# County employee finds dead coworker

It was a grim day for the Seminole County Stormwater

When Tommle Lovejoy, 40, didn't report for work Friday a coworker visited his home at the corner of Jessup and Kentucky avenues near the Orlando Sanford International Airport. She found a gruesome scene that included the lifeless bodies of Lovejoy and his girlfriend, Tammy Cook. 42.

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office responded to the scene at about 12:30 p.m.

According to Lt. Barry Smith, a sheriff's spokesman, there has been a history of domestic vioand domestic disputes at the residence at 3790 Jessup Ave. and there were no signs of forced entry to the residence.

As investigators interviewed several county employees who stopped by to pay their respects to family members and friends, other law enforcement officials reviewed video tape taken of inside the home by crime scene technicians.

After more than two hours of investigation, the

sheriff's office called in a medical examiner from Volusia County for a second opinion, Smith said.

A preliminary presumption by authorities is that the incident is either a murder-suicide or suicide-suicide. A determination of the exact cause of the deaths may not come until after the weekend, Smith said.

The early presumption is to help relieve citizens who live in the area of any concern for their safety. However, it does not mean that the incident may not be reclassified after lab results and in-depth crime scene analysis have been completed, according to Smith.

## Residents stage fight against rezoning

Two neighborhoods on County Road 46A are battling a commercial rezoning at the mouth of their community, and they say their ability to defeat the measure may rely on an

upcorning election. With 260 homes in Loch Harbor and 712 homes in Chase Grove, residents believe they can pressure county commissioners — three of which that are up for election in November 2004 — to side

At an Oct. 1 public hearing of the planning and zoning commission, the commercial rezoning passed by a 3-2 margin. The county commission is acheduled to consider the measure at its Nov. 18 meeting.

"We should have so many people there — so many voters — It scares them," said Sonja Greenlee, a resident of Loch Harbor who lives in the historic Roy Frank Symes home on Lake DeForrest. "We need to put the political pressure on

these people."
Similar to many of her neighbors, the proposed commercial rezoning is a touchy subject. She says the possibility of parking lot lights shining through her windows are

"We definitely need peo-ole," urged Bob White, Loch Harbor neighborhood president at a homeowners association meeting Thursday. "The commissioners are elected and

Only days before their second birthdays, twin brother and sister Raeann and Brandon Johnson were found by their mother lifeless in the backyard pool.

According to Winter Springs police, the two toddlers apparently climbed out their bedroom window Thursday when they were supposed to be napping.

Johnson, who was also napping at the time, awoke to find both of them in the murky swimming pool. A neighbor was able to resuscitate the girl, but the boy died at South Seminole Hospital in Longwood.

## Iraqi Diary: Car bombs, king beds and funny money

Editor's note: Staff Sgt. Charlie C. Carlson III, son of Sanford historian Charlie C. Carlson II, is deployed in Baghdad as part of the 549th Military Police Company. He is providing the Herald with a journal of his experiences.

26 Sept. 2003 Things have gotten much worse here in terms of attacks on patrols. The enemy is well organized for fighting but relies mainly on IEDs [Improvised Explosive

Device to do the job on us. Many of these devices are made out of unexploded munitions that the U.S. should have secured a long time ago. It seems that we have gone

through phases, first were the snipers, then surprise ambushes with automatic weapons, now the weapon of choice is the IED, usually remotely detonated. Plus the car bombs when they really want to blow up something big. I've lost

count, but I think there have been over 300 U.S. soldiers killed over here since the war started. That wears on the mind, so we try to not think about it much. Besides it would make no difference anyhow, since we have little choice

but to keep charging ahead. We came back in off midshift patrol and did a layout inventory by each squad for the change over in platoon ser-geants. We finally hit the sack for a little sleep before the right shift. Our midshift runs from 1900 hrs to 0700 in the morning, seven days a week. Each patrol is made up of three teams, each with an interpreter.

On this patrol we were alerted to have the entire platoon to conduct a mission in which we were to block all entrances and exits to Saddam City, now known as Al Sadir

Just call me the grinch: Former Sanford commissioner Whitey Eckstein on more than one occasion referred to Sara Jacobson as the smartest woman in Sanford. I'm more familiar with the bottom end of the 1.Q. scale, so I'll trust Whitey's judgment.

I do know dumb, though, and that's the best way to describe the Sanford City Commission's decision on Wednesday to give Jacobson and the Downtown Business Association (DBA) \$11,000 to put up Christmas lights downtown. No, it's not dumb to have Christmas lights. It's not even dumb to have Jacobson involved. As the Diva of Downtown, Jacobson knows how to put on the dog with the best of them.

What's dumb is the city giving Jacobson the money without asking for proof of how much installing the Christmas lights actually costs. This city commission has claimed it's in the poor house on numerous occasions (leading to 14

employees getting the ax), yet continues to toss around money like a drunk on pay day. Sure, 11 large ones isn't going to sink the city. But add it to the \$50,000 (church) and \$15,000 (windows) the city has spent without requiring accountability and the money begins to add up.

Jacobson claims she needs \$11,000 to install the Christmas decorations. Her proposed expenses include: storage, \$3,000 (for 2003 and 2004); labor and materials, \$5,000 (with the labor consisting of a general foreman working 10 weeks and two supervisors working two to three weeks); \$1,500 for repairs and replacements; \$500 for meals and other contingencies; and \$1,000 for electricity.

Am I the only one who thinks having a foreman on the job for 10 weeks is a bit excessive for this project? And \$500 for meals? Only if the volunteers are super-sized guys like me and Tom

Jacobson claims these expenses have always been a part of the DBA's cost for installing Christmas lights.
This has been an \$11,000 project everywar," she told commissioners

However, a wrap-up report of the 2002 Christmas display Jacobson gave the city in late January contradicts that claim. Jacobson reported that 20 people or businesses donated \$13,400 to the 2002 Christmas display. However, total out-of-pocket expenses were \$5,365: storage 2003, \$1,500; dislay materials, \$1,105; electric plies, \$500; miscellaneous, \$160; and labor, \$2,100.

Naturally, I have a few questions. If Jacobson and the DBA raised \$13,400 last year for Christmas lights and had expenses of \$5,365, where did the other \$8,035 go? Did those who contributed realize that their gifts totaled two-and-a-half times more than actual expenses? If out-of-pocket expenses were \$5,365 last year, how come this year's costs are double that? If storage costs for 2003 were a part of last year's costs, why is the DBA asking the city for money for storage for 2004 and 2003?

I asked Jacobson to explain the dis-


crepancies. Her response?
"If you want to be a grinch about the DBA doing something positive downtown, go ahead," Jacobson said.
"It's not good for the city, and I don't think your heart is in the right place."

Jacobson added that she doesn't know what report I'm referring to and that I'm most certainly reading the numbers out of context.

I doubt it. Sara may be the smartest woman in Sanford, but I'm not dumb enough to buy that explanation.




In addition to writing this column every week, I'm back at the Herald now, and you may be assured, I'm going to look into this situation and let you know what I find.





There will then be two full-time and one part-time employee. The museum will also be bringing in traveling exhibits, which should entice more people to visit the museum. 

# LSU hopes to bounce back

he 10th-ranked Tigers have to shake off a tough home loss to Florida, and to restore their confidence they will have to pluck the Gamecocks. But a nationally televised night game at Columbia, S.C., is a tough place to turn things around, especially when staring down a stingy defense superior to the Gators' unit that held LSU without an offensive touchdown in the game. There will be no better time for quarterback Matt Mauck and wide receiver Michael Clayton to re-establish the connection that made the Tigers' offense lethal through the first five games especially with the red-hot Auburn Tigers waiting next week. Meanwhile, the Gamecocks are feeling a little vulnerable on the offensive line, where an ankle sprain to Ali-SEC tackle Travelle Wharton has Lou Holtz shuffling the line in search of the right combination. Timing couldn't be worse, with an LSU squad rolling into town fresh off six sacks against the Gators last week. This game is important for South Carolina, looking for its fifth win of the season and hoping to reach .500 (2-2) in the conference.

Key for L5U: Come out firing. This offense must remember that it was the best in the conference before the poor performance against the Gators, when quarterback Matt Mauck failed to throw a touchdown pass for the first time in 10 games. So start the game with a deep hookup off a play-action pass to Michael Clayton, then sit back and watch the point parade.

Key for South Carolina: Ride the legs of tailbacks Demetris Summers and Daccus Turman to victory. Summers has the moves to get the Gamecocks downfield, and Turman has the sure hands and strong legs to punch it into the end zone. Use the one-two punch the same way the Oakland Raiders did last year with Charlie Garner and Zack Crockett.

Running back Shaud Williams and a stout defense are this team's strong points, and recent injuries have made that more apparent.

Key for Ole Miss: Finally, the Rebels meet an opponent that can't expose their weak secondary. Without even the threat of a run, Ole Miss can stack the box and send waves of defenders at Shaud Williams. Just get the ball back and give Ole Miss' best player, Eli Manning, a chance to find Chris Collins for a couple of scores, which should be enough to win.

Key for Arkansas: Get back to the powerful running attack that helped the Razorbacks win their first four games. They can't allow penalties, turnovers and a poor performance by Cedric Cobbs, such as occurred in the loss to Auburn, to take away their

Key for Auburn: The running game has returned for the Tigers, so don't even worry about the offense. Playing good defense is what will keep Auburn in contention in the SEC West, so focus on continuing to stuff the run and force teams to find another way to move the ball and put up points.

Key for Vanderbilt: With quarterback Jay Cutler third in the conference in total offense, and two Vandy receivers (Brandon Smith, Erik Davis) in the top five, it's obvious what the Commodores should do. And they'll need to pass a lot just to keep up with the Bulldogs' offense.

Key for Kentucky: Give your quarterback a chance to look upfield. Before going out of the game with a concussion, Jared Lorenzen was constantly chased from the pocket. And with backup QH Shane Boyd, who isn't as familiar with Rich Brooks system, getting the nod, a little protection would go a long way.



ALABAMA on the run to beat Southern Miss, passing for only 12 yards, mainly because they were forced to start redshirt freshman quarterback Brandon Avalos in place of injured OBs Brodle Crayle and Spencer Pennington. Alahama had not passed for fewer than 100 yards since getting 21 in last year's game against Southern Miss.

The biggest crowds ever to see the Razorbacks play at home have witnessed the home team losing both times to Alabama teams. Last week, 74,026 were on hand for the 10-3 loss to Auburn. It was the largest crowd ever at Razorback Stadium. The old record was 73,551 for last year's game against Alabama, a 30-12 loss.

The story was not only how well running back Carnell Williams continued to perform, but how tough the defense looked in allowing only a field goal to Arkansas. The Tigers shut down the conference's top ground game by limiting Cedric Cobbs to 78 yards, which is 62 below his average.

PLORIDA Freshman quarterback Chris Leak completed 18 of 30 passes for 229 yards and two TDs to beat sixth-ranked LSU. In doing so, Leak became only the second starting true freshman quarterback at Florida to beat a ranked opponent. The last was Jesse Palmer, who led Florida to a 24-10 victory over Auburn in 1997.

BEORGIA Buildogs QB David Greene improved to 3-0 against Tennessee with an efficient 22-of-27 performance, as Georgia led from the beginning and scored 21 points off three Vols turnovers. But coach Mark Richt isn't about to get caught looking ahead. "We're in the lead, but there's not a lot of margin for error," he said.

MENTUCKY Head coach Rich Brooks is still fuming about two late hits, including a helmetto-helmet collision, last week by South Carolina defenders on his quarterback, Jared Lorenzen. "He was knocked out," Brooks said. "He has a concussion and we don't know when he'll recover." Lorenzen finished 10-of-18 but he did not play in the fourth quarter of the loss.

When Florida quarterback Chris Leak hooked up with tailback Ran Carthon to score in the first quarter, if was the first touchdown LSU had given up in the first half this season. Entering the game, the Tigers had outscored their opponents 103-3 in the first half.

MIGSISSIPPI Rebels QB Ell Manning was 23-for-36 for 306 yards with three touchdowns last week in a 55-0 blowout of Arkansas State. Even though he played only three quarters, he moved ahead of Florida's Rex Grossman for eighth place on the Southeastern Conference's career

coach Jackie Sherrill and Memphis defensive coordinator Joe Lee Dunn boiled over after last week's game. After the game, Sherrill and Memphis head coach Tommy West went nose-to-nose arguing about Dunn, who was fired by Sherrill after last season. Dunn had a lot to say leading up to the game about the way Sherrill let him go. Apparently Sherrill relayed his irritation about Dunn's comments to West.

GAROLINA The Gamecocks may have some serious injury problems on the offensive line. Starting left tackle Travelle Wharton sprained his ankle, and starting center John Strickland hurt his knee, Head coach Lou Holtz wasn't sure if either lineman would play against LSU.

TENNESSEE Vols OB Casey
Clausen, who missed last year's game against Georgia with a shoulder injury, should have kept his mouth shut. After last year's loss, he told reporters the outcome would have been different even if he had played with one arm. He had both last week, and all he could manage was 11-of-23 for 165 yards.

MANDERBILT Not only have the Commodores dropped five straight, including last week's loss to Navy, but they have now lost 10 straight games against Division I-A opponents and have only five victories in their last 32 games against major college teams.

## Oveido, Winter Springs departments are accredited

At the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) meeting Oct. 8 in Fort Meyers, it was announced that Winter Springs and Oviedo police departments were awarded law enforcement agency accreditation.

Oviedo Chief Ronald Jacobs and Lt. Dennis Bell, the department accreditation manager, accepted the certifi-cation, which Oviedo first earned in 2000. It was the department's first re-accreditation, as agencies are certi-

fied for three years before being reassessed. For Winter Springs Chief Daniel J. Kerr the acceptance of agency accreditation was the first for the department.

By choosing to participate in the formal and thorough peer review by the Commission, Winter Springs Police Department can docu-ment to the citizens of Florida that it adheres to high stan-dards of professionalism and is among the finest in the state," he wrote in a department release.

CFA reviews all aspects of a law enforcement agency's policies, procedures, management, operations and support services to determine the department's compliance with 276 standards. Many of the 276 standards that are reviewed by a team of assessors are critical to life, health and safety to the citizens. By complying with these standards, Winter Springs Police Department was also award-

ed national recognition by Commission Accreditation for Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). By receiving this recognition, Winter Springs police took the first step toward national accreditation.

The Ovledo Police Department also has been recognized by CALEA. On Oct. B, the commission wrote Oviedo police to congratulate them on meeting national certification requirements. The national commission will announce Oviedo's accomplishment during its national conference in November.

CALEA's July 2003 on-site assessment of the Oviedo department included an advertised invitation for public comments, a review of policies and procedures, an inspection of physical improvements at police head-quarters and interviews with personnel. According to CALEA, agencies that satisfy mandatory professional standards increase their ability to inspect crime thereals a more impact crime through a more effective and efficient delivery of law enforcement services to their community.

Undergoing the voluntary state and national accreditation processes provides a law enforcement agency with a "quality assurance review" and encourages self-scrutiny.
These accomplishments by
Oviedo and Winter Springs
police are considered significant and their accredited statuses are held in high esteem by the criminal justice community.

# A few Central Florida plants signal arrival of fall

With the shortening of the daylight hours, the leaves on many trees and shrubs are start-ing to change colors.

A few temperate climate plants found around the area will remind us of the color changes that occur in the fall. As we are all aware, in the fall, chlorophyll production slows as the trees prepare for winter and finally it is depleted while other pigments become more


Other pigments in the leaves contribute to the colors we see in the fall. One of the major components of the colors in the

Ferrer for the red color of some leaves. Carotene, the pigment found in carrot, produces the orange colors.

As the days grow shorter and the nights longer, an inter-nal clock inside the plants, trig-

gers a chain reaction that is responsible for these changes. The amount of hours of light or photoperiod and not the tem-perature is what causes the plants to change from their nor-mal green color to their autumn

Here in Central Florida, we do not have the wonderful display of red, yellow and oranges that some of our northern neighbors enjoy. But, we do have some trees that are just as beautiful to see in the fall. There is one tree in particular that will tell you that the fall season is here. The golden rain-tree can now be seen all over Seminole County producing bright yel-low fraggant flowers in panicles up to 15 inches high which last up to a month or more on the

The flowers then turn into decorative seed pods that are pinkish and papery, which make the trees even more beautiful. The fruits mature about one month after the yellow blossoms fade and persist for a month or more on the tree. The tree is native to China and Korea and it is related, botanically, to the lychee and soapberry. The golden rain-tree is well adapted to Central Florida and can be found in most nurseries and garden centers or you can find seedlings under your

neighbor's fruiting tree.

The sweet gum tree is another good looking tree. This tree produces greenish flowers that appear in small clusters at the end of twigs, the flowers devel-op into globular burr-like fruits

on long stems. In the fall, the leaves turn into striking red, purple and golden yellow col-

Volunteers can also be found under old trees. The sweet gum tree is a native to Florida and can be grown with relatively lit-

The seaves of the Chinese tallow tree lights up the landscape in the fall with bright yellow to bronze and crimson red colors. The needs are white and contrast with the bright colors of the leaves.

Some trees, including the hickories, mulberries, tulip tree, wild cherry, and wild grape turn yellow and sourwood trees and the little sumac tree turn red during the fall an con-tribute to the changes in color in the landscape.

The sycamore leaves turn yellow early in the fall, and the tree can be easily identified by the shedding of the bark and its mapie-like leaves. The flowering dogwood of Central and North Florida turns red or orange in the fall and its red berries makes this tree even more beautiful in the winter.

In South Florida, red maples turn red and orange, hickories and mulberries bring yellow, blackgum gives red, and pond or bald-cypress add bronze before losing their leaves. There are many trees that

you can plant near your house that will enhance the value of your property. Choose one with pretty colors in the fall and make Seminole County a nice place to be in the fail.







At 13-years old, Team Florida Olympic-style weightlifter Meredith Hamili is the youngest American weightlifter to represent the USA at the 4th Annual Criollo Cup International Weightlifting Meet in Caguas, Puerto Rico October 23rd-25th. Hamili will be competing in the 16 and Under Age Division, 53-kilo (116 pound) weight class, and is expected to finish in the top three.

"Meredith is training hard and continues to reach personal bests on an almost weekly basis," says Team Altamonte Weightlifting Coach Danny Camargo. "Judging from the competition we expect, Meredith should be bringing home a medal."

Five international teams fielding 113 athletes from the United States, the Caribbean and Central and South America are slated to compete. The USA Team is comprised of 16 female athletes, ages 13 to 23, and 16 male athletes, ages 14 to 23. In the 2002 competition, American lifters brought home three 1st place and six 2nd place medals.

Hamill was named to the International Team after training this summer with Olympic coaches at the US Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs. She was invited to Colorado following the 2003 National Junior Olympic/School Age Weightlifting Championship held in Essex, Vermont in June. There, Hamill was named the Best

Lifter with a personal best total of 115 kilograms (253 pounds) for her combined snatch and clean and jerk lifts, out-performing all other 12 and 13 year old female competitors in all other weight classes.

# **BoatUS** offers free winterizing guide

With winter fast approaching, Boat Owners Association of The United States has a free winterizing guide available to help boaters prepare their vessels for freezing temperatures.

"Most boaters believe that freeze related damage only happens in states like Minnesota, New York, or Maine," said Bob Adriance, BoatUS Marine Insurance technical director. "But the reality is that boats in the temperate states have a far worse record for freeze related damage, with sunny California leading the pack. Florida, Texas, Louisiana, Alabama and Georgia also experience similar problems," he

added. Adriance explains that boaters in colder climates know the realities of freezing temperatures and therefore prepare accordingly. However, when bitter temperatures slip down into the Sunbelt, many boaters are caught unprepared. "It only takes one night of freezing temperatures to cause damage. This is especially true of boats stored on trailers. Unlike a boat in a wet slip, where the surrounding water retains warmth longer, boats on trailers surrounded by air are more vulnerable to a sudden freeze," he adds.

LANDOWNERS OFFERED INCENTIVES FOR PROTECTING WILDLIFE HABITATS

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is setting up a new program to provide financial and technical assistance for landowners who improve certain wildlife habitats for at-risk species on their property.

Species at risk in Florida include 110 vertebrates, seven invertebrate and 413 plant species. Recognition that the well-being of many of these species largely depends on existing habitats managed by private owners is key to their conservation. That's the purpose for the new Landowner Incentives Program (LIP).

Florida is widely recognized as one of North America's most important reservoirs of biological diversity. To pre-serve that diversity, the FWC will offer any private (non-governmental) landowner up to \$20,000 in cost-shares for approved habitat-improvement practices. Cost-shares require a 50-percent non-federal match and are reimbursed based on established flat rates

for each approved practice.

The FWC will accept applications continuously, however, the agency will evaluate and rank applications at twomonth intervals. Project needs assessments will be conducted by FWC biologists on an applicant's property by rank, with properties receiving the

highest score assessed first.

Landowners will have 12 months to complete approved practices in accordance with practice standards and will receive reimbursement following evaluations by FWC biologists.

To receive reimbursement, landowners must have completed the approved practice as specified in the practice standards upon submitting invoices that document expenditures.

"We do not use surface water, we only use water drawn from the aquifer and we are drawing more water from the aquifer than is being replen-

"To make matters worse, we are decreasing the amount of land in the recharge areas at the same time we are increasing the amount

of water being pumped out of the aquifer."
"We need to develop new sources of fresh water and conserve water before this imbalance reaches a critical level," added Barr.
"Fortunately in Seminole County, the County Commission is moving in this direction, hopefully in time to avert a major cri-

The loss overshadowed a good game for Varitek, who doubled and scored Boston's third run and also singled in the ninth. But the catcher also missed a chance to widen the Red Sox lead in the fourth inning, striking out with runners on second and third and no one out against Mike Musina, who had just come in to relieve Roger Clemmens.

Former Dr. Phillips standout Johnny Damon then hit into an inning-ending dou-ble play and the Yankees were still alive.

Varitek had an outstanding series, going 6-for-20 (.300) with two home runs and two doubles, scored four runs and drove in three.

There is a limited Canada goose season from Nov. 22 – Jan. 30. The daily bag limit is five. Canada geese may be taken only in the Florida waters of Lake Seminole In Jackson County that are south of S.R. 2, north of the Jim Woodruff Dam, and east of S.R. 271.

In addition, a limited light goose season is set for Nov. 22-30 and Dec. 6 - Jan. 25 in an area north and west of the Suwannee River. Light geese include snow geese, both blue and white phases and Ross' geese. The daily bag limit is 15.
