

WASHINGTON, Dec. 2.-47 Restrictions on consumer credit tightened a notch Monday when new Federal Reserve Board rules cocerning small bank loans be-came effective. Heretofore, regulations bave applied only to installment loans under \$1000 and have placed fev ebstackes on the use of the bor-rowred money. The new rules apply to loans under \$1500 and surround loans with numerous restrictions. They prohibit banks from mak-ing installment loans if the banks have reason to believe the bor-rower will use the money to make a down payment of to to believe the forknown. Charles B. The great American railroad brotherhoods have set a splendid example for John L. Lewis and his CIO unions in how to obtain benefits for employees and settle disputes be-tween capital and labor without resorting to strikes and without interfering with the defense program or the order-ly conduct of the nation's business. Railroad labor and man-agement have agreed to a settlement and the threatened strike scheduled for December 7 has been called off.

Strike Called Off

The dispute was not an easy one to settle. For over six months the brotherhoods have been trying to get a raise in pay for their men commensurate with the increase in the cost of living. Originally they asked for a 50 percent in-crease for the operating brotherhoods and a 30 cents an hour value for maintenance men, brakemen and other workmen.

Direct discussions between labor and management got nowhere as the railroads contended such an increase would run operating costs up by over \$800,000,000 and could not be met without a drastic increase in freight rates which

be met without a drastic increase in freight rates which the public was not prepared to meet. Thy dispute was sub-mitted to a fact finding board appointed by President Roosevelt which recommended a 7½ parcent pay boost. This the carriers agreed to but the proposal was turned down by labor representatives who insisted that the bro-therhoods had submitted to pay cuts during the depression which had not been fully restored and that the higher cost of living more than offset the gain from the proposed wage increase. This compromise was rejected and a strike date set. date set.
