Longwood will help with water leaks By Bill Korne STAFF WRITER LONGWOOD - Residents of Longwood with a water leak will soon receive help from the City. The City is adopting a new water leak policy to provide relief to customers with a leak that can lead to excessive wa-

do have legitimate water leaks on their property," City Administrator John Drago said. This will grant them some re-

To be eligible for relief, customers with a leak must have been in good standing at the same address where the leak has occurred for at least the previous 12 months. The leak must be repaired within one

The city will review the customer's previous 12-month consumption history to determine the average water consumption. The City will use the average consumption rate to determine the customer's

average consumption.

If the customer's bill after the leak is within 10 percent of the customer's average to confirm that the leak has been repaired, the City will provide a credit adjustment equal to the difference between the excessive consumption and the average consumption rate for

the previous 12 months.

If the customer's newer bill is excessive due to the water consumed by the leak, the City will provide an adjustment equal to the difference between the excessive bill and the customer's average sewer bill for the previous 12 months.

Customers will be provided with a credit adjustment for a maximum of one billing period per occurrence. Customers can apply for an adjustment

due to a leak on the customer side of the meter or service line a maximum of once per year, or twice within ten years.

The City Commission approved the water leak policy on Monday, making it retroactive for Jayne Sims, who had an \$820 water bill in February that she claimed to be the city's mistake.

Street paving moves ahead

LONGWOOD - The City of Longwood is moving forward with a street paving project and renovations on the Com-

The City's Historical Preservation Board selected a plan for renovating the Community Building that has parking on both sides of Wilma Street.

According to the Board, the use of the building should be limited to social and professional activities, and limited recreational activities.

"We haven't decided on a design," Drugo said. "They have decided on a footprint that shows more parking on both sides of the street, and more use of the Community Build-

The next step in renovating the Community Building will be to request design proposals. Drago said people probably won't see the new renovations take effect until October.

The Historical Preservation Board unanimously recommerided that the City Commission seek architectural proposais for a new community building in the Historical Dis-

We are planning to renovate the existing Community Building," Drago said, "Unless we find an alternate site."

The City Commission on Monday also approved a street paving design with traffic calming and speed reduction

techniques. "Some of the streets will be modified," Drago said. "We'll put the designs out for bid."

Maloy disappointed that only 42 apply for manager's job

SEMINOLE COUNTY - Resumes from 37 men and 5 women seeking the Seminole County Manager's position have been given to the county attorney from an independent recruiting firm in Norcross, Ga. There has been no screening of the candidates.

Jim Marino, the county's Director of Public Works and Jack Wert, the county's Tourism Development Director are among the applicants. So is Kevin Grace, who lives in Longwood and was once the county's deputy man-

Other applicants include Winter Springs manager Jim McLemore and Henry Dollve, an Ohio administrator who made the short-list for the Sanford city manager's job a year ago. Applications also were received from officials in Paducah, Ken.; Oakland, Calif; Mission Viejo, Calif.; Yuma, Artz.; Orand Rapids, Mich. and Las Vegas, Nevada.

County Commissioner Grant Maloy said he was disappointed that only 42 names were received. "I anticipated double that," he said. You would think there would be many more

applicants for a job paying \$120,000 a year."

Maloy said that he considered the appointment of a successor to Gary Kaiser was one of the chief duties the Board of Commissioners has before it. Kaiser left public service on April 2 to become president and CEO of HTE. Inc. in Lake Mary.

The next step in the process is for County Attorney Bob McMilian, who is off this week. to arrange a meeting by a three-man committee consisting Altamonte Springs manager Phil Penland, Orange County administrator Ajit Lalchandani and retired executive Owen Wentworth.

The committee will recommend the top half dozen candidates to the Board of Commissioners. Those candidates will be brought in for interviews.

The process will take a month or two. In that time. Cindy Coto is serving as the Acting County Manager. Coto did not apply for the permanent position. Coto and Grace were deputy managers at

the end of Ron Rabun's tenure as county manager. Not long after Kaiser moved up from Public Safety Director to Manager, he eliminated Grace's position. Upon leaving Seminole, Grace became the Edgewater, Fla. manager, and is now in private business in Orlando. Having been a dep-







Something was bothering the women as they made their way to Jesus' tomb on Easter morning to anoint the body with spices.

Who will roll us away the stone?" they asked among themselves.

It was a good question.

Mary Magdalene had been at the tomb on Friday afternoon when the huge stone was placed in front of the grave. She could vouch for the fact that it was too big for three women to move.

The surprising thing is that these friends of Jesus, knowing what they were up against, made up their minds to take the journey anyway.

Of course, when they got there, they found that their worries were needless. Somebody --was it an angel?-- had rolled the stone away.

They never would have known this, however, if they had decided it was no use, under the circumstances, to make the trip and had stayed home instead. They would have missed being the first to hear the greatest news ever to reach the ears of mankind: "He is not here; he is risen."

Easter is our best reason for not giving up -- no matter how unpromising the outlook in our lives.

A huge stone may be blocking us from what we most desire in life. As we look at our situation "realistically." there may seem to be no possibility that it can change for the better.

As far as we can see, there is nobody who can "roll us away the stone."

But those who know the Easter story will remind themselves that there is an angel presence in our lives which can not only "roll us away the stone" and unmask our fears as faithless fancies, it can also grant us even more than we wished for.

The women were willing to settle for an open tomb. When they got there, they found an empty tomb as well. He who gave meaning and joy to their lives and was the fulfillment of their highest dreams for themselves was no longer dead but alive.

The same glad Easter tidings are ours today: "He lives, our kind, wise, heavenly Friend.

And there is more. *Because I live, ye shall live

also," says Christ. This can mean many things. But it surely means that the God who raised Jesus to new life will do the same for us today -- that the God who re-

stored the broken hopes and

broken dreams of the women

will restore our broken hopes

and broken dreams.

Surely it means that if we, like the women, never lose sight of our highest dreams and pursue them resolutely -in good times and bad, through thick and thin, even In the absence of any encouraging signs -- we will see those dreams, though they may sometimes appear to be dead -- come to glorious life.






Blanton was a key member of the Seminole staff during his freshman and sophomore years, but hean't seen much action the past two seasons because of physical problems.





WIN AT BRIDGE

The fastest gun in the East


Who is the fastest declarer? There are a few candidates — Martin Hoffman and Jeff Meckstroth come to Hoffman and Jeff Meckstroth come to mind — but my vote goes to Alan Sontag, from Gaithersburg, Md. He won the Bermuda Bowl world championship in 1963, and has many national titles. Almost before the dummy has appeared, he's off and running. (Sensible defenders request a timeout because their neurons don't move at the relativistic velocities of Sontag's.) the relativistic velocities of Sontag's.) Sometimes, though, speed is danger-ous. How did Sontag go down in three no-trump?

Sontag's two-no-trump rebid showed a balanced 23-24 points. True, he had only 22 high-card points, but that good five-card suit and all those aces and kings made the hand noticeably stronger.

After winning with the heart king, declarer cashed his top diamonds, getting the bad news. He continued with the club king: 10, three, ace. Back came a heart, West correctly unblocking the 10 to keep communication with his partner. Sontag led a spade to dummy's ace, called for a club and, playing the odds, finessed his nine. West won with his jack, cashed the diamond queen, and reverted to hearts: two down. After winning with the heart king.

two down.

Unlucky, yet suppose declarer plays a spade to dummy's ace at trick two, followed by a club toward his hand. Here, if East wins with the ace, South unblocks the nine and has 10 tricks: two spades, two hearts, two diamonds and four clubs. If East ducks, declarer switches to diamonds, building nine tricks via two spades, two hearts, four diamonds and one club. Finally, if the clubs are unfavorable, the contract still makes if diamonds are 2-2.

ASK DR. GOTT

Nothing wrong with masturbation

DEAR DR. GOTT: I wish to inform you that masturbation is harmful. I find that medical doctors are poorly informed about the consequences of this act, which can lead to mental and physical destruction. I practiced veterinary medicine for 30 years before taking a job in a state hospital for the insane. I saw talented adults and healthy animals become skin and healthy animals become skin and bones because they used all their

DEAR READER: Nonsense. I hope you were taking care of insane ani-mals, not humans. Otherwise, you should have been a resident, not a staff member. DEAR DR. GOTT: I have been diag-

nosed with painful calcium deposits in my Achilles' tendon. I'm 73. What can I do?

DEAR READER: You have at least five options:

 Ignore the condition and use heat, heel pads and cushioned shoes. 2. Try over-the-counter pain med-ication, such as ibuprofen. A few days of treatment may reduce your discomfort and allow you a freer range of motion. In my experience, however,

you will eventually need professional

attention.

3. Ask your doctor to prescribe antiinflammatory drugs — such as Motrin, Lodine or Voltaren — that may reduce the pain and irritation.

4. Have a cortisone injection into the painful deposit. This procedure is considered routine by most orthope-dic surgeons and is usually quite effective when oral medication doesn't work.

5. Have the calcium removed. This form of surgery is ordinarily the last resort, because it is expensive, a nuisance and (for awhile) painful. Nonetheless, removal of calcium spurs may enable you to remain independent, active and pain-free for many more years.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am periodically hard of hearing. At these times, I hold my nose, close my mouth and blow hard. This causes an audible click — and my hearing returns. What should

DEAR READER: Your periodic hearing loss seems to be due to a mal-function of the ears' venting mecha-nism, the two tiny Eustachian tubes that connect the middle-ear chambers to an area behind the nose. These tubes serve to equalize pressure between the outside world and the closed compartments of the middle ear. When the Eustachian tubes remain closed, pressure alterations make hearing difficult, as happens during decompression in airplane flights. I urge you to see an ear-nose-and-throat specialist; his or her advice would benefit you tremendously.
