MacDonald Happy And Confident That New Friendship Has Been Born Among Nations

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10.—The history-making visit of J. Ramsay MacDonald to Washington came to conclusion today with both the British Prime Minister and President Hoover radiantly happy and strongly confident that the past week here has witnessed the birth of a new Anglo-American friendship so healthy and so virile that nothing can shake it.

Charles Waggoner Is Given 15 Years

NEW YORK, Oct. 10. (INS)—Charles D. los Waggoner, president of the Bank of Telluride, Colo., today pleaded guilty to an indictment charging mail fraud in connection with victimizing six New York banks in \$500,000 swindle and was sentenced to 15 years in Atlanta penitentiary. He was given the maximum penalty, five years on each of the six counts in the indictment. On the first three counts the sentences are to run consecutively and on the last three counts they will run concurrently.
