

City Commission Okays Treatment Plant Report

The City Commission Monday night, despite protests from Mayor Joe Baker that they were forcing the vote, accepted the preliminary report for a primary Sewage treatment plant for Sanford.

Engineers Leffler and Bush recommended that the city construct "immediately" a \$447,300 plant to pump four million gallons per day and take care of the projected needs of 40,000 persons.

The board agreed to submit federal forms requesting the allocation of funds to carry out the project and Leffler indicated that he would work on construction plans and specifications.

Mayor Joe Baker, after Leffler went through the lengthy comprehensive report said "I would like more time to study the possibility of a plant to take care of the needs of 30,000 instead of 40,000.

"I don't appreciate you all forcing the vote at this time." he declared.

Commissioner J. H. (Jimmy) Crapps also opposed the acceptance of the report saying "why not wait until we find out if the government will allocate funds for

Leffler estimated that he could have plans and specifications completed 130 days "after we get the okay from the state."

Earl Higginbotham, Tom Mc-Donald and Al Wilson called the plan well rounded and recommendations "sound."

Among the major recommendations in the 50 page report are that the city forward federal grant forms to the state department of Health for processing; Conferences be held with the

fiscal agent and other officials on methods of financing the plant; That the plant, to service 40,000 persons, be accepted as the most economical and feasible for the "ultimate development of San-

That construction of this plant

be undertaken at the earliest possible date to provide these facilities for the benefit of the city.

The engineers also recommended that the city adopt a policy which will allow industry to discharge their waste, to the municipal sewage system with proper charges for services and that ordinances be adopted to prohibit discharge of any material that would cause

damage to the system or treatment processes.

According to the report the 30,-000 population plant would seet \$379,600 while the one recommended would be \$447,300 and would be financed by a \$250,000 revenue certificate bond issue. The plant would be located on

the city's sanitary landfill area east of Mill Creek.
