

### How Japan Is Ruled

The government of Japan consists primarily of the emperor. Actually he can do practically anything he wants to regardless of the wishes of the people or anybody else. Technically, however, his powers are limited by a constitution which presumes to set up a representative form of government. This constitution was promulgated by the mikado in 1889 in accordance with an oath he had taken nearly twenty years previously to give the people a voice in their government.

The constitution consists of some 76 articles, 17 deyoted to the emperor, 15 to the rights and duties of subjects, 22 to the imperial diet, 2 to the ministers of state and privy council, 5 to the judiclary, 12 to finance and 4 to supplementary rules. It divides the functions of gov-ernment among the parliament or diet, which is the rep-resentative body, the executive branch of the government consisting of the privy council, the imperial cabinet, and nine ministers of state, and the judiciary.

The members of the cabinet, as well as the privy council and the ministers of state are appointed by the emperor and are answerable to him. Through them he exercises all the executive powers of government, subject only to the advice and assistance of his ministers. Constitutionally, and in the eyes of nearly all Japanese, the person of the emperor is said to be both sacred and inviolable. He holds supreme command of the army and navy, has the power to make war or peace, and appoints the members of the privy council which interprets the constitution.

In theory every law requires the consent of the Imperial diet, but the diet always is under the control of the emperor and can be dissolved whenever it can't controlled. The diet consists of an upper and lower house, The upper house, or the house of peers is composed of 404 members appointed by the emperor. It consists of 16 princes of the blood, 15 ordinary princes, 30 Marquises, 18 counts, 64 viscounts, 66 barons, 4 imperial academy members, 66 large taxpayers, and 125 miscellaneous members appointed at the emperor's discretion.

The lower house is somewhat more representative. It is composed of 466 members elected for four year terms. All male subjects who are 25 years of age, who have lived one year in their voting district, and who pay \$5 annually in direct taxes for the support of the government, are allowed to vote for members of the lower house. The franchise, however, is withheld from ecclesiastics, police, soldiers, sailors, bankrupts and outlaws.

In spite of the power which the emperor and his advisers wield, the importance of the diet is said to be constantly growing as is also the nationalization of certain hasic industries. It is now necessary for the cabinet to exercise an absolute control over at least a majority of the diet for without its approval no important matter of state can be carried out.

The emperor, too, while the supreme ruler in fact as well as in law, is said to be a mere screen behind which are a powerful group of aristocrats known as the elder statesmen who really control the government. 




