

#### Let's Get That Hospital Built

When Seminole Memorial Hospital staffers were told the other day that a state agency turned down Hospital Corporation of America's proposal to build a new hospital in Sanford, they were stunned and astonished. So were we.

Could this be the kind of over-regulation and red tape President-elect Reagan referred to on several occasions during his campaign? If it is, maybe state officials ought to take a good look at Florida's bureaucracy to see where some trimming might be in order.

After several months of negotiation, planning, public hearings, and preliminary approval of HCA's plans for a new hospital in Sanford, up pops the State Office of Community Medical Facilities to deny a Certificate of Need application submitted nearly a year ago by HCA. Take advantage of time and labor saving appliances like microwave ovens or food processors if you have them. The most obvious way to simplify entertaining is to prepare much of the food in advance. This is easy when you use gelatin based dishes such as the Turkey Vegetable Mold, Danish Fruit Soup and Glazed Apple Cheese Pie suggested here. All three recipes are made with apple gelatin. It brings the flavor of America's favorite fruit to any meal and greatly simplifies entertaining by letting you prepare great looking


