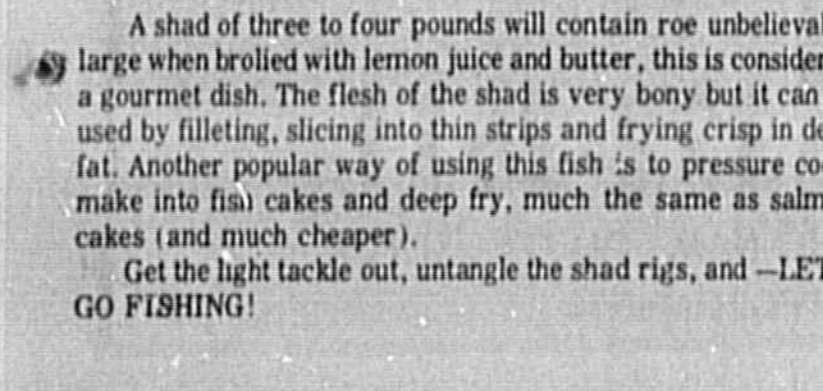
