Rising Gas Prices Altering Lifestyles In Seminole

Skyrocketing gasoline prices are beginning to change the lifestyles of Seminole County families and teen-agers. Sanford teen-agers say the cost of gasoline is cramping their style, as well as their wallets. No longer do couples routinely head for Orlando on dates. Trips to the beach are becoming more scarce. But, perhaps worst of all in their eyes, many are having to find work to pay for their

"I'm having to cut down on dates, especially to Winter Park or Orlando," said Tim Barley, 17, of Lake Mary. Tim may be having problems, but Melissa Gonzalez, 17,

"Worse than that, I have to ride my bike if it's possible. Gas has just gotten too high.'

of Sanford, says she's really in trouble.

"You can't use Mom and Dad's credit cards anymore, because it's those national stations that are always out of gas," she says. "And you can't use the the air-

conditioning either." Donna Lawrence, another Sanford 17-year-old, says she is glad she lives on a lake because "nowadays you have to pick one day a week for the beach." She adds, "You just can't go anywhere you want to anymore."

Angel Vidal, 15, Sanford, used to get enough money from mowing one yard to buy a tankful of gas. No more. "I don't even get half a tank," he says. "And you can't go too far at night because you can't find any stations to buy gas at so you can get back home."

Families, with or without teen-age drivers, are changing the way they operate, too. Shopping trips are being organized and consolidated. Perhaps worse,

families either are cutting down the frequency of vacations and pleasure trips or canceling them Mrs. Lou Woodruff, 1308 S. Magnolia Ave., Sanford, has

been returning to her North Carolina home at least once a year for the past 31 years. "This year," she says, "I'm not even thinking about it. It's not just the expense of gasoline, it's also the

availability I'm concerned about." "We usually go to Gainesville about once a month," said Mrs. Susan Paul, 312 Country Club Road, Lake Mary. "But with the cost of gas as well as the question of whether you can get it at all, we're just not making the trip. Our friends used to come down here to see us, too, but they're

not coming very often anymore, either." Mrs. Paul says the way she handles errands has

changed, too. She now rides her bicycle to her friends homes and for quick trips to the store. "I even take my bike for small loads of laundry," she says. "When I do use the car, I try to arrange it so I get everything done on one trip."

Mrs. Glenda Emerson of Abbott Ave., Lake Mary, says with a laugh, "You try to tell a 15 or 16-year-old girl she's got to stay at home. My daughter Debbie is involved in a lot of things. All I can do is try to arrange the trips so we get most of it done at once."

Of all these stories, Teresa LeFils, an 18-year-old Osteen girl, may be the most poignant. "We live 30 miles from everything," she says. "So I've been spending a lot of time at home. Guys say it just costs too much to come all the way out here."

House OKs Appropriations After Abortion Debate

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The House early today passed by a vote of 327 to 84 a \$73.5 billion appropriation for the Departments of Labor and Health, Education and Welfare after a frenzied debate over prohibiting payment for

Rejecting proposals to liberalize the abortion restriction or remove it from the bill outright, a lopsided majority of members insisted on allowing welfare money for abortions only when the mother's life is in danger.

The bill's outlay is \$2.2 billion above the fiscal 1979 appropriation but is \$204 million less than President Carter requested. It includes \$60.9 billion for HEW, \$11.3 billion for labor and \$1.3 billion for related agencies. During hours of rapid-fire debate, the House heard more than 30 amendments, passed 10 and rejected 15. Two were withdrawn and others were ruled out of order.

Baker Opposes SALT

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Senate Republican Leader Howard Baker's announcement Wednesday, although not unexpected, that he will oppose the SALT II treaty as negotiated, was a shattering blow to President Carter and the chances of ratification. As a pragmatic, middle-of-the-road Republican and

leader of the Senate's GOP, Baker adds credibility to the opposition, which until now has been centered on conservatives, militarists and left-over, cold-war warriors. At a well-attended news conference. Baker said:

"If the administration does not signal a willingness to consider amendments, and if the Soviet government does not desist in trying to threaten the Senate, then I will work dilligently and, I trust, effectively to defeat this treaty,"

Elephant Toys With Body

WOODLAND, Wash. (UPI) - A sex-crazed, six-ton bull elephant toyed with the battered body of his trainer Wednesday, keeping animal handlers at bay for eight hours while it repeatedly slammed the body to the ground. It was not known if the trainer, H. Morgan Berry, 68. was killed by the elephant, named Tonga, or died of a heart attack and fell near the animal.

A second bull elephant named Tai broke out of Berry's 80-acre exotic animal farm in the sparsely populated countryside for about half a day. He finally was sedated with tranquilizer darts and led groggily back to the compound, officials said.

"We are told this is the mating season for the bulls and they have sexual problems because of that," Cowlitz County Undersheriff Bill Stuart said, "so it is fairly dangerous" to handle the animals at the moment.



OPEC Oil Ministers Agree On Makeshift Price Hike

GENEVA, Switzerland (UPI) - OPEC oil producers today increased the base price of oil by 24 percent to \$18 per barrel and agreed to allow individual member countries to raise prices to a maximum of \$23.50 per

The OPEC members had increased the price of oil by 33 A communique issued after a three-day conference of OPEC oil ministers also said the organization will convene an extraordinary meeting if the U.S. dollar starts

If OPEC revenues erode because of a declining dollar. the oil ministers will consider shifting to a variety of world currencies instead of using the dollar on which to base oil

U.S. Doubles Refugees

TOKYO (UPI) — Leaders of the Big Seven industrial nations today pledged to accept more boat people from Vietnam - and President Carter announced the United States would double the number of refugees it admits each

"The response of the American people to the plight of the refugees has always been generous and I am confident that it will continue to be so," Carter said in a statement announcing the increase from 7,000 to 14,000 refugees accepted each month.

The United States today protested Israel's use of U.S.supplied F-15 jet fighters to shoot down Syrian warplanes over southern Lebanon, but Israel said it acted in legitimate self-defense.

Secretary of State Cyrus Vance sent a message to Prime Minister Menachem Begin through the U.S. ssy in Tel Aviv protesting the use of the planes which Israel promised to employ only for "legitimate selfdefense," Israel Radio said.

French Ambassador Beaten

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan (UPI) -- Assailants dragged the French ambassador and his first secretary from their car Tuesday and punched and kicked them for allegedly 'meddling'' in Pakistan's affairs, embassy sources said. French Ambassador Pol Le Gourrierec lost a tooth and First Secretary Jean Forlot was beaten unconscious in the attack along a road 30 miles outside Islamabad.



A Blessing In Disguise?

The difference between a recession and a depression, it has been suggested, is the difference between a person having the flu or double

Declining economic indicators recently have led to a lot of talk among economists about the country being in a recession or on the verge of entering one. And, although the economists still aren't in agreement on whether we are, in fact, coming down with the grippe, there is a consensus among them that, at the very least, we have a bad cold. Everyone seems to agree the economy is in a marked slowdown.

The Commerce Department just announced the nation's index of leading economic indicators took its sharpest plunge ever recorded in April. The 3.3 pointslide in the indicators was even larger than the 3 percent dip recorded in September, 1974, during the last big recession. Commerce also announced that new orders for manufactured goods dropped by \$9.1 billion, or 6.1 percent in April the sharpest monthly decline also in five years.

Declining retail sales are mirrored in a soft national market for housing and in slumping sales of automobiles and major appliances.

The longest economic expansion in our peacetime history is coming to an end principally because U.S. consumers have cut back drastically on everything but the most necessary purchases. The consumers, who account for more than twothirds of the gross national product, are leading the downturn. Consumers are pulling back because of a growing realization across the country that they have overextended themselves in debt, having been inspired by double-digit inflation to borrow and spend against cheapened dollars in the future. Repayment of installment debt declined by a whopping 5.4 percent in April because inflation is growing faster than the average personal income.

The inflation, which has been generated mostly by the government's monetary expansion through the spending, has discouraged savings and encouraged indebtedness. There is now an unprecedented total debt outstanding in the United States of more than \$4 trillion.

Thus the chief villain of the current economic slowdown is inflation, created largely by Washington and the chief rationale for excessive personal debt. But because economic laws exact a - biblical -retribution, the culprit will be punished. The U.S. Treasury will be penalized with far less tax revenues than anticipated in the budgetary process because of the econony's malaise. And this, in turn, will increase the federal deficit, which will stimulate even more inflation leading to another 1974-typel "stagflation" — a stagnant economy scourged by inflation.

Washington, therefore, as the author of our economic ills and the arbiter of our prospects, has a special obligation to act wisely. Congress and the administration must resist the predictable pressures for porkbarrel projects and a loosened monetary policy to ease the recessionary pain. The deficit in short must be controlled. But there are affirmative things to be done along with keeping a

tight grip on the treasury's spigot. The government can best stimulate a recovery by lifting its heavy hand off the economy — by drastically pruning regulations that tie down American businesses and cost them untold billions annually. In addition to deregulating the economy. the government can encourage the accumulation o capital, which alone can generate an expansion in economic growth and new jobs. This can be done through a downward revision in capital gains and other business taxes.

If Washington can follow these restraints and initiatives, it is just possible that this slowdown could be a disguised blessing that deflated the ballooning inflation and gave consumers a chance to get back on their feet without going through the wringer of a real recession.

WASHINGTON (NEA) - Although short supplies of gasoline and long lines at service stations are relatively recent developments, the die was cast more than a year ago for the latest manifestation of the continuing "energy crisis." Profligate consumers and indecisive federal regulators must bear a substantial part of the blame for the current gasoline shortage, but much of the responsibility lies with the

For reasons that never have been adequately explained, the oil companies last spring and summer allowed their inventories of the two most widely used refinery products - gasoline and heating oil - to sink to extraordinarily low

Was that imprudent "drawdown" the result of innocent bungling and inept management - or was it the product of a carefully contrived industry plan? To resolve that question, three federal departments and agencies now are conducting full-scale investigations.

The current crisis dates back to 1977, when the oil companies engaged in a massive inventory buildup as a hedge against two events they feared would occur in early 1978 - a nationwide coal strike and an OPEC price increase. The coal strike materialized but the OPEC price hike did not. Uneasy about retaining their oversized inventories, the oil companies drastically drew down their stocks.








VA Reverses Ruling, Will Mail Prescriptions Again

A Veterans Administration cost-cutting measure forcing some south Seminole disabled veterans to drive 10 miles to receive medication has been ordered halted and those veterans affected may again receive their medication by mail.

The policy was changed after one Casselberry veteran who is 90 percent disabled sent copies of a May 4 Evening Herald article to the offices of U.S. Senator Lawton Chiles, Congressman Bill Nelson and other elected officials. The officials checked into the matter and found the VA had overstepped its bounds in the halting of mailing services.

Casselberry, is listed as 90 percent disabled as a result of war wounds suffered while serving with the Army in 1943. He is afflicted with heart and nervous disorders and maintains he cannot survive without the medication he

Prior to April of this year, Yokely and other veterans in south Seminole county were able to receive their medication through the mail from the VA Outpatient Clinic in Orlando. However, when Yokely went to the mailbox to pick up his April medication, he found a memo from C.W. Silverblatt, chief of the outpatient clinic. The memo read: "Due to the limited staff and the large amount of prescription mailouts outside the Orlando

Orlando metropolitan area will be discontinued. You will be required to pick up your refills in the future. Exceptions to this rule will require written authorization by your attending physician."

Al Linscott, assistant clinic director, said when the directive was issued that he was aware it would "create inconvenience" for some veterans. But Linscott said the clinic was understaffed and did not have the time to prepare, package and mail the prescriptions. He said his staff could dispense the medication in about half the time if the disabled veterans would come to the clinic in per-

Linscott said the directive affected only veterans 10


