

Cards Down Braves As Dodgers Win, Maintaining 3 1/2 Game Lead

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 2. (AP)—Mort Cooper pitched his 14th victory of the season last night as the rampant Cardinals trimmed the Boston Braves, 4 to 3, in a see-saw game which saw the Cards come from behind twice. The triumph shaved the Brooklyn Dodgers' lead to 3 1/2 games.

It was the first defeat for Al Javery, the Boston ace, in the last seven starts, and for a time it looked like he had the seventh successive decision stowed in his hip pocket. The Braves nipped Cooper for a run in the first on three singles, then grabbed another on the fourth on a hit and an error.

The Cards were getting hits, meantime, but couldn't count on all the fourth, when Cooper scratched a single and pushed two across.

The Braves took the lead again with one marker in the sixth on two singles and a long fly, but the Red Sox came back with one run in the seventh and another in the eighth, the winning run counting on a long fly after three singles.

Mort Cooper still played along with his pet superstition, wearing shirt 18 as he sought his 18th triumph, which gave the Cards 20 victories in the last 23 games. Enos Slaughter crept up on Pete Reiser of Brooklyn in the National League batting race with two hits, one a double, in three times at the plate.

PITTSBURGH, Sept. 2. (AP)—The Brooklyn Dodgers protected their grip on the National League yesterday by beating the Pittsburgh Pirates, 4 to 2, behind the five-hit hurling of Kirby Higbe and thus eliminated the Pirates, needs mathematically from the pennant race.

The triumph, Higbe's 14th, broke a long-standing jinx the Pirates have held over the Dodgers' right-hander, who never before had beaten them as a starting pitcher. In his six years in the National League Higbe had lost one time to Pittsburgh and his only career victory came in a relief role last year.

Higbe went the route yesterday and fanned six men, but had two shaky innings, one of them in the fifth when the Pirates scored twice on a walk, singles by Elbie Fletcher and Vince DiMaggio, and a long fly by Babe Phelps.

Pittsburgh was unable to capitalize on its best chance, however, when it loaded the bases with none out in the seventh.

Ted Williams Is Headed For Batting Triple

NEW YORK, Sept. 1. (AP)—Baseball's greatest offensive prize—the batting triple—seems headed this year for Ted Williams of the Boston Red Sox, perhaps the game's most remarkable youngster.

Unless he stumbles somewhere along the short stretch that remains of this campaign, Ted appears fairly certain to lead the American League in home runs, batted in and batting average. He's out front in each of these departments now with little more than five weeks to go.

Williams has a big edge on Joe DiMaggio in runs batted in, an apparently safe margin over Joe Gordon in batting average and a thinner advantage over Chet Laabs and Charley Keller in homers.

Only four players, two in each major league have ever won the triple since the three-way competition began in 1920, when records were first kept on runs-knocked across the plate. They are Jimmy Fox in 1931 and Lou Gehrig in 1931, Chuck Klein in 1933 and Rogers Hornsby in 1922 and 1925.

And Williams will be the youngest in age and in service in the league ever to win the triple. Ted is only 23 and this is his fourth semester in the big time. Babe Ruth won two of the

three crowns five times. Bob Meusel, Simmons, Greenberg (twice), Paul Waner, Jim Bottomley, Mel Ott, Wally Berger, Dolph Camnitz, Medwick and Johnny Mize (twice) won two but couldn't snag the third.

Ted's has been a spectacular career. He was the only freshman ever to lead in runs batted in.

A year ago, in his third season, Williams became the youngest player and the first American League since 1923 to hit better than 400. Furthermore, he topped the home run as well as the batting average championship. And Ted was only five runs behind DiMaggio, the winner, in RBI.

This may well be his last year for he's due for military service soon and there may be no career for him after the war. Of modern-day players, no one except Joe DiMaggio can boast of a better all-round offensive record during his first four years. Pete Reiser of Brooklyn won the batting crown as a freshman and seems likely to repeat, but Pete isn't in Ted's class as a home run hitter or a run producer.

Dangerous "Swimmin' Holes"

Another argument in favor of the early construction of a swimming pool is the increasing number of accidents resulting from the greater use of the "old swimmin' hole" and similar places where swimming is unsupervised and wholly without the protection of life guards, as the lack of transportation keeps the customary bathing beaches out of reach of many boys and girls.

The Metropolitan Life Insurance Company expresses the fear that many avoidable drownings may occur in the United States this summer. But this tragic development can be averted to a large extent, the company says, if those using unsupervised swimming places will "acquaint themselves with the hazards of the waters and behave sensibly."

Of the 5,600 drownings occurring annually in the United States, exclusive of those resulting from boat accidents, about two-thirds take place during the period from July through August, with the maximum occurring in May. Pointing out the special hazards that confront swimmers this summer, the company says:

"Many bathers may take it for granted that conditions are safe at unsupervised places. Even though they may exercise a degree of caution in selecting the spot for unsupervised swimming, along the ocean shore, in pond or stream, they can seldom anticipate all possible hazards. They may fail to assure themselves of the depth of the water, of possible undertows, also-offs, submerged rocks, stumps, weeds, and the like.

They may choose a place simply because it is readily accessible because of natural features such as a rock or an over-hanging bank or bridge providing a suitable place for diving. Often, the youngster's swimming hole is nothing more than a sand bar in a stream, a pier head, an abandoned quarry, or simply a break in the undermark of the bank of a river or lake. All in all, the 'swimming hole' deserves its bad reputation as one of the most dangerous places for swimming and bathing.

The Metropolitan points out the special danger of swimming alone and also calls attention to the many lives that could be saved from drowning if everyone knew how to administer artificial respiration. "In many, thanks to First Aid courses, now have learned how. But there is one thing about it; few drownings ever occur in swimming pools."

Meat Rationing

Military and lend-lease schedules now call for about six billion pounds, and may be higher if ships become available. The output of the world's meat production, with the highest output on record, working hands is turning out sufficient to meet the demand of the world. Before they would take about twenty-one billion pounds this year.
