

Strong Quake Rumbles In Baja California Area

MEXICALI, Mexico (UPI) - A baby girl was crushed to death, 100 people injured and 100 homes were damaged during a strong earthquake that rumbled through rural farming communities in northeast Baja California.

Officials assessing the damage of the temblor which struck at 8:28 p.m. Sunday and registered 6.2 on the Richter scale -- Monday said 21-month-old Elizabeth Torres Nunez was killed when the adobe roof of her home collapsed in Hidalgo, about 50 miles southeast of Mexicali.

Red Cross officials said more than 100 people were treated for injuries at hospitals and clinics throughout the Valley of Mexicali.

NEW DELHI, India (UPI) - Soviet warplanes. tanks and mortars laid waste to villages surrounding Kabul in an all-out bombardment to thwart a rebel attack on the Afghan capital, reports said today. At least 1,000 guerrillas were reported killed and 2,000

Soviets Love Faith Healer

MOSCOW (UPI) - A former waitress who claims she can perform miracle cures is rumored to number Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev among her clientele in a tale reminiscent of the mad monk Rasputin and the czar's family.

The faith healer, Dzhuna Davitashvili, reportedly an Assyrian who lives in the Soviet Republic of Georgia, has become the hit of Moscow intellectual circles. The woman, who comes from a long-line of faith healers known as sensitives," has been written up in the leading Soviet trade union newspaper, Trud, telling

55 Held In Army Drug Bust

HANAU, West Germany (UPI) - American military police seized \$2 million in heroin, hashish, and LSD and arrested 55 soldiers in one of the largest drug busts in the Army in Europe, U.S. officials said today.

Disguised as drug users, military police moved among troops stationed in the Hanau area, arresting small groups of dealers and users in a continuous month-long operation code-named Snow White 2, a spokesman for the Army's Fifth Corps said. The operation - completed early this month - was a follow-up to Snow White 1, in which military police

seized \$8 million in heroin and arrested 92 GIs in 1978. Italian Communists Lose

ROME (UPI) - Italy's Christian Democrats scored a major electoral victory over the Communists. snatching away two of their prized regions and ending a campaign that threatened the government of Premier Francesco Cossiga.

The Communist losses, coupled with setbacks in national elections last year, have frozen for years their hopes of entering the national government, analysts

The Christian Democrats and their major supporters, the Socialists, won gains in most of Italy in two-day regional elections that ended Monday, thwarting a Communist attempt to turn the balloting into a personal vote against Cossiga.

Richard Pryor 'Critical'

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Comedian Richard Pryor, 38, suffering third degree burns over 50 percent of his face and body in a cigarette lighter accident, today was given less than a 50-50 chance of surviving Pryor's upper body and head were engulfed in flames

Monday night when, according to police reports, "his cigarette lighter apparently ignited a flammable liquid in his bedroom." "We really can't pin down exactly what happened because Pryor was in no condition to be questioned," police said.

According to Officer Dan Schmeider, the black comedian

was wrapped in a bedsheet by an aunt who was in Pryor's home with him at the time. "But Pryor must have panicked," Schmeider said. "He ran from the house and was running down the street when he was

stopped by policemen in a patrol car." Paramedics were called and Pryor was taken to the Sherman Oaks hospital burn ward where his condition was listed as

critical but stable. Schmeider speculated that a cigarette lighter alone could not have caused such extensive and severe burns as the comedian

Inside the car, Papnia found Miss Bordas, who had been shot once in the head with a medium caliber bullet, an autopsy

The exact time of Miss Bordas' death has not yet been determined, said Seminole Assistant Medical Examiner Sara

Prosecutors Dismiss Lance Bank Charges

ATLANTA (UPI) - Six remaining bank fraud charges against former U.S. Budget Director Bert Lance have been dismissed by federal prosecutors. who say it would be too costly to retry Lance and his

The motion to drop the charges was filed in U.S. District Court Monday by Prosecutor Edwin J. Tomko. The Justice Department had announced in Washington last week it had decided against trying Lance, Richard T. Carr and H. Jackson Mullins a second time.

A jury acquitted the three men April 30 on 13 of the 19 counts for which they had been indicted last year. The jury was deadlocked on 5 counts of falsifying bank statements and one accusation of misapplying bank

Potts Renews Death Wish

ATLANTA (UPI) - Convicted killer Jack Potts, who decided on the eve of his execution last week to appeal his death sentence, has abruptly changed his mind

His attorneys say he wants to die because he can't bear the cruelty of his guards who allegedly smashed a mirror given to him by his mother. In a handwritten plea to a federal judge, he asked the appeal be stopped and his execution be carried out.

U.S. District Judge William C. O'Kelley set a hearing today to hear personally from Potts, 35, why he is again refusing appeals - "so that the court may determine his competence and whether or not his action ... is freely and voluntarily given, with full knowledge and understanding of the consequences of his actions."

Family Home Sales Plummet In April

The sale of new single family homes in the United States has plummeted to new depths, and it appears the price of oil to heat those homes and commute back and forth from them will

reach new heights. The U.S. Census Bureau Monday said single family home sales dropped 21 percent in April — the worst showing in 17 years of record-keeping. With only 37,000 new houses sold it was the second worst month on record, outdone only by September 1966 when sales were running at an annual rate of 358,000 units.

Meanwhile, half way across the world in Algeria, the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries opened its 57th biannual strategy meeting with proposals that would have added up to 3 cents per gallon to the retail cost of gasoline and home heating oil in the United States.

But the oil ministers from 13 countries were unable Monday to reach a compromise on price unity. Iraq proposed OPEC members unify oil prices at \$32 per barrel. But that price was dismissed as "too low" by Iran and

apparently rejected by Saudi Arabia as too high. The Iraqi proposal to unify oil prices at \$32 per barrel would have added between 2 and 3 cents per gallon to the retail cost of gasoline and home heating oil in the United States. But Iranian Oil Minister Ali Akbar Moinfar said a \$32 marker was "too low," and suggested \$35 might be more acceptable.

It remains unclear whether Vernon Jordan was the victim of an impulsive crime or a planned attempt on his life, whether it involved one assailant or more than one, and whether the attack was linked to Jordan's prominence as national director of the Urban League and a spokesman for black Americans.

The possibility that the shooting may have federal dimensions justified the entry of the FBI into the case. The parallel investigations by federal and Fort Wayne authorities should assure that the utmost is being done to clarify the circumstances of the crime and bring those responsible to justice.

It will open an old wound on the national conscience if this was an assassination attempt motivated by Jordan's role as a civil rights leader. Americans would like to believe that racially motivated violence like that which brought down Martin Luther King in 1968 belongs

Officials of the Urban League and other black leaders around the country have been cautious and responsible in their reaction to a most distressing turn of events. So have residents of black communities where Jordan has come to symbolize the aspirations which the Urban League is striving to fulfill

Jordan is the very antithesis of the kind of blind and irrational racism that an attack on his life suggests. He has been among the healers and peacemakers in the effort to keep whites and blacks working together to eliminate racism in our society. The good news from Fort Wayne is that he stands a good chance of recovery. He is







Speer claims the project is illegal on three counts: - The city has no legal right to "place any obstruction" on a street or limit access to certain streets by cars.
