# Illness Finally Takes Truman

KANSAS CITY (AP)—Harry S. Truman died today, conquered finally by the infirmities of age.  
The nation's 33rd president died at 8:50 a.m. EST. His wife and daughter were notified at their home.  
Truman was 88. (See Related Story, Photo, Pg. 12A)  
The hospital attributed death to the "complexity of organic failures causing a collapse of the cardio-vascular system."  
Truman entered the hospital three weeks ago today and had been in a coma since early Saturday.  
As his condition worsened Christmas Day, Truman's daughter, Margaret Truman Daniel, returned from her home in New York. She saw him for about 20 minutes Monday night.  
Death came quietly to the former president. Dr. Wallace Graham, his physician from the White House days, was at his side.  
A family spokesman, Randall Jessee, said the 87-year-old Mrs. Truman stood up well to the announcement.  
The former president will lie in state for 24 hours, beginning Wednesday at noon EST, in the rotunda of the library that houses the memorabilia of the Truman presidency. Burial will be at 4 p.m. EST Thursday at a spot on the library grounds visible from the window of Truman's long-time office.  
Truman had been vice president for only 82 days in the closing days of World War II, when he became president on the death of Franklin D. Roosevelt.  
During his eight years in the world's most powerful post, Truman set the United States against global communism, aiding countries that were threatened by the threat of Russian domination.  
One of the most momentous acts of his presidency was to order the dropping of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima.  
He returned to the solitude of the family home in Independence, spending the first decade after leaving the White House by lecturing on college campuses.  
He was 60 years old when he became president and was 69 when he left the capital in January 1953.  
His death leaves Lyndon B. Johnson as the nation's only living former president.  
The former president will be buried in the courtyard of the library, an imposing limestone structure less than a mile from his home.

# Sanlanta Problems Are Still Unsolved

The controversy over responsibility for proper drainage in a portion of Sanford's Sanlanta subdivision continues with the Federal Housing Administration insisting the problem of water standing in a partially completed street is not FHA's but between the city and Austin Development Corporation, the developer.  
John Taylor, supervisor of FHA's Orlando mortgage division, claims to have evidence the city has accepted the street and drainage in front of five houses on Valencia Court West.  
City Manager Warren E. Knowles maintains the section was never accepted and says he told FHA officials "we don't appreciate their lack of cooperation."  
The Herald sparked an FHAS investigation December 11 with inquiries to the federal agency on how it could sell the repossessed house at 815 Valencia Court West to Raymond Jones when the house had no city water service.  
FHA officials admitted advertising the house for sale and said Sanford realtor Jim Hunt "is innocent" because he was told by FHA the house was cleared and to sell it.  
FHA investigators found water standing in the street in front of the house just as complaining neighbors said it had after rains for a year.  
Friday, FHA officials reported the home sale to Jones has been completed.  
Water was again standing in the street in front of the five houses, four of which are now occupied.  
Jim Hunt said the city agreed to restore water service to the house at 815 Valencia Court West when a deposit was paid.  
Utility Department records indicate the deposit was paid Friday and Jones water service was restored in time for the holiday weekend.  
Taylor said FHA is concerned Friday, FHA officials

# Story Of Survival Is Told

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP)—Official sources confirmed today that survivors of an Andes plane crash had eaten the flesh of dead comrades to avoid starvation during a 69-day ordeal.  
The official source said 16 survivors, either players or boosters of an Uruguayan rugby team, had made a solemn pact that they would not discuss the matter until they returned to Montevideo, Uruguay, and then they would make a collective statement.  
Three have already returned to Montevideo. The other 13 have remained in Santiago to recover but plan to fly back to Montevideo in a day or two.  
The plane had 45 persons aboard when it hit an Andean peak Oct. 13. By the end of October, 29 were dead.  
There had been rumors that those who survived might have eaten human flesh to live through the bitter mountain blizzards, but the reports could not be substantiated until today.  
The sources said that one of the young men, not identified, compared the group's decision to use the cadavers as "similar to a heart transplant." His explanation: In a transplant operation a heart is taken from a person at death to maintain another's life, and in the same manner portions of bodies had been used to maintain the living.

# Two Dead, One Injured Shootings Are Probed

Seminole Sheriff's investigators today continued probes in three separate weekend shootings in which two women were killed and a third injured. (Related photos page 2A).  
Mrs. Christine Hunter, 32, 16 Hammond Drive, Apopka, was listed in satisfactory condition this morning at Florida Hospital, Orlando.  
Investigators said Mrs. Hunter was shot five times in the head with a small caliber pistol while she was in the laundry room of 8 Days Inn, Wymore Road at Interstate 4 Sunday afternoon.  
The woman's husband, Curtis Hunter, surrendered this morning to Apopka Police. Capt. L. J. Kriz said, and Kriz and detective Sgt. John Wright Jr. went to Apopka to return Hunter to Sanford to face a charge of assault with intent to commit murder.  
Capt. Kriz said there have been no arrests in the Monday shooting death of 50-year-old Ethel Mae Whitaker, Main Street, Midway.  
Sheriff's reports said the woman was shot in the side shortly after 8 a.m. in the back yard of her home. An autopsy performed this morning by medical examiner Dr. G. V. Garay showed death from internal hemorrhaging, according to Capt. Kriz.  
Samuel Whitaker, 53, told deputies he shot his wife accidentally while trying to shoot a dog that had been eating his chickens.  
Deputies recovered a .32 caliber revolver at the shooting scene.  
Investigators today reported recovery of a gun from a wooded area near Geneva where a 22-year-old woman was fatally shot early Saturday in her trailer home.  
Gary Douglas Morrison, 20, remained in County Jail today without bond charged with first degree murder in the death of his wife, Karen Gilbo Morrison. Officers said Morrison called authorities shortly after 1 a.m. Saturday and said "someone had murdered his wife."  
Responding deputies David Hall and Glen Trombley arrived at the Morrison trailer, located on Lake Harney Heights Road in an isolated area east of Geneva, and found Mrs. Morrison's body just inside the doorway.  
Authorities said the woman was shot at least one time in the head.  
A search of nearby woods and ponds for the death weapon turned up a gun but detective Sgt. Tony Calangelo, in charge of the investigation, today declined to reveal the type, or caliber, of the gun found.  
Morrison was arrested at his residence on a disorderly conduct charge early Saturday after he "began struggling with deputies." Several hours later Sgt. Calangelo charged Morrison with first degree murder in his wife's death.

# Affects 5,600 Dwellings Sanford's 'Big Inch' Sewer Shelved

East Central Florida Regional Planning Council's lack of certification has caused Sanford's application for federal sewer construction funds to be shelved.

City officials said today the city may have to fund the \$200,000 "Big Inch" interceptor project entirely with local funds if the planning council doesn't soon receive certification from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for an environmental impact study required with the city's funding application.

At stake is up to 50 percent of the "Big Inch" project costs.

The 24 inch gravity sanitary sewer interceptor line is slated for construction from the city's treatment plant on Lake Monroe through Goldsboro to a point north of 26th Street before June along an old railroad right of way.

City Manager Warren E. Knowles said he was "shocked" when he learned the planning agency that covers the central Florida area isn't certified by HUD to make environmental impact studies.

"We had hoped to get up to \$30,000 in federal funds for the Big Inch but now it looks like we'll have to foot all the bill locally if the planning council isn't certified soon," Knowles said.

Knowles said the situation could have "a drastic effect on central Florida cities applying for federal funding."

Knowles said the Sanford application was shelved because the planning agency isn't certified. Federal officials say funds are available, he said, but not until the planning agency is certified.

Knowles said the "Big Inch" line will serve over 5,600 new dwelling units planned or under construction in the planned unit developments of Carriage Cove and Hidden Lake in the city's southwestern sector.

"We may have to use all local funds for the project," Knowles said. This way the environmental impact study won't be required.

Engineering on the "Big Inch" is complete and ready to advertise to contractors for bids.

Construction time is estimated between three and six months.

"I believe we can still meet our June commitment date to developers," Knowles said this morning as he tried by telephone to find out where the planning council's application for re-certification is lodged in the bureaucratic maze.

He said HUD Jacksonville officials said the council's application is in their office for review and no date for certification is available.

"This means cities in the region are hampering in efforts to get federal funds until the agency is certified," Knowles said.

## Beltline Priority Is 'Eyed'

Definite suspicion of the priorities in location of construction of the various aspects of the inter-county beltline to go through portions of Seminole, Orange and Osceola Counties was registered by the Board of County Commissioners Tuesday. Particularly looked at with a jaundiced eye by the five Seminole County officials was the fact the construction will take place under the umbrella of the Orlando-Orange County Expressway Authority composed of all resident Orange County people.

James Green of the Authority and Elroy Hoffman, authority attorney, assured that the State Department of Transportation will make all final decisions on the location of the expressway and that the Authority will make only technical decisions. Hoffman indicated further that the construction of the entire route of the beltline will be done simultaneously. Hoffman admitted, however, that three alternative routes for the beltline exist.

Upon professional engineering advice will be recommended by the authority.

Assistant County Attorney Howard Marsee looked askance at the necessity for Seminole County to "give" its power of eminent domain to the authority for the purpose of the condemnation of Seminole lands for the beltline. He is checking the legality of the county transferring this power. Marsee also questioned several points in a proposed contract among the three counties with the authority and differences including an agreement whereby the county would pledge its gasoline tax revenue. The attorney said the county should receive assurance these funds will be used only for construction on the Seminole County portion of the beltline. Marsee also argued that a method of arbitrating disputes be included in the contract.

Green said the agreement will be used as a basis for the DOT to do a study of the feasibility of the beltline and to determine the route of the expressway. Green mentioned the cost of the study at \$125,000 to \$150,000. The Authority board member said no county or governmental entity can build the authority without the cooperation of all three counties.

## Commission Sells City Lot For \$31,000

Sanford City Commissioners voted Tuesday 4-1 to sell a city-owned lot at Myrtle Avenue and Seminole Boulevard to local real estate man William Kirk for \$31,000.

The action came after four weeks of controversy and two former city commission candidates opposed the sale.

Voting against the motion by commissioners John Morris and A. A. McClanahan to sell the "log cabin" lot to Kirk was commissioner Gordon Meyer.

Meyer, who unsuccessfully tried to get the sale tabled two weeks ago, said he feels "at this point the city shouldn't be rushed to sell the lot."

"An overall lakefront development plan is needed so individual developers can coordinate their efforts," Meyer stated. "This would be more beneficial to the city."

Kirk must start construction of a 21,700 square foot, two-story office building on the lot no later than April 1 or the property will revert to the city, commissioners said.

Morris said, in his opinion, the sale is in the best interests of citizens and will serve to set the pace for lakefront development and broadening of the city's tax base.

Two unsuccessful candidates in the recent city election opposed the sale of the lot.

Mrs. Stella Westhouse presented petitions with 178 signatures objecting to "piecemeal" sale of city-owned lakefront property and asking commissioners to plan for future lakefront development.

Harry Skop, joined by public housing tenant organizer Alfred Delattibaudiere, called the sale "a crime" and demanded commissioners table any action.

Delattibaudiere claimed the property (less than an acre) will triple in value in the next few years.

Mayor Lee Moore indicated the proceeds from this and other recent city property sales could be used to match federal funds to remedy Sanford's \$4 million citywide drainage problem.

"I'd rather put 25 new jobs in the city now than hold the lot for another 10 years," Moore said. Kirk says the unnamed corporation he'll lease the office building to will provide the jobs for local people.

The law firm of Stenstrom, McIntosh and Davis withdrew an offer of \$40,000 for the lot before the commission session.

Attorney Douglas Stenstrom had proposed to build a multi-story office building on the lot.

Winter Park developer J. W. Hickman had bid \$33,000 for the lot. Tuesday he urged the city to abandon the northernmost block of Myrtle Avenue to add more square footage to the lot and have it re-appraised and re-bid.

Commissioners turned down the suggestions.

## County Seeking Southern Annex

Negotiations are to get underway between County Commissioner John Kimbrough and principals of the Casseberry Land Company on the possible lease-purchase by the county of the land company offices for a branch courthouse annex at the intersection of U.S. 17-92 and Triplett Drive in Casseberry.

Kimbrough was authorized to proceed with the negotiations while consideration is being given to the proposal from the land company to lease the office facilities at a cost of \$1.95 per square foot for 3,000 feet or \$6,000 annually. Also being considered is the offer from Seminole Plaza to lease a new building to be constructed between the theatre and the National Fabric Store at a cost of \$4 per square foot.

The Commissioners appeared to favor the land company offer because of its excellent location and availability to South Seminole County residents.

In another matter, the board unanimously adopted a resolution directed to the Department of the Army and the General Services Administration indicating its interest in purchasing, when it is declared surplus, the 243 acres of land adjoining the county's Osceola property. The land was used by the U.S. Army for an outdoor training facility and has now been declared "excess."

Assistant County Attorney Howard Marsee said if the land is declared surplus there is a good chance it can be acquired by the county for little or no cost. Its contemplated use is for public parks, wildlife conservation or any one of several other recommended projects.

County Commissioner Chairman Greg Drummond and County Planner David Farr pointed out the county some time ago when attempting to gain control of the land, proposed its use as a sanitary landfill with eventual reclamation as a tree farm and wildlife preserve.

## Animal Controls; Commission Topic

Representatives of all six Seminole County cities were invited to discuss animal control problems with the Board of County Commissioners Tuesday and the ways the county can assist the municipalities. But as the scheduled discussion time at 12:30 p.m. came and went yesterday only an empty meeting room, devoid of city representatives, greeted the board.

Nevertheless, the board discussed the possibility of a county-wide animal control program, if the cities wish, with a centralized dog catching and retention service. County Commissioner Chairman Greg Drummond suggested this is one area in which the seven governmental units could cooperate to provide better service for all the citizens.

It was noted it would be necessary for the cities and the county to have a uniform ordinance and the estimated \$80,000 to \$100,000 annual cost could be defrayed by remittance to the county of all dog licensing fees.

Drummond said the operation would probably run slightly in the red, but in this instance he would not be averse to the county subsidizing operation. The chairman said it would not be proper, in his view, to raise costs of dog licensing since those who are following the law would then be penalized for those breaking the law, apparently referring to the fact unlicensed dogs, for the most part, are causing the problem.

Commissioner John Kimbrough, however, insisted theoretically those who own dogs are causing the problem and increase in licensing fees would pay for the program.

Since no municipal officials were present, no affirmative action could be taken. The county will continue to provide retention facilities at a boarding fee of \$1.50 per day, per dog and a \$3 disposal charge. Longwood and Winter Springs are both involved currently in this program and indication was that Altamonte Springs is also interested.

Tuesday I visited the scenes of two traffic accidents involving trains. The first was by far the worst, with over \$50,000 property damage. The second accident is the one that bothers me.

It occurred at the crossing on Airport Boulevard at the entrance to the Sanford Airport. With more and more business at the Airport, that road is heavily traveled, yet this is another unprotected crossing.

According to investigating Trooper C. L. (Tommy) Tomlinson, the train had stopped on the road, and there were no flares out and no lights on the car sitting across the roadway.

So along comes a car and slams into the train. After the investigation, the trainmen went about their job of switching cars at the airport.

Through the misfortune of locking myself out of my car, I stayed at the crossing a little longer than was planned. What I witnessed was just plain unbelievable.

That same train came back across the road and stopped, same place, and still not a fair light in sight. You'd think they would have learned the first time.

What I would like to know, is why can't the engineers of the train be charged in that accident. Maybe if this was done a few times, they would would break out that case of flares and use them.

In talking with one of the people that lives near the crossing, I learn that this switching, in the dark, goes on all the time. When will it stop? Certainly not before someone gets killed.
