





Presidential Proclamation


KEY BISCAYNE, Fla. (AP)

- President Nixon proclaimed Thursday as a national day of mourning for former President Harry S. Truman and directed that flags on all federal buildings and facilities be displayed at half staff for the next 30 days. The President's proclamation was issued about an hour after Truman's death was announced

in Kansas City. Nixon recommended that "the people assemble on that day in their respective places of worship, there to pay homage to the memory of President Truman..."


DEAR CHICKEN: I'd buy my husband's prescription.

After my last diaper bag fell apart I bought a duffel bag and have found it much more satisfactory.-JANET

DEAR POLLY-There are many ways Una Mae can use those old plastic flowers she hates to throw away Break the individual flowers from the stem and use them for gift wrapping, on a pipe cleaner handle on a nut cup. or as parts of a collage picture. Sprays of such flowers can also be used for bedroom or nursery curtain tie-backs.

DEAR POLLY-Una Mae could make Flemish florals with the old plastic flowers she does not want to throw away. Thoroughly wash the flowers and then rinse well. Allow them to dry overnight as one drop of water will spoil the finished effect. Tie about 12 inches of cord to each stem. Prepare the following mixture in a large deep container such as a big coffee can. One pint light oak gloss varnish, one pint turpentine, one teaspoon dry gold dust powder-stir well. Dip dry plastic flowers, one at a

A National Water Commission created by Congress four years ago to study federal water policies is challenging a concept that has been fundamental in the development of the American

In its preliminary report the commission suggests the time is past when the federal government should subsidize irrigation projects and development of inland waterways. Farmers who use water from future irrigation developments, the commission declared, should pay the full cost of providing it. Shippers whose boats and barges ply our rivers and canals should pay for channelization and other improvements and

At a time when the nation is looking for ways to scale back the cost of federal government and its role in the economy, these proposals are sure to fall on receptive ears. The issue should not be approached only in terms of an item in the federal; budget, however. The question is whether the principle on which the federal role in water development has been based for three quarters of a century has lost its validity.

The old principle is that there is a general benefit to the public at large from water projects as well as a direct benefit to farmers or shippers, and that federal funding is thus justified. There is no doubt that the principle has held true in the past. While covered wagons and six-guns may have won the West, ploughs and shovels made much of it worth winning after adoption of the Federal Reclamation Act in 1902. It is hard to estimate how many cities and towns in 16 western states owe their existence to that land-

U.N. Takes Realistic Stand

DESPITE propaganda blasts from Russia and Cuba, the General Assembly of the United Nations finally voted to reduce the U.S. budget assessment to 25 per cent.

Soviet Ambassador Jacob Malik was resumptuous enough to tell us how we should spend our money, crying that the assessment

should be increased on an ability-to pay basis. Totally ignored is the fact that the U.S. has consistently contributed 40 per cent of funds craised voluntarily for humane projects outside the regular U.N. budget. The Soviet Union never

contributed more than 5 per cent. With East and West Germany expected to be admitted, the international organization should be able to make up the difference from them. Besides, 25 per cent is adequate for any one nation, unless Malik would prefer a system of weighted voting based on the amount of financial

Expanded Waterway Use Urged

The Maritime Administration foresees an intercit freight crisis before the decade ends, but says the longneglected domestic segment of the American merchant marine can be made ready to steam to the rescue.

Economists project an increase of between 50 per cent and 100 per cent in the total transportation needs of the United States within the next 10 years and mounting pressures are expected on domestic systems - waterborne, rail and motor.

Wallace T. Sansone of the agency says the general publi is not aware of the impending crisis in rail and motor freight. "Their capacity has been fully utilized and, as a result greater financial and physical operating perblems have plagued these carriers to meet the growing demands of increased freight movements," he said.

"The dramatic growth of intercity freight movements in recent years and the decline in the percentage of these movements by water has contributed to the burden of the U.S. transportation network.

In 1939, the waterways carried 43 per cent of the total of 786 billion ton-miles of intercity freight. In 1970, they carried only 29.6 per cent of 2,293 billion. Of the other major carriers, one dropped substantially

over the 31-year period and the other nearly tripled its percentage of the haul. Rails fell from 43.1 per cent in 1939 to 33.5 per cent in 1970; trucks went from 6.8 per cent to 18 per cent in the same period.

been underrutilized for several decades is cest able to provide the future transport capacity required. Its vast waterway system which comprises some 25,000 miles of navigable channels is for the most part uncongested and amenable to increaded traffic flows."

The Maritime Administration official noted the enrironmental advantages of waterborne transport. Pointing out that this capacity could be expanded "without requiring highway, truck or pipeline construction which oftentimes has undesirable social and ecological effects," he said:

"Recent studies show that water transport has the lowest over-all effect on the environment when based on per tonmile of goods moved. Noise levels of vessels when compared to the movement of goods by trucks or train are 75 per cent lower. Other results show that ships produce 33 per cent less air pollutants than diesel trains and 373 per cent less than diesel trucks, when compared on a basis of ton-miles per



Brookings specialists seemed to agree with the proposition that, for all its loss of dominance, America is no "helpless giant" and can still, if it only will,

The compulsions toward the continued growth of international trade appear great. The energy crisis is forcing many countries, including the United States, to reach far for resources which underpin modern industrial eco-

It is a one-way street, with almost all the benefits going to the exploiter, very little to the exploitee, and that into the hands of a corrupt few. It is time, says this school, for the exploiting nations to share their wealth with those

Animal Controls; Commission Topic

By DONNA ESTES

Representatives of all six Seminole County cities were invited to discuss animal control problems with the Board of County Commissioners Tuesday and the ways the county can assist the municipalities. But as the scheduled discussion time at 12:30 p.m. came and went yesterday only an empty meeting room, devoid of city representatives, greeted the board. Nevertheless, the board discussed the

possibility of a county-wide animal control program, if the cities wish, with a centralized dog catching and retention service. County Commissioner Chairman Greg Drummond suggested this is one area in which the seven governmental units could cooperate to provide better service for all the citizens. It was noted it would be necessary for the cities

and the county to have a uniform ordinance and the estimated \$80,000 to \$100,000 annual cost could be defrayed by remittance to the county of all dog licensing fees.

Drummond said the operation would probably run slightly in the red, but in this instance he would not be averse to the county subsidizing operation. The chairman said it would not be proper, in his view, to raise costs of dog licensing since those who are following the law would then be penalized for those breaking the law, apparently referring to the fact unlicensed dogs, for the most part, are causing

Commissioner John Kimbrough, however, insisted theoretically those who own dogs are causing he problem and increase in licensing fees would pay

Since no municipal officials were present, no affirmative action could be taken. The county will continue to provide retention facilities at a boarding fee of \$1.50 per day per dog and a \$3 disposal charge. Longwood and Winter Springs are both involved currently in this program and indication was that Altamonte Springs is also interested.

The family spokesman said they would visit Mrs. Truman at home. The President planned to leave Independence immediately afterward, but Johnson may remain for the funeral Thursday. The family still has not announced the guests invited for the funeral nor the pallbearers, but apparently they will be mostly intimates of the Truman's.

A memorial service is scheduled in Washington's National Cathedral at 11 a.m. Jan. 5 after Congress begins its new session.

Truman's sister, Mary Jane Truman, will not be able to attend his funeral because she is recovering in Research Hospital from a broken hip. She will watch the activities on television. Mrs. Truman had asked that original plans for up to five days of ceremony be shortened.

"We felt unjustified to add to her strain," the family spokesman said. "We wanted to avoid as much strain on her as possible. He noted that Mrs. Truman had spent 16 hours
