NEW YORK, May 17. -Plans r a 25,000 mile trip around the orld by more than 600 Ameriollege students, to sail from New York in October and return in May, and to be joined enroute by students from England, Germy, Norway and Italy, are bemade by a group of nationally known leaders and by men and women prominent in the social, education and business life of this and other states, it was learned today.




