Governor Blasted By Swofford

Men's Last Stronghold The Kitchen, Says Woman Chef

NEW YORK (AP) — Reading about the famous chef of a famous restaurant and all the money he makes, a woman who is an excellent cook will think "That could be a good career for me."

But she can't probably become an astronaut easier than she can a famous chef. As distinct from the household, short order or institutional cook, the elite restaurant chef works in a field almost closed to women. Even in New York City, where thousands of restaurants abound, the female chef is a rarity.

One of the very few, Mrs. Josephine Zagar, is amazed at the lack of opportunity for women chefs in the United States as compared with Europe.

"Women keep a cleaner kitchen and are more ambitious than men," asserts Mrs. Zagar, a cheerful lady who emigrated from Yugoslavia in 1960. "They

keep on learning new dishes because, like women, they adore compliments from the patrons. Many male chefs have little heart for the food and are very 'wasteful.'"

According to Mrs. Zagar, there are in Europe as many women chefs and kitchen assistants as men. In this country the helpers are all men and they're taking orders from a female. The public too, she says, has been talked into thinking that fine cooking is a masculine mode of restaurants about.

"When I started here in the Old Chelsea restaurant four years ago the customers frowned when my employer referred to his new chef as 'She'. Now, after I take a few days off they all say, 'Oh Josie, thank God you're back.' They were surprised that a woman can be a good restaurant chef. Employers are too very doubtful."

This doubt, which Mrs. Zagar feels is partially prejudice against women, is based more on reality, authorities in the business report. Mr. Ludolph Wehl, president of a leading food personnel agency, interprets the male domination of the restaurant kitchen as mostly a matter of stamina.

"In this country famous restaurants are large. It takes physical endurance to stand the strain of preparing 2,000 meals a day, the heat, the terrific pace of service, to say nothing of lifting 36-pound pots of soup. The heat makes women nervous and you can't air condition because the food cooks off too fast. Also she handles 12 diners at once and keeps mental track of how many and how many medium steaks are broiling. She never gets flustered but has a fast rule that waiters write orders clearly so that there is no talk in the kitchen."

Describing ingredients as "a handful of this and a drop of that," she doesn't go by recipes but by intuition and experience. Mrs. Zagar runs her kitchen with only one helper because

capable assistant chef is hard to find and the less people about the less chance of accidents.

Her specialties at the restaurant include weiner schnitzel, goulashes, and crepe Suzette, while at home, cooking for herself or for her grown son, she favors stuffed veal breast and chicken paprikash.

"There are some special tricks to turn out an excellent dish but the best one is to use the proper utensils. I'm very fussy about my pots. I use only aluminum like in the restaurant, so that vegetables cook evenly and quickly. Aluminum pans don't have hot spots that can scorch food in a minute."

Being a restaurant chef is harder in Europe, she says, because except for the newest places, stoves are often wood-burning, there is never enough hot water and no dishwashing machines. When she arrived here she had to become acquainted with rare steaks and roast beef, plain boiled vegeta-

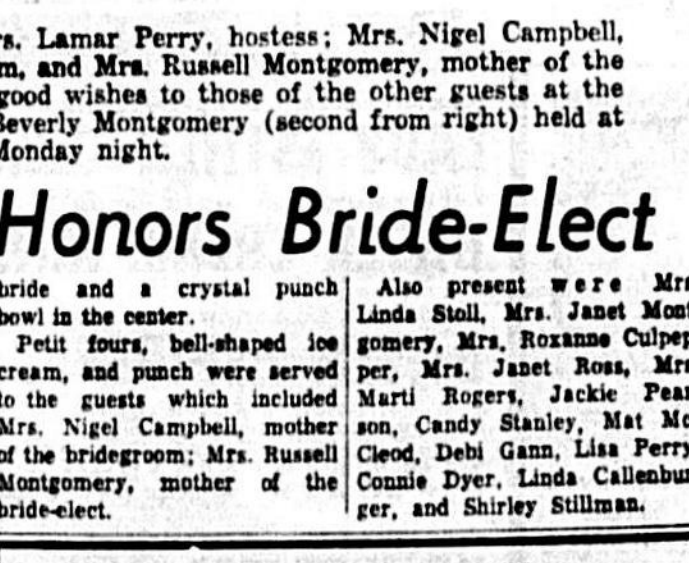

The Mental Health Association is asking those of us who have so much more to share it with those who have so little.

To bring cheer to mental patients, select a nice NEW Christmas gift from the items suggested and deposit it at the collection center for this area, First Federal Savings and Loan Association in Sanford, by Dec. 1.

Suggested items for men are: caps; tobacco, pipes, and pouches; hair cream, shaving cream and lotion, all in plastic bottles; socks, shorts and T-shirts, and sports and dress shirts.

Gifts for women include compact, powder, and cosmetics; make-up kits; purses and gloves; slippers, panties, and nightgowns; dresses, blouses, and dress materials; hosiery, and scarves or stoles.

Gifts for either sex are bedroom slippers, bathrobes and housecoats; blouses; jeans, slacks, sweaters, or plastic raincoats, and cigarettes and lighters.

At the collection center, fill in the special gift tag, describing each gift fully. Take the gifts to the center unwrapped; the Project Cheer committee will wrap them for you. However, your contribution of gift wrapping paper and ribbon will be welcome.

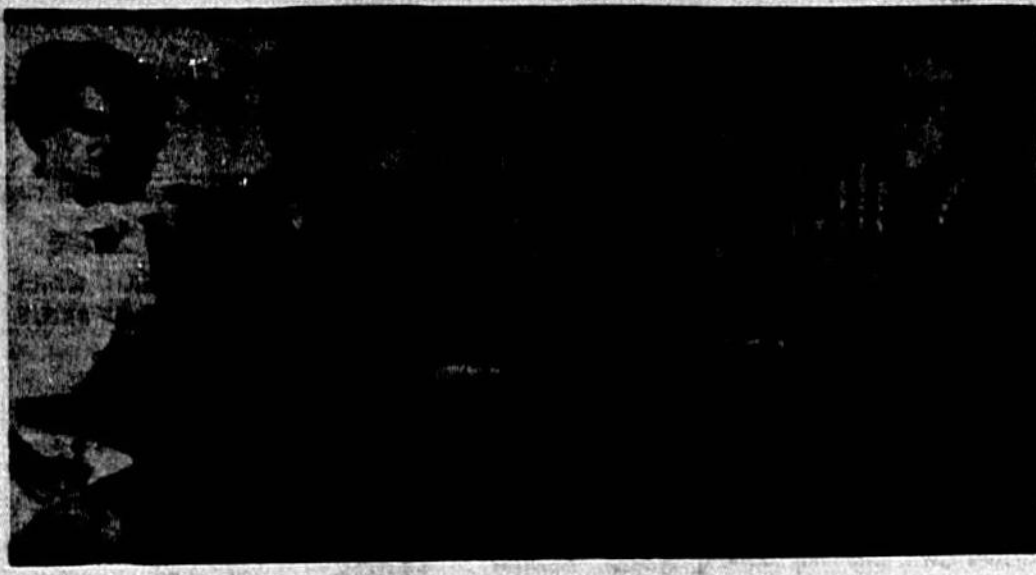

Boats To Travel The Arkansas

TULSA, Okla. (AP)—Plans of river boats superseeded in the 19th century by whistles of locomotives will be echoing again on the historic Arkansas River. By December 1968 boats will leave the Mississippi and travel as far upstream on the meandering Arkansas River as Little Rock, Ark. In little more than a year they are scheduled to dock at the navigational terminus at Tulsa, Oklahoma's Port of Callon, 435 miles from the Mississippi. The U.S. Corps of Engineers says the \$1.3-billion project is the largest civil work it has ever undertaken, even bigger than the Panama Canal or the St. Lawrence Seaway. Congress approved development of the Arkansas River basin in 1948. Seven dams on the Arkansas' tributaries in Oklahoma control sediment and water flowing into the big stream, the nation's third longest, as well as provide electrical power, additional flood control, domestic and industrial water supply and recreation. Tourists in Norway can drive to North Cape, a point beyond the Arctic Circle.
