All He Needs Is A Horse To Ride, Carry Supplies

Bob Seney left Texas in September, traveling around the United States. He is going to Canada — and he expects to be there "the first part of July, if all goes well." He probably could get there faster, but Seney prefers the transportation which has already carried him through th states once - a horse to ride and a horse to carry

supplies.
"This is my second time riding through the states," Seney explains in a quiet voice. He has stopped alongside U.S. 17-92 in Sanford and is trying to prevent his horses from nibbling at daisies growing wild through the cement front of an old parking lot.

"Florida is the 19th state I've been in this second time

Drug Thieves Got Vials Of Poison, Too

TAMPA (UPI) - The thieves who stole drugs and syringes from Thornton aboratories in a New Year's Eve burglary took 30 vials of deadly experimental posticide which may prove fatal to unknowing drug

"It's extremely concentrated and extremely toxic," a police spokesman said Thursday after an inventory revealed the

pesticides were missing.

He said police fear the pesticides may be taken unknowingly by drug users, either orally or by injection and said very small quantities would be fatal.

Minimum Marriage Age

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) - Two legislators have filed a bill to correct a mistake by the 1977 Legislature, which inadvertently wiped out a law setting minimum age requirements for marriage.

Reps. Betty Easley, R-Largo, and Fred
Burrall, R-Port Charlotte, said Thursday they
will file the bill next week to set 18 as the legal age for marriage without parental consent.

Kids Get OK in Pool Hall

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) - The Florida Supreme Court has thrown out a 1975 law making it illegal for the owner of a pool hall to let in youths under 21 unless he has their parents' written consent, or they are accompanied by their parents, a member of the Armed Forces or married.

"There can be no rational basis for per-mitting a bowling alley containing pool tables and a cocktail lounge to admit minors without complying with the restrictions...while subjecting a neighboring billiard parlor serving no alcoholic beverages to penalty," wrote Justice Alan Sundberg in the unanimous





Curbing D.C.'s Appetite

Conservatives may be dismayed now that. President Carter has given up his pledge to balance the federal budget in 1981. But surely the correct response should be: so what size is new?

The vow to balance the budget was Mr. Carter's way of appealing to those who believe that the federal budget should be run like a household budget, that income and outgo should matchup.

In fact, the key to what the government is doing, and thus the test for fiscal conservatism, in the deficit the test for fiscal conservatism,

isn't the deficit but the take of the government

And the take is measured by not only how much the government brings in, by taxing and borrowing, to finance its budgetary outlays, but also how much it borrows through off-budget agencies and how much it effectively taxes

business through regulation.

The Washington Mr. Carter arrived in last January had an appetite of its own for the dollars of

the private sector.

The government then was taxing and borrowing 24 percent of GNP to finance the 1977 budget. It was borrowing another 4 percent of GNP that is not reflected in the budget, such as support for the Federal Financing Bank and Postal Ser-

And, though the figures here can't be known exactly, it was costing the private sector billions through regulation; the steel industry alone spent \$1 billion on pollution controls mandated by the

Mr. Carter, of course, has only increased the government's appetite. In late April, Mr. Carter asked Congress, in

effect, to shave another 5 percent off the GNP through energy and higher Social Security taxes, and Congress is well on its way toward obliging

Mr. Carter also has learned how to go "off-budget" to finance federal liabilities. Henry Kaufman of Salomon Brothers estimates that offoudget borrowing will go up by \$6.6 billion this year, an increase of 26 percent over 1977. And as for Carter-inspired redtape: there's the anti-strip-

mining legislation for example.

It is on this total role of government that Mr. Carter now should direct his attention if his promise to balance the budget wasn't merely a political ploy but also a sign of some innate fiscal

The percentage of the federal budget relative

So does the amount the government is borrowing through its off-budget agencies. And so does the cost to business because of federal regulation.

There are ways of doing all these things, and Mr. Carter is doing some of them. He's proposing a tax cut, and he's four-square behind the idea of deregulating the airline industry. A truly frontal attack on the problem, however,

would increase dramatically the size of the proposed tax cut, to keep the government from raking off still more of the GNP through the invisible instruments of the progressive tax rate and If Mr. Carter begins to move on some of these

fronts, we'll be the first to call him fiscal respon-

Anyone can talk of balancing the budget, as Mr. Carter has discovered, but it's going to take a great deal of political courage to perform the surgery on government that now is necessary.






