William Elisha Davidson, 27, and his wife, Ella, 28, were taken into custody Sunday about 12 hours after they released the hostages. They were held in the Madison County jail in Rich-

mond, Ky., Sunday night, and were to be arraigned today, the FBI reported. Agents said they would be charged with kidnaping and interstate transportation of six persons.

The Davidsons offered no resistance when they were arrested. "They just gave up," said McCreary County

Sheriff Herman Hamlin. The sheriff said authorities set up roadblocks "on every dirt road in that country" Saturday night after members of a Miami Beach, Fla., family who had been held hostage pointed out the area of woods into

which the couple fled on foot. Hamlin said a search party of about 75 FBI, state and county officers began combing the area early Sunday morning. The Davidsons were captured shortly before noon.

Authorities said Davidson, armed with a shotgun, escaped from jail in Bartow, Fla. Friday morning, taking Deputy Sheriff Bruce Browning with him, and then took five members of the Mel Prine family captive Friday night.

WASHINGTON (AP) - Saying the results could be "very revealing," President Nixon's finance committee has asked congressional investigators to audit Sen. George McGovern's fund-raising records as closely as they did the Republicans'

"There must be no reluctance on the part of the General Accounting Office to pursue as vigorously with Sen. McGovern's staff the kind of investigation it has with the Finance Committee," committee chairman Maurice Stans

Fireman's Daughter Killed

The seven-year-old daughter f a Sanford fireman was killed in a Saturday night accident on SR 431 near Paola. It was the second car-train fatality of the year and brings the 1972 traffic death toll to 11 in Seminole

Toni Helman, of Rt. 1, was dead at the scene, according to Troopers Robert Lovering and L. (Tommy) Tomlinson. lustice of the Peace Robert Carroll served as coroner at the scene. The accident happened at 8:05 p.m.

The girl was a passenger in a 1969 Ford pickup truck driven by her father, Larry Elwood Helman, a fireman for the City of Sanford. Her mother, Linda Helman, 24, was also a passenger in the truck.

According to Lovering , the truck was southbound over the tracks when it was struck broadside by the eastbound Seaboard Coast Line freight train. The impact knocked the truck nearly 100 feet down the track and all passengers were ejected. The train engineer was William H. Cagle.

Mrs. Helman was flown to Florida Hospital by Herndon helicopter ambulance. 'Lifesaver One." She is reported in critical condition. Helman was treated and released at Seminole Memorial





The challenge comes at a most interesting time as our area is being recognized as a tourist Mecca. Almost every week, news is released showing that outside interests and outside dollars are showing their conviction of the bright future which Seminole-Orange faces under a bright tourist sun.

No one should need to be reminded of the Walt Disney World's impact as a magnet with increasing power to draw in visitors from all over the United States, indeed, the world.

Eunice Shriver Adds Personality

WASHINGTON - When she was a little girl, the Kennedy family used to say "Eunice should have been a boy." Eunice grew up to be a very attractive woman, but she never lost a tomboy's keen zest for tough competition. Any fight involving a Kennedy was automatically her fight.

Her brother John, to whom she was perhaps closest, once remarked to friends at the White House: "Sometimes I think Eunice should have this job instead

She frequently substituted for Jacqueline Kennedy as White House hostess during her brother's presidency. She is now ready to plunge into another campaign, this time at the side of her husband, R. Sargent Shriver, vice

presidential nominee of the Democratic Party. Mrs. Shriver and the vivacious and intelligent Mrs. George McGovern now add a dimension to the 1972 campaign that is worrying some Republican strategists. "We don't underestimate their appeal to women voters,"

acknowledged an official at the headquarters to reelect President Nixon. "They area attractive, energetic women and effective

"Of course, we have a couple of pretty effective gals, too, in Pat Nixon and Judy Agnew. The country won't forget what a beautiful job Mrs. Nixon has done as first lady and how she conducted herself on the trips to Peking and Moscow."

Mrs. Shriver promises to be a center of attention in the early days of the campaign. Her Kennedy background adds an element of excitement for many Democrats. Her strong resemblance to her slain brothers, John and Robert, gives her instant identification.

At 51, Eunice is the mother of five children (her oldest, Robert, is 18). She still plays touch football with them. A staunch Roman Catholic, she is vehemently opposed to abortion, an issue that McGovern is finding troublesome because of Catholic opposition to his oft-stated liberal views. She is also said to have strong opinions about legalization of marijuana. Her son Robert and the oldest son of the late Sen. Robert F. Kennedy were arrested two years ago on charges of possessing marijuana

She has preferred the political background since returning from Paris in 1969 where Shriver served as ambassador, but frequent visitors to the Shrivers' Timberlawn estate in suburban Maryland say her interest has never

Political Notebook A Look Behind the Kissinger Scenes

Dr. Henry Kissinger did not make his quickie trip to Saigon because of a breakthrough at the Paris peace talks It can be said with authority this meeting with President Thieu of South Vietnam had been arranged before Kissinger's secret session with Hanoi's Le Duc Tho in Paris. The Kissinger second-day meeting with Thieu, advertised as "unexpected," had also been arranged in

But recently captured documents reveal North Vietnamese commanders in the South have been ordered to make preparations for an early cease-fire. They are to divide their troops into two categories. One group would stay aboveground and available for movement back to whatever cease-fire lines are decided on. But selected cadre from each unit are to make prep-

arations for going underground, and to stay behind when "all" North Vietnamese troops officially march to the agreed cease-fire areas. At the same time, men close to the secret Paris talks say the North Vietnamese meeting with Kissinger in Paris have not modified their stiff surrender demands in

the slightest. They still insist on a coalition government dominated by Communists, an American-arranged throwout of Thieu, complete U.S. withdrawal from Indochina and an end to U.S. aid for Saigon. Mr. Nixon is still holding out against any give-in or face-saving compromise with Hanoi which would amount

to giving the Communists what they demand. But this Nixon determination may not last for long. Kissinger did discuss new possibilities with Thieu in Saigon. Time is running short before election day. Despite the public opinion polls showing him the heavy favorite. Mr. Nixon is nervous about November, remembering

Therefore Mr. Nixon has a choice to make. He may decide soon that any sort of a peace is better than no peace at all. He may decide to hold firm with his present course. He may attempt to straddle. Some men close to the White House believe that what Mr. Nixon does will be determined by Sen. George

McGovern's strength over the next month. If the South Dakotan's popularity rises sharply, and the electoral vote of key states seems in doubt, then Mr. Nixon, these men expect, will come up with new proposals more to Hanoi's The North Vietnamese seem to hold a similar view.

Hanoi's representatives abroad have informed associates and Communist leaders in Western Europe. Asia and else where they are convinced Mr. Nixon believes he must have a settlement by October to be absolutely sure of winning the presidential election in November. They have told these contacts in foreign lands they are going to wait Mr. Nixon out - wait for him to surrender to their demands with some face-saving "compromise" formula. The attitude of the North Vietnamese in the secret Paris sessions with Kissinger tends to confirm these reports. Le Duc Tho and his associates are tougher, more fixed in their attitudes even than in the past, if that is

Interestingly, it is not the cocky, almost sneering attitude of the sessions which followed Kissinger's trip to the Soviet Union. Then, the North Vietnamese were pa tronizing and offended Kissinger so deeply he found it most difficult to control his anger in private when he returned to the United States. The North Vietnamese are polite and courteous enough in these latest secret talks. But they are firm, and appear certain they will get their way in the end, or so it seems to some men close to

At first it was confine to four selected high crime areas, including Capitol Hill. comprising an area of 120 blocks and a residential population of about 30,000.

To date, 8,000 sodium vapor lights have been installed in the originally designated areas and other high crime areas. At the completion of the current program, 40,000 of Washington's 60,000 lights will be converted to sodium

In addition to the 30 per cent reduction in crime, the city fathers are happy to report that of the more than 17 million tourists who visit Washington every year, a much greater percentage is utilizing the streets at night than in the past. On some once-dangerous streets, people have been observed sitting at tables under the new lamps playing card games on a pleasant summer evening. At least one "mess in Washington" is being cleaned up.



Soda water is good for cleaning the top, too .- MRS. J. C


