

ATLANTIC CITY, Mar. 15 (P)— President Truman pledged today that the full resources of the United States would be used to feed starving millions of areas freed from war - but not from dire hunger Mr. Truman sent a message to the

fourth annual convention of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Agency, meeting in Atlantic City.

The chief executive hailed the work of UNRRA as evidence that cooperation for peaceful ends in possible among nations. Delegates from 47 Allied nations are meeting to discuss the urgent task of feeding an estimated 500,000 persons facing mated 500,000 persons facing starvation oversess. Said Mr. Tru-

"In this country, our efforts are now holidly behind an emergency program intended to release as large as possible a proportion of our food supplies for export to the starving peoples of the world."

The President declared he was taking every possible means to make certain the United States does not fall behind other supplypeoples with sufficient food to tide the starving abroad.



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


