PROTESTED TILT MAY BE RULED IN FAVOR OF FEDS

Rodenbaugh Reported Saying He Erred In Decision At DeLand

Sanford may be upheld in its protest over a decision in its recent game with DeLand, according to Manager Joe Barnes, who attended yesterday's game between DeLand and Daytona in DeLand.

If this game is thrown out and ordered re-played, Sanford and DeLand will be tied for first place in the league standings, each having won 10 and lost six games. In that event, and with the season to end on next Thursday, June 23, one of the largest crowds to see a Central Florida league game this year is promised.

Belief that the protest will be upheld came after Manager Barnes and several players heard Carl Rodenbaugh, Winter Park umpire who handled the protested game, say that he did make a mistake in calling the play as he did, and that the game should be played over for that reason.

What the league president will do in the matter is as yet unknown, although a delegation of Sanford players and officials expect to visit him today and attempt to get a ruling.

Tomorrow afternoon the Fed's will be at Daytona in the last game of the first half between those two teams. As all fans know, the Fed's have won two of the three games played between the two outfits, and in one game they drove Olin Hutto from the hill, a feat never done in this league before.

Only Lefty Lane has defeated the Fed's, and it is that fine hurler who will be sent out against the Fed's tomorrow. By all the signs, Buddy Lane, who has scored both the Fed's victories over the Islanders, is due to hurl, but Manager Barnes may call on that old warhorse Tom Phillips, who is today this league's craftiest and most effective hurler.

Either hurler should be able to hold the Islanders at bay despite the fact that the Daytona team has won eight of its last 10 games, and is one of the most powerful in the loop.

(Continued from Page One) office if they wish employment. It was announced that the type of work needed for the next several weeks is clearing of land, grubbing, and much excavation.

It is understood that much of the fill that was made near Lake Monroe bridge is unsuitable as a solid base for the road, and that it will be dug away to a certain depth and the resulting hole will be filled with sand from the bottom of Lake Monroe. Much excavation therefore means shoveling away muck that has been filled in on the proposed site of the road, near Lake Monroe bridge.

Dredging will begin in six weeks, it was announced, with a Tampa firm handling this feature of the work. Before leaving for Orlando, officials of the Orlando firms declared that it is highly probable that if their low bid had not been entered, the State Road Department would not have let the contract because the other figures were so greatly in excess of both the estimate and the available funds for this project that the entire project might have been dropped temporarily. The Orlando firm's bid was \$100,000 lower than the next low bid.
