**Region can 'Kiss this money good-bye' if commuter rail issue delayed**

**International Airport, with a 10-mile extension to Kissimmee.**

Orange County is the key holdout for the three-to-five-year federal demonstration project. A transportation bill will be signed by President Bill Clinton prior to Sept. 30, with or without funding for com-

muter rail in Central Florida. The next round of major transportation funding is in 2001.

"If we don't move forward with something, we'll get nothing," Mica said. "If I don't have a decision by the end of May, beginning of June, you can kiss this money

good-bye. There are 195 communities that want commuter rail. This will be gone in a flash."

The CSX rail lines which would be used for commuter rail run through the heart of Maitland and Winter Park, causing concern among residents of those cities about how commuter rail would affect the downtown areas. Orlando has similar concerns.

"We've had a very divisive issue in this community," said Maitland City Councilman Keith White. "We're trying to see Rail, Page 9A

## 1 hurt in Sanford copter crash

**SANFORD** — A pilot received minor injuries when his helicopter crashed shortly after takeoff Friday afternoon at the Orlando Sanford Airport.

The flight instructor was using a Hiller UH 12 two-seat helicopter to perform various take-offs and landings. Shortly after performing a takeoff at 2:20 p.m., a malfunction caused the helicopter to crash on its right-front side.

Aviation officials on Friday did not release the name of the pilot, the company he works for, or the company that owns the helicopter. No passenger was on board.

The pilot was transported to Central Florida Regional Hospital with minor head injuries, as well as lacerations and bruises, said Victor White, director of the Sanford Airport Authority.

"I've been in the aviation business for 30 years, and unfortunately I've seen and been in my share of crashes," White said. "They are all terrible. The pilot is very lucky to walk away with minor injuries."

The cause of the crash is being investigated by the Federal Aviation Administration. An inspector from the FAA flight standards district office out of Orlando was on scene shortly after the crash.

"They will look at the weather conditions to see if the weather had any effect on the crash," White said. "Obviously, they will interview the pilot. Normally, an investigation like this takes several months."

The crash occurred in a grassy field on the southeast portion of the airport, a half-mile north of Marquette Avenue. The pilot was performing takeoff and landing training maneuvers at the south end of the North-South Runway.

## Is a gasoline price break on the way?

### Congress debates proposals to lower prices at the pump

**MAITLAND** — Gasoline prices are continuing to climb. While drivers vent frustration at the pump, the President and Congress are discussing measures to lower prices.

Congressman John Mica (R-Winter Park), a ranking member of House committee on transportation and national security, said he favors using the nation's strategic petroleum reserve to lower the price of gasoline.

"It can be done economically soundly to keep us from being held hostage," Mica said. He was

in Maitland Friday to discuss commuter rail.

The onset of severely cold weather in the Northeast, coupled with price quotes by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), have led the price of gasoline to skyrocket.

Gasoline averaged about \$1.34 a gallon on a weekly basis in February nationwide, up 6.8 percent from January, according to the U.S. Department of Energy. In the Orlando area this week, the average price of gasoline was \$1.55 a gallon.

The rise in gasoline prices mirror a recent surge in oil prices. This month, the cost of crude oil has increased \$14 per barrel, or about 33 cents per gallon. Crude oil has almost tripled in price in as high as \$34 a barrel in the past. See Gasoline, Page 9A

## State creates Water Conservation Month to raise awareness

The Florida Cabinet is expected to sign a resolution soon naming April as Water Conservation Month in Florida. The St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD) governing board has announced support of the designation.

Locally, regardless of how official the designation may be, Sanford officials have been planning on bringing the matter of conservation to the forefront.

According to the City of Sanford Project Coordinator Bill Marcus, the city has a number of elements which are intended to be of benefit to residents. Included are a speakers bureau, which will supply speakers for

citizen groups, as well as a Florida Friendly landscape seminar. There are also informational brochures available on request.

The city's reclaimed water program continues to expand to various areas, and meter testing, repair and replacement is underway.

Among special events other than Water Conservation Month, Marcus called attention to Earth Day and the Dividends program.

Hal Wilkening, director of the SJRWMD Department of Resource Management said, "The District's support of water conservation month serves as a way to emphasize our ongoing activities in support of water conservation. The designation

My newspaper colleague Nick and I can name the Andrews Sisters and the Mills Brothers but don't ask us to identify the Dixie Chicks or 'N Sync. Nick and I can both tell you about Durward Kirby but don't ask us about Snopp Doggy Dogg or Dr. Dre.

All it takes is a news item about someone like Durward Kirby to jolt some of us when we least expect to be jolted. I doubt if I've mentioned Kirby's name in more than 30 years. The last time I can recall his name coming up was in doing a New York Times Sunday crossword puzzle.

Still, because of my age or treasured memory it is like I have lost a friend. Randall Kirby, his son who lives in Studio City, Calif., said that his dad had a "charmed life" — he accomplished many things. He said his dad truly enjoyed the leisure and wild days of early TV.

There were no immediate quotes from Carol Burnett, whose career began on the Garry Moore Show. Burnett and her pole Kirby provided zany moments on the telecast which I remember being only in black and white. I imagine she — like everyone else — loved the man.

Kirby was such a household name that the Rocky and Bullwinkle cartoons came up with a character called "Kirward Derby." You probably knew that, though. Or maybe not.

## Our View

### Water Conservation Concept is important throughout the year

April is designated as Water Conservation Month. It's one of many "month designations" various entities create. Some are serious, others are tongue-in-cheek or promotional (such as National Beer Month in July).

This water conservation concept however, has merit. In fact, there shouldn't be a need to declare a special month. People should constantly be aware of the need to conserve potable water.

A couple, originally from Sanford, now live in the wilderness of Central Alaska with their two daughters. With the frost line just inches below the surface, they have no well and thus, no drinkable water. They obtain drinking and bathing water from snow that melts off the roof of their cabin, into a barrel. (In the summer they depend on rainfall). Talk to them about water conservation and you will probably get an earfull. They can't afford to waste a drop.



We have no such problem with drinking water here in Central Florida — at least not yet. But study the sandy ground formations and learn about the aquifer which seems to have either too much or too little water. Then there is always the threat of salt water intrusion, where the waters of the Atlantic or Gulf could enter our underground system and eliminate fresh water in this sandy peninsula.

What do officials want when they call for water conservation? They want each of us to be careful of how water is used. The city of Sanford has an excellent reclaimed water project which allows citizens (who are hooked up to the system) to use water which isn't potable, for lawn irrigation, car washing, etc. It really saves the well water.

Others however, have to rely on their water supply for these needs. From time to time in drought periods, mandates are issued regarding only watering lawns on odd or even days, depending on a person's street number. In extreme times, car washing is prohibited and lawn watering can be restricted to only two times per week.

While we believe it's good that April has been designated for conservation, we believe it should be the responsibility of all of us to conserve potable water at all times. Sure, in heavy rain seasons when the aquifer is full water all you want to. But everyone knows our rainfall has been well below average since January. It shouldn't take a legislative edict to spur us to action.

Let's do it — and do it in keeping with the importance it deserves. If everyone does his or her part and continues to do so over the years, our great-grandchildren will still be able to depend on having potable water emanating from under the surface of Florida.

### Deltona man thinks meditation should be option

It seems the upper levels of the medical community thinks the Transcendental Meditation technique (TM) is good enough for doctors. Doctors in Canada have been able to get Continuing Medical Education for taking the TM course since last year and it's just been approved for U.S. doctors.

At least two HMOs think it's good for people. Healthcare, the HMO for New Hampshire's 10,000 state employees, reim-

burses its members \$200 for taking the TM course. Allen Thornton Health Plan, also in New Hampshire, reimburses its members \$75. Must be they think they'll save money. The only reason they would save money is if TM meditators don't get sick as much or regain their health faster. And that's what the research shows. A study in the Journal of Managed Care reported that a group of 691 TM meditators at Midwestern University had 92 percent cut in medical usage. Maybe Floridians should tell their HMO and their employer.

## Democrats won't roll back tax hikes

"All that glitters is not gold," — William Shakespeare, "The Merchant of Venice"

It is pretty much accepted wisdom that the 1990s were a golden decade of prosperity for the mass of Americans, thanks mostly to the inspired economic policies of William Jefferson Keynes, er, Clinton.

Well, here's a news flash: The latest income figures from Clinton's Treasury Department reveal that the average working American was actually worse off in 1997 than in 1990, when George Herbert Walker (as opposed to W.) Bush was in the White House.

That's right. While individual incomes were 131 percent higher in 1997 than in 1990 — a fact of which the American public is constantly reminded by

the White House — individual income taxes were actually 164 percent higher.

Individuals paid \$40 billion more in taxes to the IRS in 1997 than they would have if they had been taxed at 1990 levels. What this means is that the average working guy and gal actually had a smaller take-home paycheck in 1997 than at the start of the decade.

You'd never know this from listening to President Clinton and his second-in-command, Al Gore. They pretend that everything's Kool-and-the-Gang on Main Street U.S.A., never letting on that the mass of working Americans have suffered diminished living standards on their watch.

The best way to reverse this trend — pre-

suming, of course, that Clinton and Gore truly are concerned that the average working guy and gal have lost ground since they've been in the White House — is to reduce their tax burden, at least to the 1990 level. That would mean a rollback of the two big tax hikes imposed upon the American people during the previous decade, the first of which came in 1990 when Bush bowed to the wishes of the Democratic-controlled Congress, raising taxes a staggering \$263 billion, the second of which came a mere three years later, when Clinton smote working Americans with an additional \$275 billion in new taxes (with Vice President Gore casting the deciding vote).

Both the 1990 and 1993 tax hikes were necessary, defenders said, to whittle down

## Pope John Paul's apology a new beginning?

The confessionalists at Annunciation Church were closed in by red curtains heavy enough to keep my childhood sins from spilling into the sanctuary, where other sinners waited in pews like voters for their turn in the booth. I always dreaded confession, with its demand that I own up to my mistakes and weaknesses. And I was skeptical of the priest's assurance that by reciting a specific number of Hail Marys and Our Fathers my soul would be wiped clean.

I became especially suspicious of the whole process when, in eighth grade at a Catholic school in Florida, I was made to troop by myself down the church aisle, kneel at the altar, and in front of the whole class, pray for God's forgiveness for the offensive sin of forgetting my hat.

Despite my skepticism, I'd usually emerge from church after confession on Saturday afternoons feeling as if I could reinvent myself as a person who didn't fight with her brothers and sisters and wasn't obsessively jealous of her friend Maureen's new white go-go boots. Asking forgiveness cleared away the past, giving me room to build something new.

I thought of those childhood confessionalists as I read of the remarkable "Jubilee Year" homily Pope John Paul II delivered last Sunday. He repented for the Catholic Church's sins over the past 2,000 years, which included injustices toward Jews, immigrants, indigenous people, the poor, the unborn and women.

"Lord God... at times the equality of your

sons and daughters has not been acknowledged," he said in reference to women, "and Christians have been guilty of attitudes of rejection and exclusion."

I'll say.

As the pope spoke about the sins of gender inequality, I couldn't help but be struck — again, still — by the absence of women in the Vatican's vast sea of robed clergy. Did the pope grasp the irony?

I called my 67-year-old aunt in Nairobi yesterday to ask her about the pope's apology. She is a Catholic nun who has worked as a missionary in Africa for four decades. The divisiveness she has seen in African communities in the name of faith has been mirrored in her own religion. The Catholic Church is no closer to allowing women into decision-making roles at the highest levels than it was



the federal government's yearly deficits and eventually balance the budget.

Well, the government is no longer confronted with yearly deficits. And last year alone, the treasury racked in \$13 billion in surplus tax revenue. At least some of that surplus revenue ought to be returned to tax payers.

But the very last thing that Clinton or Gore want to do is return any more money to tax payers than they have to — no matter that many, if not most, working Americans are having a devil of a time covering their living expenses with their shrunken after-tax paychecks. Indeed, Clinton has threatened to veto any substantial tax cut.

bill that the Republican Congress puts on his desk this year, inasmuch as his would-be successor Gore is out on the hustings deragulating the tax-cut proposal put forward by Republican presidential nominee George W. Bush.

"Gore Bush wants to let America's prosperity on the same special-interest roulette that drove our economy into a ditch in the 1980s and early '90s," said Gore this week, stumping in Pennsylvania. Gore dishonestly claims that Bush is advocating "a \$2.1 trillion tax scheme" that "exceeds the budget surplus by \$1 trillion." (The New York Times reports that the Texas governor's plan would cut taxes by \$45 billion over five years.)

The GOP standard-bearer's plan could force him "to cut Medicare, health care and education, or drain money from the Social Security surplus," Gore warns.

By contrast, Gore proposes \$250 billion over 10 years in "targeted" tax cuts, including deductions for non-elementary, non-secondary education (wouldn't want to offend the NRA), relief from the marriage penalty, deductions for retirement accounts (for folks without 401(k)s or IRAs) and a permanent R&D tax credit.

That \$250-billion figure may sound generous to lay taxpayers, but the reality is that Gore's plan is downright stingy. The \$25 billion a year in tax cuts he proposes wouldn't even make

up half the \$50 billion a year in higher taxes that working Americans are paying the federal treasury as a result of 1993 and 1997 tax hikes. So, then, if the Gore tax plan was enacted, the average working guy and gal would still have a smaller take-home paycheck than he or she did in 1993.

Yes, the past seven years with Moors Clinton and Gore in the White House have been a period of overall economic growth. But when we measure prosperity by Joe and Mary Paycheck rather than Bill and Melinda Gates, we find that, indeed, all that glistens is not gold.



## Plans for treatment facility continue

**SANFORD** — Sanford is moving forward with plans to purchase property for a second water treatment facility, to be located near the Orlando Sanford Airport.

By 2010, Sanford's wastewater service area could include 69,000 people, according to a study by a consultant. As a comparison, in 1997 the service area was determined to be 44,748.

The city's only current water treatment facility is located at 1201 W. Seminole Blvd. It is permitted to handle 7.3 million gallons per day, and the average flow through the facility is 5 million gallons per day.

"We're in the apex of the growth corridor," said Sanford Mayor Larry Dale. "We had better be ready for it, because it's coming."

A two-year construction project for the second water treatment facility will begin

this autumn. Construction is expected to cost \$10 million. The facility will handle two million gallons per day.

Meanwhile, the City Commission this week agreed to purchase two pieces of property for the facility.

The Ben Wheeler property, named for the property trustee, will be purchased for \$300,000. The property is a 20 acre orange grove located on the west side of Beardall Avenue and south of Marquette Avenue.

Meanwhile, the city and the airport plan to purchase the 250 acre Cameron City Grove property located at the corner of Beardall Avenue and Marquette Avenue. However, the owner of the property is contesting the purchase, and negotiations are ongoing.

The city would pay \$400,000 to use a portion of the property for the water treatment facility, while the airport would pay about \$4 million to use the remainder of the property for noise abatement.

The contract for the purchasing the

Wheeler property is expected to be finalized prior to the completion of negotiations to purchase Cameron City Groves. In that case, the city will construct the water treatment facility on the Wheeler property, and later use Cameron City Groves for expansion of the facility.

"I think we place ourselves in a good position by having both properties," Dale said. "It gives us room to grow."

In the meantime, Sanford has received grant funds for a program to supplement the reclaimed water supply in north Seminole County.

The plan would reduce the severity of reclaimed water restrictions frequently experienced during the summer months.

Sanford will receive \$1.74 million in grant funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the St. Johns River Water Management District to reduce groundwater withdrawals and supplement the reclaimed water supply in the north Seminole County area.

In addition, Sanford has received per-

mits to withdraw water from Lake Monroe to supplement the reclaimed water supply.

The total program cost is \$4 million. The local share of the project, estimated at \$2.26 million, will be split among Sanford, Lake Mary and Seminole County.

Sanford plans to use the first phase of grant funds to add filters and a pump station at the city's Water Reclamation facility to withdraw up to 3.65 millions of gallons per day of water from Lake Monroe to supplement the reclaimed water supply. Phase I of the project is expected to begin operation this summer.

The funds will be used to further increase the supply of reclaimed water for Lake Mary and Seminole County through a Tri-Party Agreement.

The project is being performed to address concerns among water management officials regarding the maintenance of adequate water supplies in the face of population growth.

New Burger King coming to Longwood

The Burger King Corporation has requested site plan approval with the Longwood City Commission to build a 99-seat fast food restaurant, located at 1050 W. State Road 434.

The existing building on the lot would be demolished under the proposal.

The city's Land Planning Agency, at its regular scheduled meeting of March 8, recommended that the City Commission approve the site plan for Burger King.

No variances from the City Code were requested for this project. Planning staff recommended a curb be placed near the northwest corner of the property.

**Comfort Systems moves to Longwood**

Comfort Systems USA Florida Inc. has moved to Longwood and expanded. The company is a mechanical contractor and refrigeration services provider.

Recently, the company opened a 6,000-square-foot space on Savage Court. The company, which has 35 employees in Central Florida, moved out of a 3,000-square-foot space in Orlando.

Last year, Comfort Systems reported sales of \$10 million. It was formerly known as All Temp Services.

**Home buying on the rise**

Seminole County had a strong February in housing sales, rebounding from a slow January.

The Greater Orlando Association of Realtors reported that 352 homes were sold in the county during the month. The sales represented a 10 percent gain over the same month last year. The average home sold for more than \$135,000.

The Association of Realtors reported that homes averaged about two months on the market.

**Classic Car Cruise in Sanford**

More than 100 classic cars are expected to prowl Sanford's First Street today during the monthly Car Cruise.

The cruise, sponsored by Sanford Main Street, will be held from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday. Downtown Sanford restaurants will remain open.

A dee-jay will play music from the 1950's throughout the car cruise. Vendors will also sell hot dogs and sodas. The cruises are held on the third Saturday of every month, with the exception of November and December.

# Sanford makes a splash with pool opening

## City ends 30-year dry spell after closing pools in protest of integration

**SANFORD** — Thirty years of waiting will end Monday when opening ceremonies are held for Sanford's new community swimming pool.

"Sanford has not had a community swimming pool since public pools in Goldsboro and at Ft. Mellon Park were closed 30 years ago during resistance to federal desegregation rulings."

"When I used to swim in the pool at Ft. Mellon Park back in the 1970s it was totally segregated," said City Commissioner Whiteside Tolson. "Now, people from different walks of life will be swimming together. It really is a sign

of progress."

Grand-opening ceremonies for the Sanford Seminole Aquatic Center will be held at 3 p.m. March 20 at the facility, located near the main entrance to Seminole High School. The 50-meter Olympic-sized pool will open to the public the next day.

"We'll have a community swimming pool that's second to none," said Mayor

Larry Dale. "The school is already using the pool. It will be wonderful for the school, the city and the county. I can't wait."

Commissioner Velma Williams is also heralding the pool as a symbol of change.

"It is indeed a premier asset to the city," Williams said.

Seminole High School will use the

pool for practices, swim meets, and as a place to teach swimming safety.

Sanford, Seminole County and the school district shared the costs of constructing the \$1 million pool facility near Seminole High School. Sanford is paying \$600,000 toward construction of the pool while the county and school board are splitting the remaining \$500,000 for construction.

The pool will have heating, lighting, decking, a 500-square-foot bathhouse, pool capabilities, and diving boards. The facility is the only 50-meter swimming pool in north Seminole County.

The pool is to be open to the public Monday through Friday from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m., and reserved for the school prior to 5 p.m.

On Saturday the pool will be open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., and on Sunday the pool will be open from 12 p.m. to 7 p.m.

The daily fee to use the pool will be \$3 for adults, and \$1 for children under 18 years of age. An annual pass will cost \$100 for individuals, and \$220 for families. The three-month seasonal pass will cost \$60, and \$90 for families.

build a convention."

Mica, a ranking member of the House transportation committee, addressed the Maitland City Council regarding commuter rail on Friday. He recently also addressed the Winter Park City Commission. Over the next two months he said he will try to build a consensus in Orange County in support of the project.

"This isn't going to solve all our problems," Mica said. "It won't end congestion as we know it. But, it takes some of the cars off the road. It would leave us with a regional footprint that we can build upon."

Maitland residents have divided views on the proposal. Some say that it is a positive way to relieve crowded downtown traffic. However, a flux being disbursed by opponents says commuter rail would "flame historic Maitland."

Many leaders in Orange County still harbor resentment from the divisive debate regarding a proposal to build a 14-mile fixed light rail system at a cost of \$1 billion.

Routing could prove to be a sticking point in Orange County, as it is with the failed fixed light rail proposal. In Maitland and throughout Orange County, opponents of commuter rail argue that it would in effect determine the routes of a future fixed rail system.

"This seems like it could be the proverbial rose under tent," said Maitland City Councilman Thomas Foley. "The concern is that this becomes a rail."

Mica counters that although commuter rail is likely to lead into a fixed rail system to relieve congestion, a fixed rail alignment would not be determined by the proposed three-to-five year demonstration project.

Maitland City Council members say that the proposed commuter rail routes would not adequately draw people into the city. Instead, the majority of commuters would be departing Maitland for other destinations, such as the Orlando tourist district. Mica counters that the routes can still be negotiated so that more people are drawn into Maitland.

"The difficulty is in all the cities coming together in a consensus," said Maitland Mayor Robert Brears. "Unfortunately, in Maitland, the route on CSX has always been a striking point."

Commuter rail is significantly less costly than fixed light rail. Residual funds from the failed light rail proposal would provide \$20 million for the project, which carries an estimated price tag of \$30 million to \$70 million depending on whether equipment is leased or purchased and the number of stations used in the system.

The price includes an estimated \$25 million to lease the commuter rail vehicles. The \$20 million in residual light rail funds are from federal gas tax revenues that can only be used for mass transit. For every dollar in federal gas tax revenue, 20 percent pays for mass transit and 80 percent for highway and road improvements.

The number of stations would range from 14 to 17, including three existing Amtrak stations and also a planned Livingston Intermodal Station.

The commuter rail service would operate four hours each during the morning and evening rush hours on existing private CSX lines.

The vehicles would arrive at intervals of 30 minutes. Negotiations are ongoing for freight traffic to be taken off of

CSX lines during the morning and evening rush hours when commuter rail is in operation.

The 75-foot long DART (dual mode rail vehicle) to be used under the proposal are currently used in 100 European commutes. They can carry 174 to 261 passengers per vehicle length.

"There are quiet vehicles that generate low levels of pollution," Mica said. "They look like a bus, it's not like a train coming down the road. We can fix the traffic signals to operate simultaneously with the vehicles, so that delays would only be about 45 seconds."

The commuter rail routes would need to be approved by each county involved in the project.

State funding would assist in the cost of purchasing equipment. Local transit authorities

and local governments would underwrite operational costs, which would be equal to current bus operating costs.

Weekday service could accommodate 2,160 passengers per hour in each direction, north and south. In time, Mica believes, commuter rail will feed into a light rail system.

Mica points to a steady stream of increasing traffic as evidence of the need for commuter rail. Every week in Orlando, there are 615,365 out-of-state visitors and 370,000 in-state visitors.

In addition, Mica said that more cities are turning to use commuter or fixed rail systems as transit alternatives. For example, Tampa is constructing a \$25 million downtown commuter rail system, scheduled to be complete in one year.

14 months.

Congress is considering dipping into the nation's Strategic Petroleum Reserve to increase the supply of gasoline at the pump.

President Bill Clinton has opposed additional drilling, saying it is dangerous to deplete petroleum reserves.

Clinton is encouraging OPEC nations to increase petroleum supplies, which would result in lower gasoline prices. He is expected to unveil a modest proposal to lower gasoline prices today (Saturday).

The petroleum reserve was authorized in 1973, following the embargo by the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries in 1973 and 1974 that caused sharp gasoline price increases.

As of November 1999, the

petroleum reserve holds 575 million barrels of crude oil, with the capacity for 119 million barrels to be added.

Over the long term, Mica said that increased research should be performed on alternative energy sources.

Meanwhile, Congressional leaders are applying increasing pressure to members of OPEC. With oil prices at record levels, the threat becomes more confrontational.

"We have got to place pressure on the oil producing nations," said Mica. "They are the living dirt and sand in our bank. Our trade, finance and security suggest should be used as leverage to lower the oil prices."

Representative Ferguson Calvert (R-N.C.) is sponsoring a bill that would require the President to cut off subsidies and control trade to

three members of OPEC who are engaged in oil price fixing to the detriment of the U.S. economy.

"These measures could encourage OPEC member states to take decisive action to increase production levels sufficiently to bring prices down," Mica said.

Oil prices are at their highest levels since the Persian Gulf War nine years ago, after the end of heating oil, diesel fuel and gasoline.

Saudi Arabia Oil Minister Ali Naimi recently said there is a need for additional production. However, he said OPEC nations have not agreed on when and how much to increase production.

The Clinton administration has said it encouraged by statements by OPEC nations recognizing the need to increase production.

# Despite ruling, most believe school voucher debate far from over

**SANFORD** — Seminole County School Board members say they are pleased by Tuesday's Circuit Court ruling in Tallahassee which said Florida's voucher program violates an amendment to the state constitution.

In the first of what could become many legal battles, Circuit Judge Ralph "Bubba" Smith placed an injunction on the state expanding the voucher program beyond the students it now serves. However, the injunction will be automatically lifted when the state formally files its appeal.

Gov. Jeb Bush said the ruling would be appealed. Although an appeals court could hear the case, attorneys for both sides are saying that the Florida Supreme Court will more likely take up the case directly.

Florida has the nation's only statewide voucher program, using public tax dollars to pay for private school tuition.

Seminole County School Board member Jeanne Morris expects that the matter will wind up in the U.S. Supreme Court.

"We're talking about public funding going to private, parochial schools," Morris said. "This gets into the separation of church and state."

Morris said that she has always believed the voucher program is unconstitutional, and that vouchers are harmful to public schools.

"It is in our best interest to keep really good public schools," Morris said. "That's not going to happen if more and more public money goes to private schools. It's a slippery slope."

Meanwhile, Seminole County School Board chair Sandra Robinson said she expects the

battle over vouchers to be a long one.

"The good thing is that I don't see Seminole County being effected since we don't have any F-schools," Robinson said. "This needs to be resolved one way or another."

Robinson, who is a Republican, said that "every parent has a right to choose where their students go to school." However, she added that it will be interesting to see whether the use of public funding for private schools is supported by the courts.

School Board member Larry Furlong, who has long been a vocal opponent of using public funding for private school vouchers, said that the matter should come before voters as a constitutional amendment.

"What they (supporters of vouchers) really want is a publicly funded private education system," Furlong said. "This is a

fundamental change in the education system."

Under the circuit court ruling, 52 children in Pensacola who now receive vouchers will finish out the school year in private school.

Bush made vouchers the centerpiece of his A+ education plan, passed last year by the Legislature. Under the plan, parents receive private school

vouchers if their children are assigned to a school that has received a failing grade for two years during a four-year period.

Only two schools, both in Pensacola, were eligible for vouchers last year. However, this summer the program could expand to Volusia and other counties with F-graded schools in 1999.

Smith's ruling only dealt with

whether vouchers violate a state amendment approved by voters two years ago that says "adequate provision shall be made by law for a uniform, efficient, safe, secure and high-quality system of free public schools."

The ruling did not deal with other parts of the lawsuit challenging vouchers, including whether public money can be sent to parochial schools.

helps to heighten water conservation awareness during the typical peak-demand part of the dry season."

Water Conservation Month serves as a reminder that winter and spring months are typically dry. Since January, rainfall throughout the district has been approximately 3.5 inches below normal, with continued dry conditions expected. Spring is also a time when many people begin sprucing up their yards, planting new landscapes and doing general spring cleaning, all activities that use extra

water.

The 9 county area, including Seminole County, served by the district has actually been under a water shortage warning since April 1999. The warning urges all water users to voluntarily reduce their water use and to limit outdoor irrigation to no more than twice weekly. Some areas, including some in Volusia County, still restrict lawn watering to odd and even street numbers.

Recently, \$800,000 in cost-sharing project funds were awarded by the SJRWMD gov-

erning board. Thirteen projects are to receive money, out of 28 applications. Locally, the City of Lake Mary will receive \$72,180 for a reuse line transmission extension.

Five projects received money in Volusia County for an overall total of \$100,000. Other money went to cities including Ormond Beach, Port Orange, Winter Garden, Cape Canaveral, Leesburg and Green Cove Springs.

"These cost-share funds help support local efforts to provide alternative water supplies," said Board Chairman William Kerr.

# Rams lay claim to Mikler title

## Lake Mary completes 4-0 week to earn unofficial championship

ORLANDO - While there was no official coronation ceremony, few would quibble with the Lake Mary Rams calling themselves the champs of Oviedo High School's Paul Mikler Spring Break Classic baseball tournament.

"This wasn't a typical tournament where you play for a championship trophy," explained Oviedo coach Harold Hitt. "The purpose of this tournament was to guarantee each team four games against opponents they normally wouldn't get to face."

That means that there was the possibility that there could have been two or more teams finished with the same tournament records against similar opposition without the benefit of a head-to-head match to break the tie.

But that didn't happen. On Friday, the Rams beat the St. Cloud Bulldogs, 5-3, to complete a perfect four-game run through the Mikler, the only team to do so.

In other games Friday, Boone rallied past Winter Springs, 9-2; Bishop Moore outlasted Seminole, 6-3; and Oviedo routed Dr. Phillips, 10-0, in a game stopped in the bottom of the fifth inning by the mercy rule.

Oviedo, Boone, and Bishop Moore each finished with 3-1 Classic records while Lyman and Seminole were both 2-2. Winter Springs, Dr. Phillips, and St. Cloud were all 1-3 in the Classic. Tallahassee Midway was a very misleading 0-for-4 on the week.

Matt Horwath and Ryan Horne each drove in a pair of runs for Lake Mary (14-3) while Trevor Berryhill pitched a complete game to earn the victory.

"It seems like we get strong pitching when we're

not hitting and our hitting shows up when we don't get pitching," said Lake Mary coach Alan Tuttle.

"This is a special group. They'd rather come out and watch some baseball games than be out running around, raising Cain. At a time like this (during spring break), when they could be thinking about doing anything else, they came out here and won four baseball games against good opposition."

Tuttle went on to say that what the Rams got out of the tournament has nothing to do with home-field advantage.

"We got a chance to play four games against good teams," said Tuttle. "Playing games against quality competition is one of the best ways to get better."



- Replace deteriorated zincs.
- Inspect propels for dings, pitting and distortion. Make sure center pins are secure. Grip the prop and try moving the shaft. If it's loose, the center bearing may need to be replaced.
- Check to make sure the rubber stock hasn't been bent.
- Inspect the hull for blisters, distortion and stress cracks.
- Make sure your engine intake sea strainer is free of corrosion and properly secured.

### OUTDRIVES AND OUTBOARDS:

- Inspect rubber outdrive bellows for cracked, dried and/or deteriorated spots (look especially in the folds), and replace if suspect.
- Check power steering and power trim oil levels. Replace worn and worn.
- Inspect outer jacket of control cables. Cracks or swelling indicate corrosion and could mean that the cable should be replaced.

### ENGINES AND FUEL SYSTEMS:

- Inspect fuel lines, including all and even hoses, for softness, brittleness or cracking. Check all joints for leaks and make sure all lines are well supported with non-conducible clamps or straps with smooth edges.

- Inspect fuel tanks, fuel pumps and filters for leaks. Clamps should be snug and free of heavy rust. Clean fuel filters.

- Inspect cooling lines and fittings for stiffness, ribs, leaks and/or cracking. Make sure they fit snugly and are double clamped.

- Every few years, remove and inspect exhaust manifold for corrosion.

### Engines and fuel systems (continued)

- Clean and tighten electrical connections, especially both ends of battery cables. Wire brush battery terminals and all cells with distilled water.

- Inspect bilge blower hose for leaks.

### BALBOAT RIDING:

- Inspect fittings for cracks and rust. Inspect wire haulards and running backstays for "fish bones" and rust.

- Replace tape on turnbuckles and hibiscus threads, preferably with Teflon. Replace old tape with fresh tape.

- Recruit deck mounted chafing pads as necessary.

### IN THE WATER:

- Check the engine shaft and rudder stuffing boxes for steady leaks and looseness.

- Use a barge to check for deck leaks at ports and hatches. Renew caulk or gaskets as necessary.

### TRAILERS:

- Inspect tire treads and sidewalls for cracks or lack of tread and replace as necessary. Check air pressure. Don't forget the spare!

- Inspect bearings and repack as necessary.

- Test tail and back-up lights. Test switch to make sure it's working properly.

### MISCELLANEOUS:

- Check expiration dates on flares and fire extinguishers.

- Check stove and remote tanks for loose fittings and leaking hoses.

- Inspect bilge pump and float switch to make sure it's working properly.

- Inspect dock and anchor lines for chafing.

# Fight Club

Center teaches fine art of kickboxing

**T**ony Haddock encourages his students to punch and kick.

And, his classroom isn't filled with books. Instead, every corner contains boxing gloves, punching bags, jump ropes and gym equipment that seem to orbit the room's main feature — a boxing ring. Above the ring is a shrine-like poster of martial arts expert Bruce Lee in a karate pose.

The poster may seem a little out of place since Haddock teaches kickboxing — not karate — at his center. But, Haddock is quick to point out the connection between the martial arts legend and his facility.

"Many people don't associate Bruce Lee with kickboxing," Haddock said. "But, he helped organize the sport when it first got started."

The origin of kickboxing goes back to the early 1970s when American tournament karate practitioners became frustrated with the limitations of the traditional system, which did not include kicks and punches in its scoring. The result was full-contact karate or kickboxing.

"It is a combination of karate and boxing, blended fluently together," Haddock said. "It's

an aggressive sport that uses both hands and feet."

And, it's a sport Haddock seemed destined for from an early age.

The Sanford resident began his career in combat sports while attending Seminole High School, where he was an undefeated member of the wrestling team. In the years following graduation, he learned karate and then made the transition to kickboxing.

"Kickboxing demands a lot of discipline and focus," he said. "It encourages positive thinking, which in my experience, got me off the streets."

"It's given me an alternative lifestyle — one full of the desire, determination and discipline to win."

It's worked.

Haddock is the current United States men's champion in international kickboxing. Last month, Jason Cleveland, who trains at Haddock's center, won the ISKA (International Sport Karate Association) welterweight Florida state title.

Cleveland's win was a little surprising for Haddock, who opened Hitman's Training Center in Sanford only three months ago.

"I didn't think we would get the title so soon," he said. "It was a world-class competition."

However, Haddock, who previously worked in an Orlando kickboxing center, has been training Cleveland for several years. When he opened his own center, Cleveland followed him to Sanford.

"I was lucky he stuck with me," he said.

Haddock didn't open his center only to train kickboxing champions.

"You can train like a kickboxer and not be a fighter," he said. "It's a great cardiovascular workout."

Nevertheless, Haddock's training center is not like a health club. He teaches not only the movement of kickboxing but also the real

## A tribute to the King Elton's show brings Elvis' spirit to life

**J**ack Elton has lived in Lake Mary since 1972. He has been an entertainer for several decades. For many years now, he has been performing an Elvis Presley tribute and has appeared locally, nationally and in other various parts of the world. "Don't call me an impersonator," he said. "It's a tribute — an illusion. There have been too many so-called

impersonators who have given this a bad name, and my aim is to perform a tribute to the King, (who passed away in August 1977) not try to make people think I'm copying him." With many music awards presented to him recently, Herald Staff Writer Nick Plestil asked Elton for his opinion, and whenever possible, what he thought Elvis' opinion might be of modern music.

**Q.** Considering what is on the hit parade these days, how do you feel about the music of today?

**A.** In my personal opinion, there is some music I like, but there is other music I think of as total trash. If Elvis were alive, I believe he probably wouldn't go one way or another. He would probably say "everybody do their own thing." He tried to stay neutral regarding what other people were doing.

**Q.** What about rap music?

**A.** Some of it is OK. Will Smith for example really puts it together. Some of the others are just shouting.

I don't believe in so-called music where people are promoting killing, drugs, other crimes or sexual activity. While rap music wasn't around when Elvis was, I don't believe he would have personally liked it.

**Q.** Will the Elvis and other music of the past ever come back again?

**A.** There is some new type of swing music of that style, but more modern than before that is becoming prominent these days, and it's appealing to those in their 20s. I think that's a good sign.

**Q.** In their days, Elvis and the Beatles were real superstars. Do we have any superstars these days?

**A.** The one person who immediately comes to mind is Garth Brooks. He is really a big entertainer. He is in the middle between young and old, and he is grabbing out to everyone. Another good group is the Back Street Boys, but I would not give them very long to continue their popularity. Brooks may hold out for at least a decade or more.

**Q.** Elvis has been gone since 1977. How long do you feel his music will still be popular and his memory continue to be so strong?

**A.** Elvis was so ahead of his time. The adoration will probably continue until the people who were around when he was popular get old enough and start to diminish in numbers. I would say we will have Elvis fans continue strong until at least the year 2020.

**Q.** What will you, as Elvis, be doing in the near future?

**A.** One of the local events will be a benefit for the American Cancer Society at the University of Central Florida Arena. That is scheduled for March 24 as part of the Relay for Life. That will take us to the United Kingdom, Germany, Japan, the Far East, Australia, New Zealand, and other areas. I'll have some of the original Elvis backing with me including the Jordinares and the Stamps Quartet.

**Q.** It's been a pleasure talking with you and through you about Elvis. Is there anything you'd like to say in closing?

**A.** Thank you — thank you very much.

"He's come a long way," she said.

Getting the last word in the Sanford center isn't easy. Haddock is serious about training, and a student who gets out of line ends up running laps or doing push-ups.

The students, who range in age from 6 to 34, don't seem to mind the discipline.
