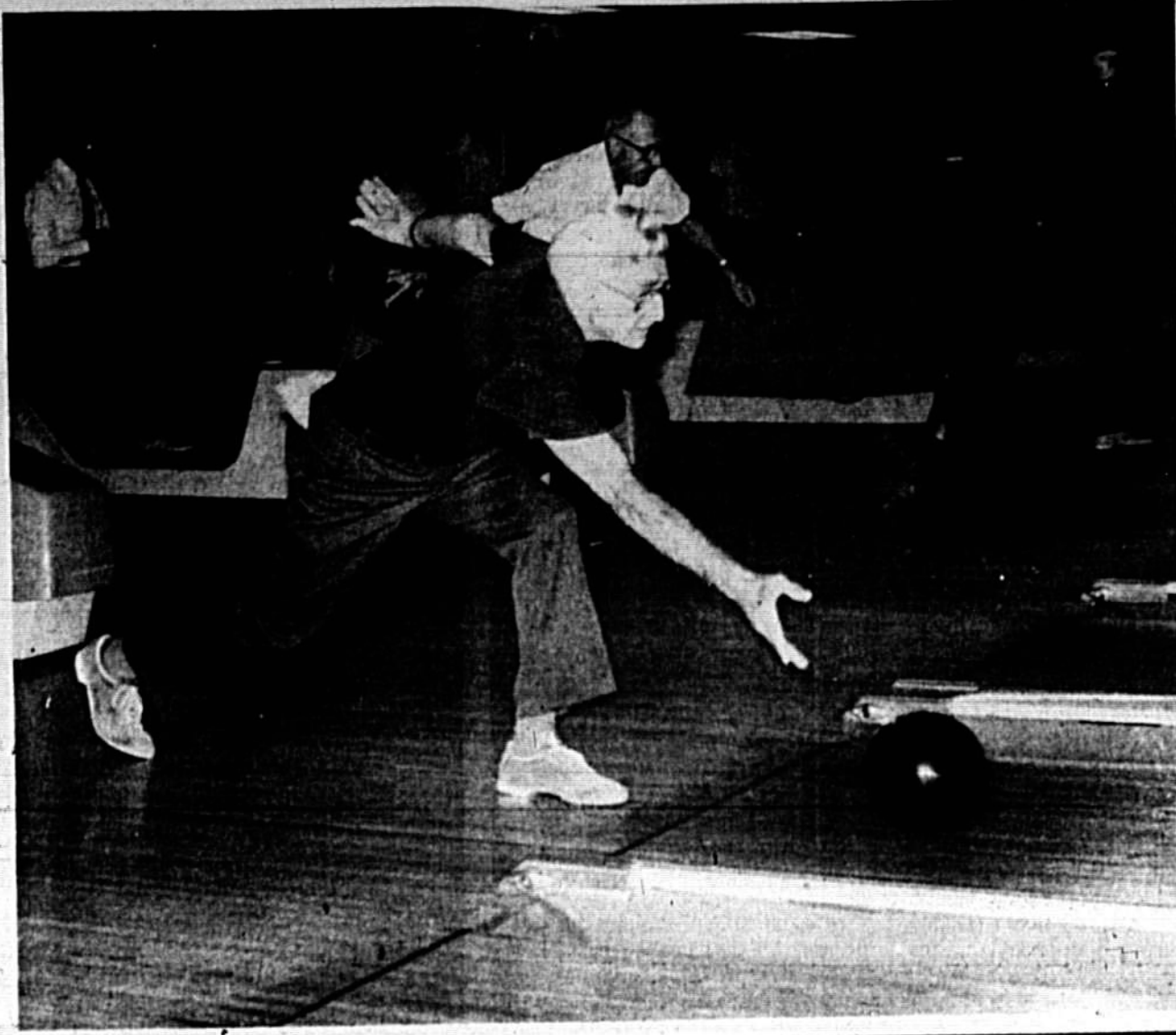


Golden Age Competitors Give It Their All In Number Of Events

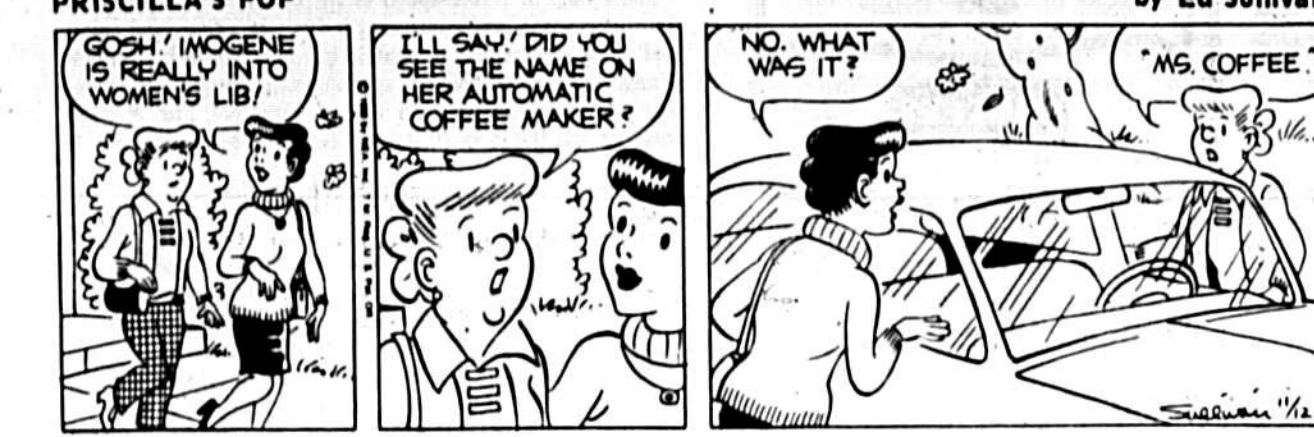

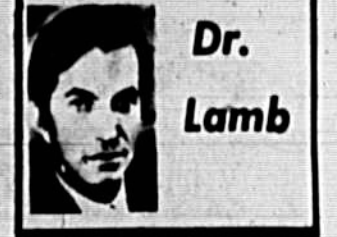

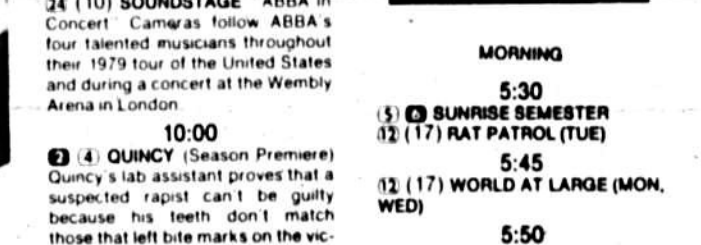
