### Medicaid Payments \*To Doctors Reported

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Dr. Roy W. Brown, of Belle Glade, was paid \$80,612 by Florida's Medicaid program during last fiscal year, making him the uncontested leader in Medicaid receipts.

Brown said he's losing money by treating the Medicaid patients. Dr. Allen Baker of Bell Glade, also ranked among the top 10 Medicaid recipients, agrees.

> "If there were any place else for them to go I wouldn't see them." Baker said. Medicaid pays physicians at the rate of

> 60 per cent of their usual fee, if their usual fee is within 75 per cent of fees customarily charged in their "Evidence shows," the Florida Medical Associa-

tion has complained to the federal government, "that those of our members who provided services under the Medicaid program have been exploited by being required to subsidize the State of Florida through acceptance of fees for service which are substantially below those considered usual and customary." The 10 Florida doctors receiving the most under
