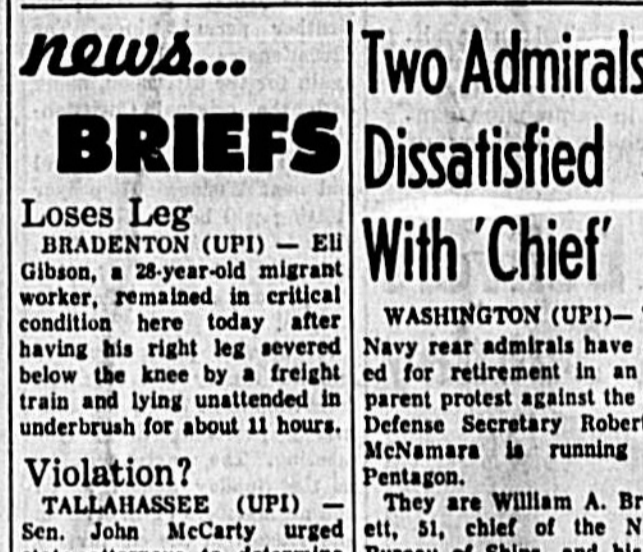

"I feel like six mills is necessary," he said. "We have to do more than we have in the past to meet the minimum requirements of the state in regard to our schools."

"There is no substitute for quality education in this or any other area in Florida. We must provide funds for adequate facilities and teachers' salaries and a great number of other needs of our schools. Five property owners may vote on the millage.

Five persons are seeking three trustee posts, incumbent are Roy E. King, Fred W. Wallace and Marvin J. Hunt, Sr. They will be elected on Nov. 2.

George Tully, another civic leader, also declared his support for the six mills sought by the school board.

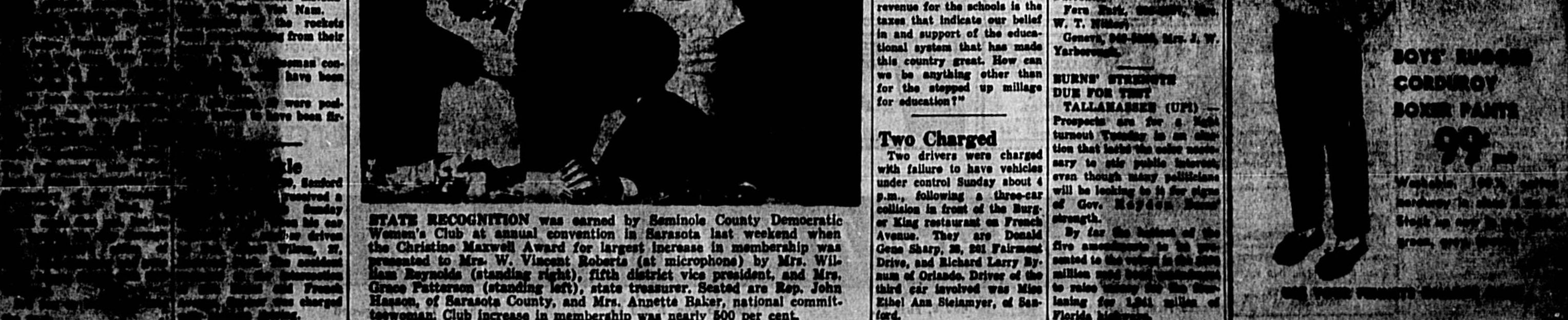
