Solons Should Know U.S. Heckles Public

Congressional investigations, once newsworthy in the U: S., apparently are here to stay.

The time apparently is past when congressmen can go to Washington and transact public business without first naming at least a dozen committees and 24 subcomittees to in-

Some investigations are needed. About 99 per cent could be eliminated, however, The only result of such elimination would be a tremendous saving of tax money. This, of course, would meet favor with only several millions of Americans.

The height of investigative work came in the last session of Congress, when investigators decided to investigate the necessity of so many investigations. Just what this investigation revealed is debatable. Regardless of recommendations, the investigations continue.

Now comes the climax. On Monday, congressional investigators launched an inquiry to find out if the government is beckling the public with a lot of repititious ques-

If the men in Washington must spend tax funds to find out the answer to this question, the U.S. in represented very poorly in the Senate and House.

According to a statement which accompanied the announcement of the probe launching, congressmen "suspect there is considerable duplication" in the gathering of offi-

The average businessman in Sanford knows the government "hecklea" the public. This is true not only in the gathering of statistics, but in the keeping of records and in doing Uncle Sam's bookkeeping.

Many businesses expend considerable sums to answer questions and compile information for the federal government. Now, the people will have to foot the bill of an investigation aimed at finding out if this really is true.

One might wonder where our congressmen have been in the past few years. The obvious answer, of course, is that many have been on tax-paid jaunts to foreign lands. The U. S. has so few problems that we have plenty of time to decide what is best for other peoples.

It has been suggested that the government pay for the time and affort put forth in record-keeping by business firms, when the sole benefactor is the government.

Based on past performances, most businessmen prefer to do it for free. At the rate the U. S. spends money, the public couldn't afford it.






