

Sanford Rezoning Request Returned To Plan Board

The request for rezoning on three lots on 5th Street just east of Granada in Sanford was returned Monday to the planning and zoning commission for reconsideration by the city commission.

The request, made by Matland businessman Donald Royer, had been recommended for denial by the planning and zoning commission earlier this month.

The request sought a change from multiple family (MR-1) to multiple family residential, office and institutional (RMOI).

If granted, the owner of the lots planned to construct a 3,500 square foot office building. The planning and zoning commission's recommendation of denial of the request advised the city commissioners that such a rezoning would not be in conformance with the comprehensive city plan.

In other action Monday night, the city commission:

- Presented Mack N. Cleveland with a plaque and a resolution of appreciation for 25 years of service as a representative on the civil service board.
- Granted 90-day extensions on condemnations to owners of the following properties: 1505 Park Ave., 310 S. Magnolia Ave., 1928 Maple Ave., 615 E. Ninth St., and 814 Elm Ave.
- Passed and adopted on second reading an ordinance closing, vacating and abandoning a portion of west Commercial Street between North Elm and North Myrtle avenues, reserving the closed street for utility purposes.
- Adopted a revised per diem schedule raising the rates paid to city officials traveling overnight to \$40 per day and 19 cents per mile in gas expense. The existing schedule had called for the allowance of \$35 per day and 14 cents per mile. The new schedule conforms to that of the Florida Legislature.
- Agreed to meet July 16 and 17 to begin work on the 1979-80 city budget.

V.F.W. exploded for 11 runs in the bottom of the fifth inning and scored on a single by Carter.

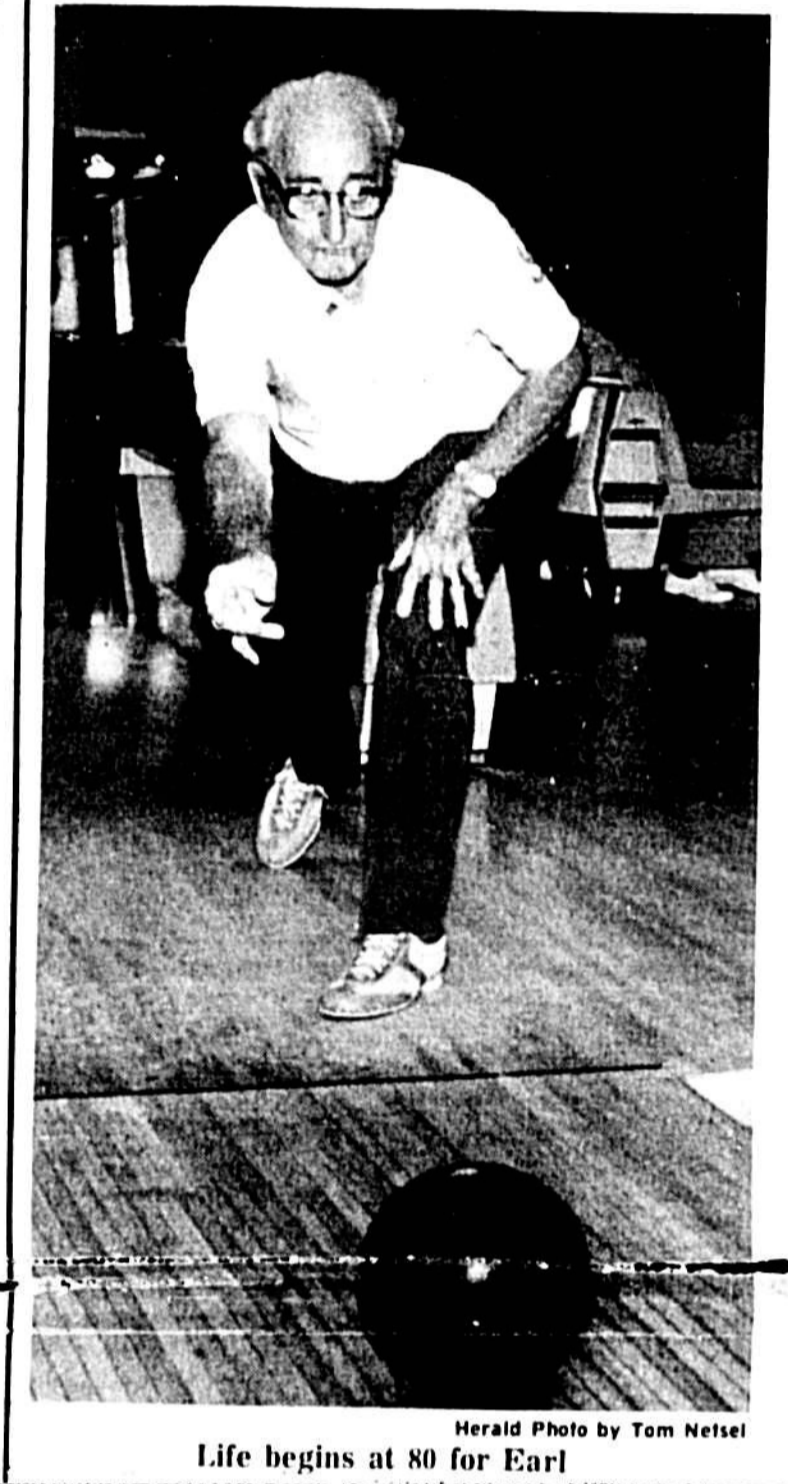

With all the parties his friends have thrown to celebrate his recent 80th birthday, Earl is lucky he found that "young at heart feeling," when he did. Several members of his bowling crowd, the Senior Citizens Bowlers, held a birthday bash Monday afternoon at the Bowl America bowling alley on Airport Blvd.

On Sunday, a birthday dinner was given for Earl by Victor Richter, 1121 Selma Rd., Longwood, at the Sanford Holiday House. Before that, he was honored by Tex Powell of Cuba with a Saturday afternoon cookout.

For Earl, bowling provided the key to his recent social success. It is more to him than a just a way of passing the time. It's a source of friends. People who understand Al's sense of humor. People who understand and want to be with him. That's what he gets from bowling.

"It's not difficult to see what his new life has done for Earl's outlook."

"I even made Bowler of the Week once," he says proudly. "Pretty good for a young man like me!"

Bean Home; McGee Locates Clubs

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UPI) — The Memphis Golf Classic is like a homecoming to Andy Bean.

For one thing, the former University of Florida standout is the defending champion here.

For another, the Bermuda greens on the Colonial Country Club course in Memphis are perfectly suited to his game.

"I feel comfortable on Bermuda," said the 26-year-old pro who learned the game on similar greens at Jakey Island, Ga.

"You can predict from your he in the final what your ball is going to do," Bean said. "And when you can predict what's going to happen, you can play fairly aggressively — and that's my game."

Bean proved his point in last year's event when he sank a 35-foot birdie putt on the first hole of a sudden-death playoff, with Lee Trevino, to take the Memphis title.

Bean said he would not be surprised if there was a repeat of last year's finish.

"I'd love for the two of us to be dueling it out again this week," Bean said in recalling his triumph over Trevino. "It'd be a good show for everybody."

Both Bean and Trevino came into the Memphis event on top of their games.

A back-to-back winner of the Memphis event in 1971-72, Trevino took the top prize last week in the Canadian Open. Bean won three weeks ago in Georgia.

The chance of a Bean-Trevino rematch was improved when Tom Watson, a top finisher on this year's tour, decided to bypass the Memphis tournament along with Jack Nicklaus.

Another pro, Jerry McGee, had a score at the Memphis event before the start today.

His clubs, which he spent the last 10 years accumulating, were stolen from the country club locker room Monday night and McGee withdrew from the tournament when no one could find them.

McGee was sitting at the Memphis airport awaiting flight home when he received word the clubs had been found in a trash can behind a grocery store near the golf course.

An official with the Shelby County Sheriff's Department said an anonymous telephone caller reported the whereabouts of the missing clubs Wednesday morning.

Deputies had no explanation for the theft or the return of the clubs. McGee, who won this year's Kemper Open, was allowed to return to the tournament field after they were returned.

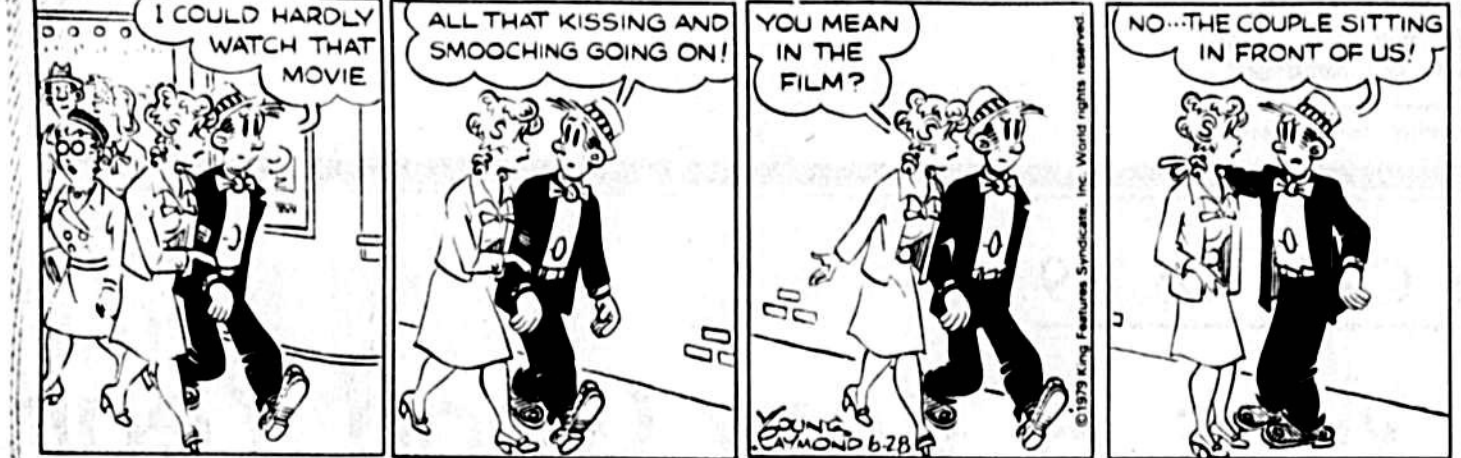

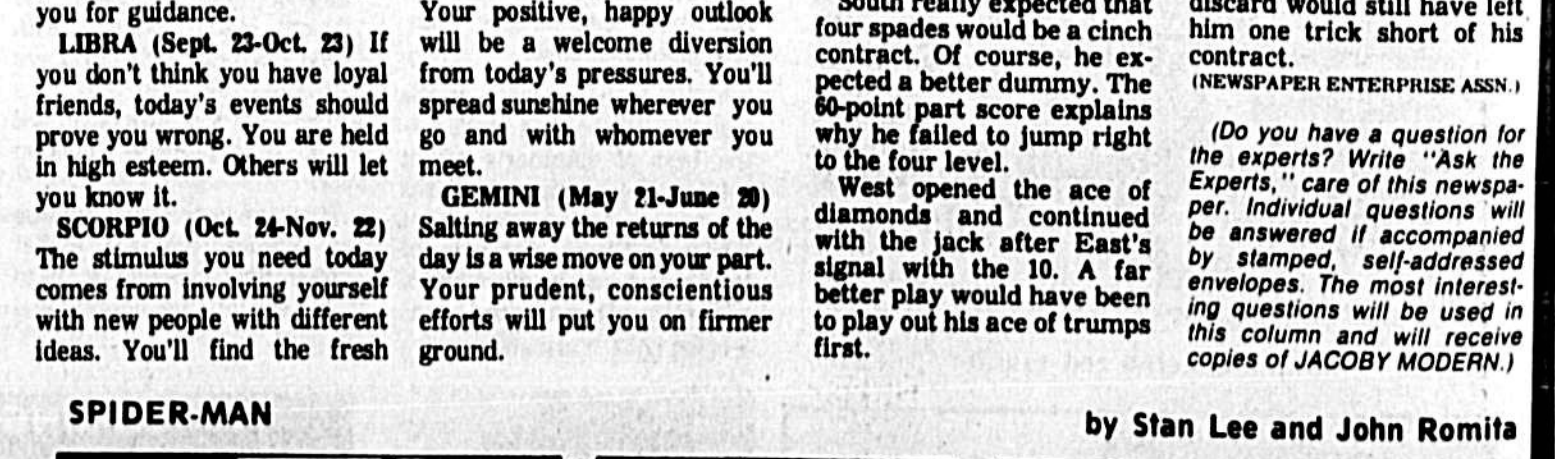

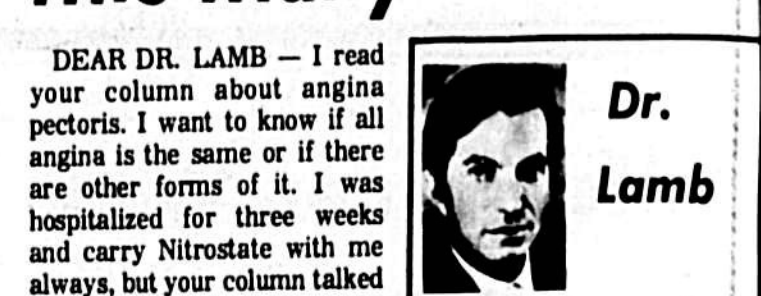
