### Police release drawing of Rock Lake attacker

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is seeking additional information regarding an incident last week at Rock Lake Middle School near Longwood.

A 12-year-old female student reports that she was dropped off Thursday, Sept. 7 at 7:45 a.m. for an extracurricular activity at the school.

Shortly thereafter, she says she became separated from her friends. She states that a middle-aged man, who had the appearance of a staff member at the school, then approached her. He asked her to help him with a chore.

The man led the student to an alcove by the tennis courts near the gym and grabbed her upper body. The student says she pushed back, hit the man and ran away from the scene. She says when she finally looked back, she did not see the man any more.

The girl did not tell her parents about the incident until last weekend. They reported the case to the school resource deputy on Monday, Sept. 11. He began a preliminary investigation.

Tuesday, the case was turned over to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office Child Protective Services Division. As of this time, no verification has been made that the suspect is a school representative. The investigation continues.

## County picks new economic director

### Rob Nixon will be county's highest ranking black official

SANFORD — Rob Nixon, a skilled economic development manager, is leaving the top job in St. Lucie County to become Seminole County's Economic Development Manager.

Nixon will begin his new employment on Monday, Oct. 2. County Manager Kevin Grace said Nixon was the county's

choice after an extensive search to succeed Bob Turk, who resigned two months ago. Five candidates were invited to Sanford for interviews.

"Rob Nixon is extremely qualified," Grace said this morning. "He wowed us with his knowledge and his enthusiasm. He's the kind of man who can't wait to

get up in the morning and do his job." Nixon has extensive background in job growth programs, small and minority businesses and urban recruitment.

Grace said Nixon, 36, becomes the top-ranking black manager on county staff, and more importantly, he was the "most qualified candidate for the Economic Development Manager's position."

## Museum officials prepare to lobby state for funding

SANFORD — A total of 17 persons will depart from Sanford early Tuesday, Sept. 19, for a trip to Tallahassee.

Fifteen will be making the trip via bus. Two others will already be on hand. The purpose is to urge the state to approve a \$250,000 grant to the Seminole County Museum.

Those going are members of the Seminole County Historical Society, led by the museum's Karen Jacobs, and the society's President, Charlie Carlson.

"Our Historical Commission has worked very hard putting this grant proposal together," Carlson said. "This grant means a lot to our county museum and everyone who visits it."

Jacobs said the group is

planning to appear before State Representatives to make their presentation for the grant.

"We don't know exactly when we will meet with them," Jacobs said. "It could be late Monday or some time on Tuesday."

"We intend to show our support by physically meeting face-to-face with those who will be deciding on this grant," Carlson commented.

If the \$250,000 grant is approved, it would be required to be met with matching funds from Seminole County.

"We also plan to pay a visit to the State Historical Museum," Jacobs said. "Many of the folks who will be going with us haven't had the opportunity to see the museum."

The group is expected to return to Sanford by late Wednesday.

## Federal grant enables Sanford police to add four new officers

SANFORD — The Sanford Police Department has been awarded \$396,060 by the U.S. Department of Justice to hire four full-time police officers to combat violence in schools.

The award was announced by U.S. Rep. Corrine Brown, who has supported President Clinton's plan to add 100,000 new police officers to the streets.

"This is one of the most important initiatives for our communities and for our youth," Brown said. "I believe that our law enforcement will be a critical component to helping end the epidemic of youth violence."

The officers to be added to the Sanford Police Department are to use community policing strategies for conflict mediation, mentoring activities, gang mediation and truancy programs. The officers will work in primary and secondary schools.

According to Sgt. Michael Horan with the Sanford Police Department, present police officers will be reassigned to work in schools, while the four new personnel will join the regular force. The four have not yet been hired.

At the present time, there is one officer assigned to both Goldboro and Pinecrest Elementary schools.

"We'll add an officer here," he said, "so each school will have

its own officer. Others will go to Wicklow and Hamilton, and we'll be adding a second person to Seminole High School."

He said the money requires no local matching funds and will pay for the salary and benefits for the four new personnel. At the end of the four years of the grant, the four will be required to remain on the staff, with the school board already agreeing to pay for half of the cost.

With the addition of the four new personnel, Sanford Police will have a total of ten assigned to the schools, nine resource officers and one DARE officer.

"We see this as an excellent effort to have safer schools and safer neighborhoods," Horan said.

## Downtown Sanford receives bomb scare

SANFORD — A city block was evacuated Thursday after authorities were notified of a possible bomb in a downtown building.

Authorities received a call around 4:45 p.m. about a possible explosive device at E. 202 First St., Sanford. Fire Inspector H.A. "Pete" Tucker said.

People were immediately evacuated from the area. The

Seminole County Explosive Ordinance Disposal team investigated the 5-by-5 inch package, which was left on the stairwell of the building, said Cleo Cohen, spokeswoman for the Sanford Police Department.

"The police were called because a mysterious box making a noise was left on the stairwell," Cohen said. "A pager was inside the box."

People were allowed to return to the area around 5:45 p.m.

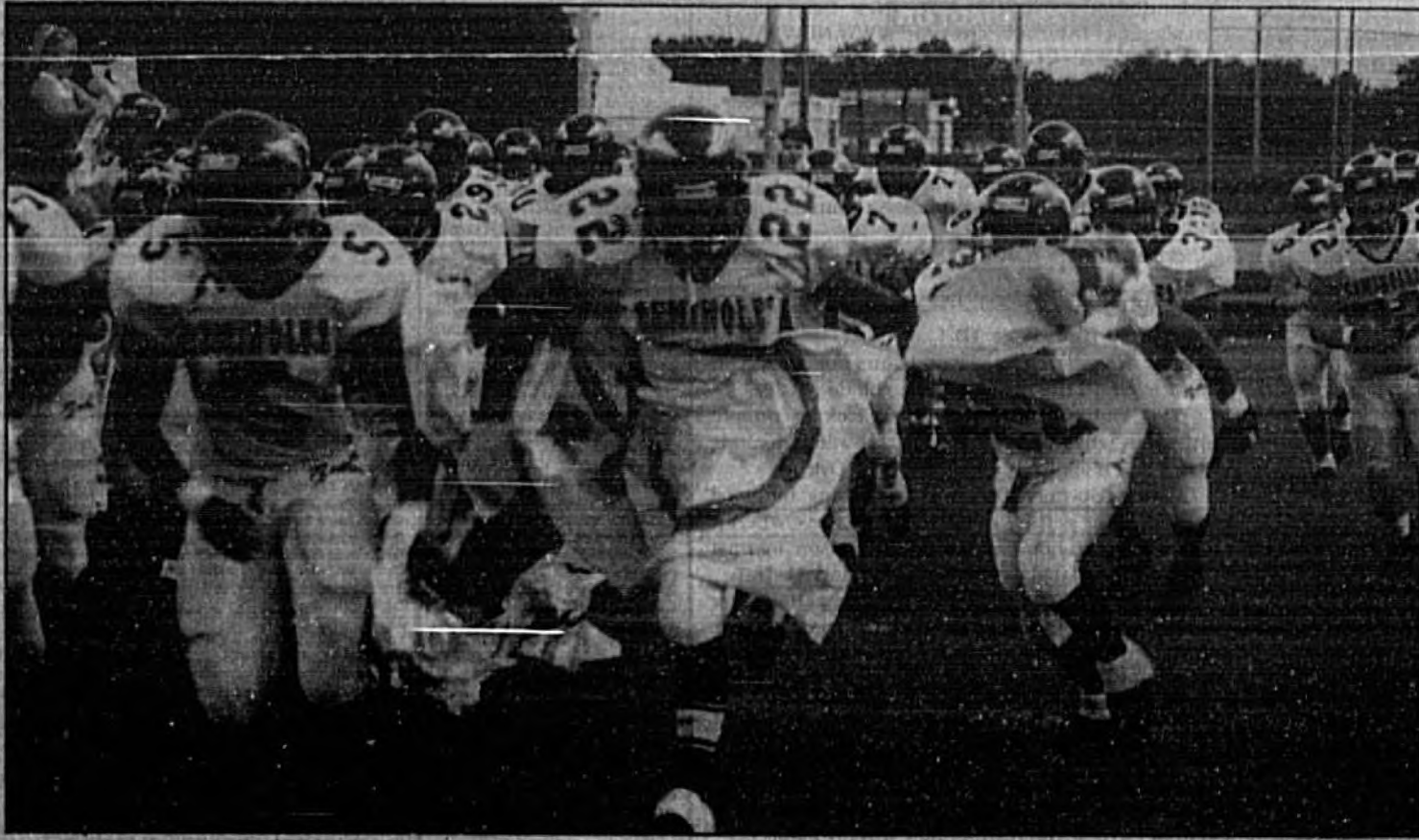

Arriving in Florida, Cooper said he taught at Sanford and Oviedo high schools and was a principal at Oviedo.

"I was never aware of riches," he said. "The Lord blessed me. I was in the right places. I had a wonderful wife. Marrying Gladys was the most important, the best part of my life. We had 62 very happy years. It didn't

take me long to know we were in love."

Kathy Ferguson, Renaissance activities director, marvels at Cooper's sharp mind and memory.

lar, were restored and are now on display at the museum, Gouchenour said.

"This is an important thing," she said. "It lets people know what was going on back then — who was president and what was happening in the news."

"And, it lets people see the differences between today and back then," she said. "I am sure the school laws were much different in the '20s than they are today."

Other differences included teachers' salaries and building costs.

In 1922, the Seminole County School Board spent \$4,000 for .10 acres of property on 1401 Magnolia Ave., and it cost about \$34,000 to build Sanford's second elementary school. Once the facility's doors opened, Stella Arrington earned \$225 a month to serve as principal.

In 1984 — 66 years after it first opened its doors — South Side Primary School, along with Sanford Grammar and Hopper Academy, ceased to exist. The

schools became special service centers for the school system and students started attending the system's new school, Hamilton Elementary on Eighth Avenue.

South Side became the Velma Mitchell annex, and the building was converted into offices. In 1998, the school system decided to sell the school, and on Tuesday, the School Board approved a contract for Sanford Properties Inc. to purchase the building for \$250,000. Rami Yosefian, owner of Sanford Properties Inc., previously said he plans to turn the building into an assisted-living facility.

Soon, South Side's time capsule items will also be gone from public view. According to Gouchenour, the 1920s memorabilia will be on display at the museum for a couple of weeks and then they will be placed in the museum's archives.

Cake and pie: There not just for dessert anymore

My favorite breakfast in the world is pie, preferably blueberry-peach or rhubarb. If I can't have pie, I want cake. Day-old yellow birthday cake with really gooey white icing is good, or a nice spice or carrot cake with cream-cheese frosting.

To make the streusel: In a bowl, mix together the flour, cinnamon and brown sugar. Mash in the butter with a fork until well-distributed. Add the nuts and mix. Set aside.

To make the cake: Cream together the butter and sugar. Beat in the buttermilk and eggs. Add the flour, baking powder and salt. Mix well.

Spoon half the batter into the prepared pan. Distribute the apples and half the streusel on top of the batter. Spoon the rest of the batter evenly over all. Top with the remaining streusel and bake for 45 minutes to 1 hour, or until a tester inserted into the cake comes out clean.

Note: I prefer to use only all-purpose, unbleached white flour in this recipe because it makes a lighter cake.

RUSSIAN SOUR CREAM CAKE

For the cake: 1 cup unsalted butter, 2 cups sugar, 4 large eggs, 2 teaspoons vanilla, 4 cups all-purpose flour, 2 teaspoons baking soda, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 2 cups sour cream. For the topping (see note): 2 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 cup chopped walnuts, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 2 teaspoons cinnamon.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a 10-inch tube pan.

To make the cake: Cream together the butter and sugar. Add the eggs and vanilla, beating well.

In a separate bowl, sift together the flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt, and add to the other ingredients, alternating with the sour cream. Beat well until smooth.

To make the topping: Mix the sugar, walnuts, brown sugar and cinnamon together (see note). Starting with the cake batter, alternate layers of the cake batter and the filling 3 times. You should end up with the filling on top.

Bake in a preheated oven for 1-1/2 hours, or until a toothpick comes out clean when inserted. Leave in pan about 15 minutes, and then remove, inserting a knife around the side to loosen.

Note: I have made this recipe as printed, but I prefer to double the recipe for the topping. Yield: 1 large cake, or at least 12 servings.

SOUR CREAM BLUEBERRY CUMBU CAKE

For the topping: 1 cup all-purpose flour, 1/4 cup granulated sugar, 1/3 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 7 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted.

For the cake: 1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour, 1-1/4 cups baking powder, 1/4 teaspoon baking soda, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1 cup blueberries, 1 cup sour cream, 1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract, 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened, 1 cup granulated sugar, 2 large eggs.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Butter and flour a 9-inch-square cake pan.

To make the topping: In a medium bowl, stir together the flour, sugar, cinnamon and salt until well-blended. Add the melted butter and mix with a fork, stirring until the butter is absorbed and the dry ingredients are uniformly moistened. Set aside the crumb mixture.

To make the cake: In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt until well-blended.

In another medium bowl, toss the blueberries with 1 tablespoon of the flour mixture until the berries are coated.

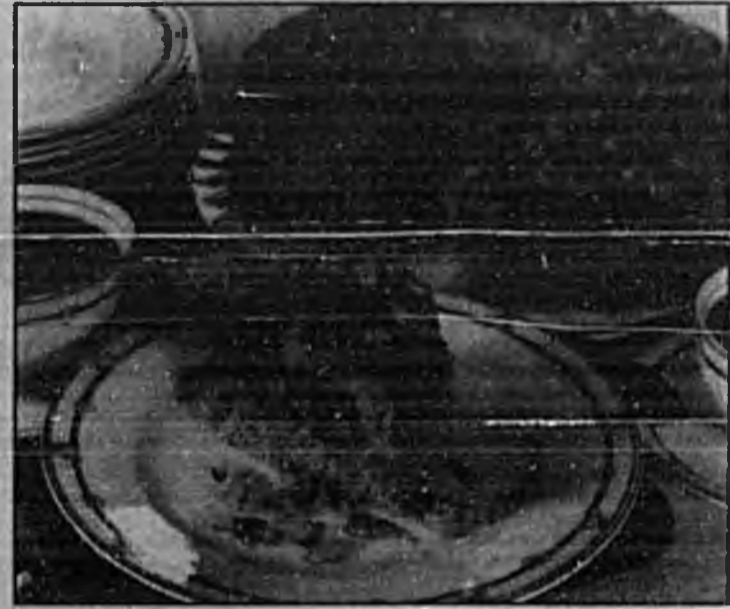
In a small bowl, whisk together the sour cream and vanilla extract.

In a large bowl, using an electric mixer set on medium speed, beat together the butter and granulated sugar for 4 to 5 minutes, or until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition and stopping to scrape down the sides of the bowl when necessary. On low speed, beat in the flour mixture in 3 additions, alternating with the sour cream in 2 additions. Using a rubber spatula, fold in the blueberries.

Scrape the batter into the prepared pan and smooth the top with a table knife or metal spatula. Sprinkle the crumb topping evenly over the batter, breaking up any large lumps with your fingers.

Bake the cake until a toothpick inserted into the center of the cake comes out clean, about 45 minutes. Place the cake in its pan on a wire rack and cool completely. Cut into squares and serve from the pan. Store the cake in the pan, covered with aluminum foil, in the refrigerator for up to 3 days. Bring to room temperature before serving. Yield: 1 9-inch cake, or about 9 servings.

I found that trendy, cutting-edge cookbooks are not the place to find good coffee cake recipes. Coffee cake recipes are found in nice, homey cookbooks, such as "Mrs. Restino's Country Kitchen," by Susan Restino, a home cook from Nova Scotia, or Joan Nathan's classic, "Jewish Cooking in America," or the newly minted "Diner Desserts," by Tish Boyle, a book with recipes for every kind of layer cake, cheesecake, and cream pie that ever sat under a Plexiglas cake-keeper.

APPLE STREUSEL CAKE

For the streusel: recipe: 1/2 cup whole-wheat or all-purpose white flour, or a mixture of both (see note), 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 2/3 cup brown sugar, 2 tablespoons cold butter, 1 cup chopped nuts. For the cake: 2/3 cup unsalted butter, softened, 1-1/2 cups brown sugar, 1-1/2 cups buttermilk, 2 eggs, 1-1/2 cups unbleached white flour, 1-1/2 cups whole-wheat flour (see note), 4-1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1-1/2 teaspoons salt, 3 cups chopped apples (or 3 cups fresh or frozen blueberries).

Countertops aren't seating for guests

This week, the school president gave Knight the heave-ho for "unacceptable behavior." As a token of the school's appreciation for his contributions, Knight will receive \$1.3 million over the next 10 years.

Knight, who made no apologies, says he is not done and wants to coach in the worst way. But isn't that the way he's always coached?

Basketball itself is a form of unacceptable behavior. Basketball players wear sneakers. They steal. They grab, elbow and push and they foul. (They also have gross armpits).

Bob Knight has been described as mercurial, temperamental and profane. No stats are kept for such virtues. Nor for distance on chair throw. The man threw a good chair, and a mean tantrum.

You must have noticed Tuesday that Knight was wearing a Ted Williams pullover shirt. A gorgeous green garment. Knight and baseball Teddy speak the same language. Purple.

It doesn't take a psychotherapist to figure out why these guys hang together. Wear the same shirt. Fish.

Bond. Spit. Ted was known as the "Splendid Splinter" and later as the "Splendid Spitter."

Sportsworld is a haven for splinters, spitters and sinners. Now and then a good-good shoes comes along. Bill Bradley, for instance. Even Al Gore is more charismatic.

I could be wrong but I don't expect any college to hire Bob Knight in the next couple of years. He needs to cool off. Go with the wife on a Mediterranean cruise. Take anger management classes. Ask the university trustees if he can teach "Zero Tolerance" classes at IU.

When I was 14 and dreaming of playing college basketball, Branch McCracken coached at Indiana. His 1952-53 team won the National Championship. Don Schlundt had 30 points in the championship game, a 69-68 victory over Kansas.

Coach McCracken answered a letter and sent me an Indiana brochure.

He won two national championships and had a 451-277 record at Indiana. I didn't think the Hoosiers would ever have one as great a coach as Mr. McCracken who retired in 1965. They haven't.
