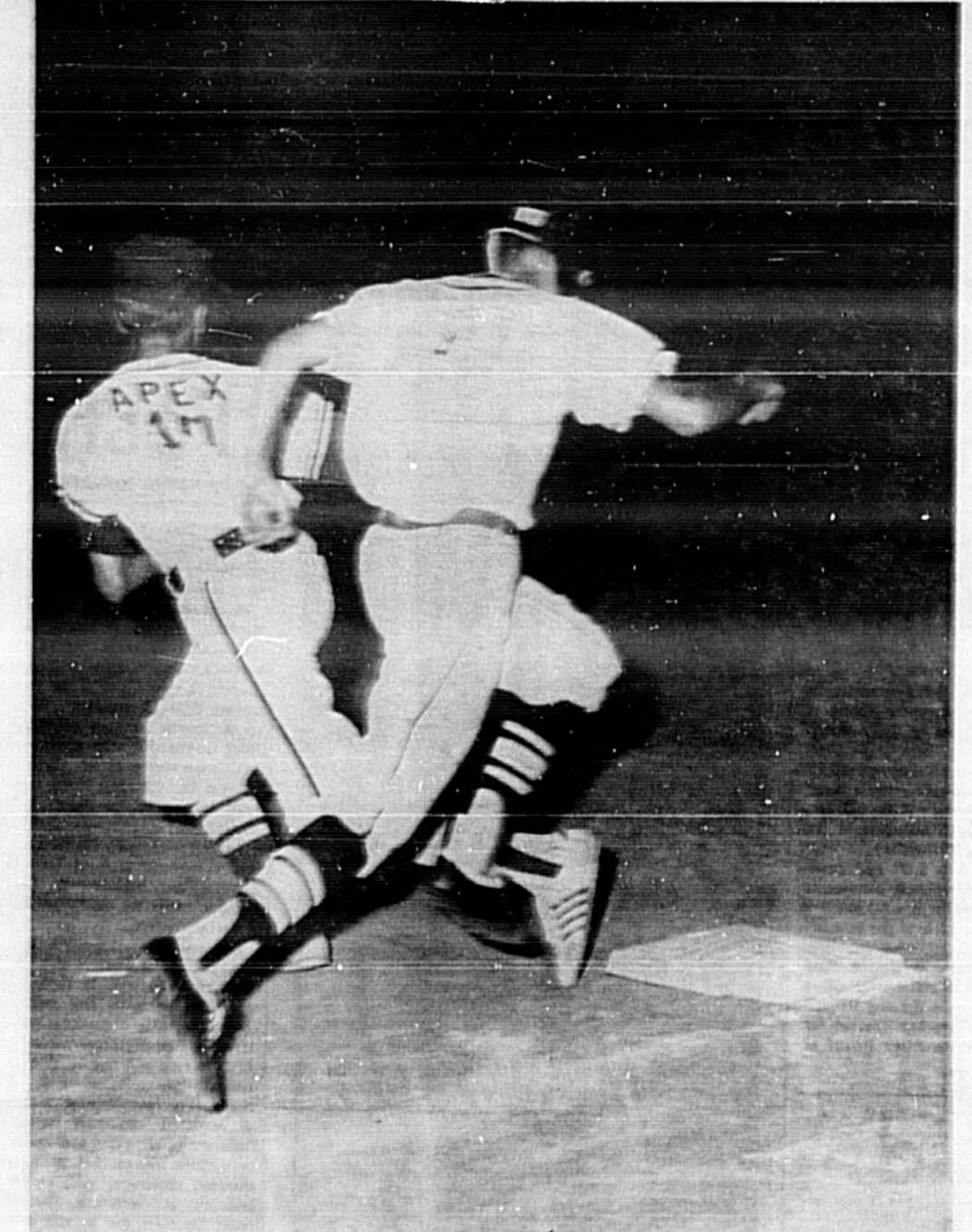

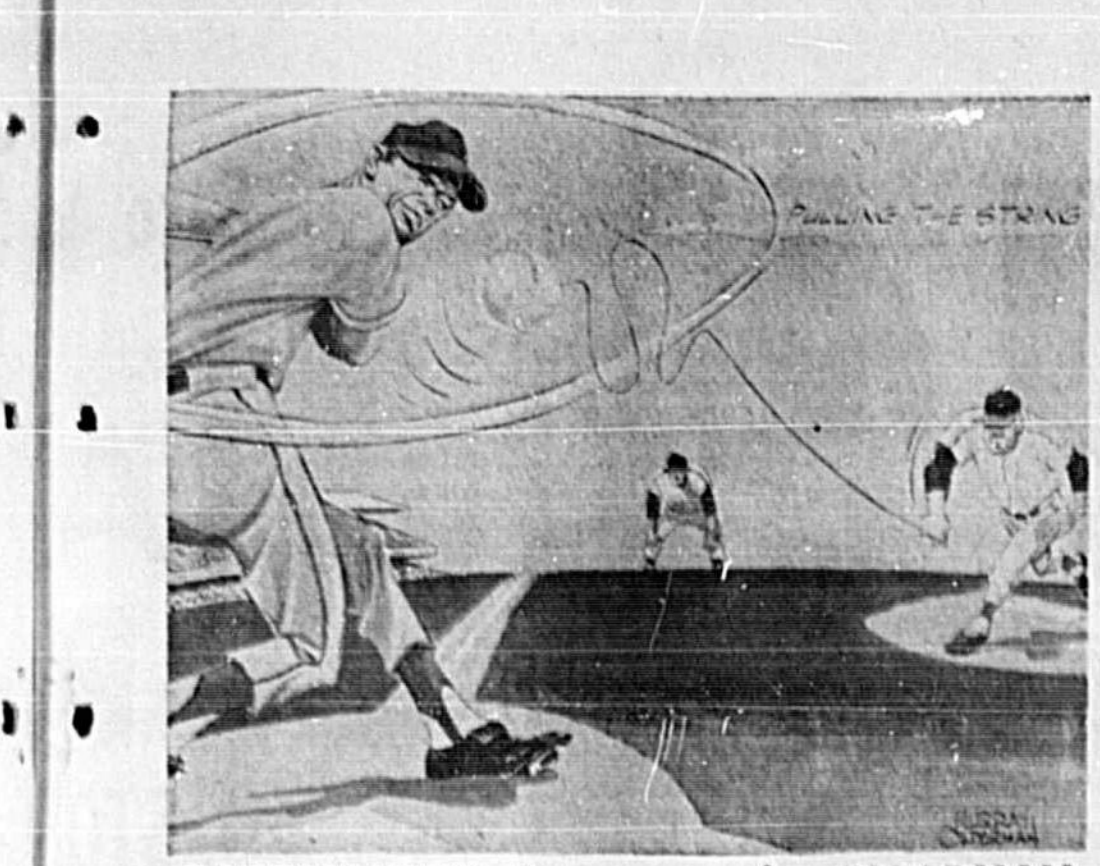

MOSCOW (AP) — Three Soviet cosmonauts died today as their Soyuz 11 spaceship was bringing them back from a record three-week flight aboard the Salute space-laboratory. Foreign experts speculated they suffocated when their oxygen system failed.
