### Sues Over Magazine Story

NEW YORK (AP) - Novelist Gore Vidal is suing Truman Capote, Playgirl Magazine and writer Richard Zoerink for \$1 million. Vidal charges he was libeled in an article which said he got drunk at the Kennedy White

In papers filed Wednesday in State Supreme Court in Manhattan, Vidal said the September 1975 article in Playgirl held him up to "public contempt."

In the article, Capote was quoted as saying that Robert Kennedy, Harvard historian Arthur Schlesinger and a guard "just picked Gore up and carried him to the door and threw him into Pennsylvania Avenue" after Vidal "got drunk and insulted Jackie's mother whom he had never met before in his life."

## Nixon China Departure

### Is Scheduled For Today

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Richard Nixon, private citizen, leaves today for the People's Republic of China, where four years ago he carried out the most spectacular diplomatic mission of his presidency.

A Boeing 707 jet airliner sent by his Chinese hosts was serviced Thursday in Vancouver, B.C. It was to arrive at Los Angeles International Airport at 6 a.m. PST and depart from an out-of-the-way hangar three hours later with Nixon, his wife and a group of aides and Secret Service escorts.

The former president is to arrive in Peking on Saturday after a flight by way of Anchorage, Alaska, and Tokyo. His arrival is scheduled exactly four years to the day after he arrived in 1972 to re-open relations that had been shut off for more than two decades between the two countries.

Fielding questions at a "public forum" in a steamy high But Reagan aides say the former California governor does not advocate investing Social Security funds. They say Reagan merely noted that some economists, whom he did not identify, have suggested the funds could be "invested in the industrial might of America."

#### 'Killer' Flu Outbreak

ATLANTA (AP) - The National Center for Disease Control has reported an outbreak of influenza in humans imilar to a virus found in swine - and recalling the flu of a half-century ago that killed 500,000 Americans and 20 million persons worldwide.

A CDC spokesman said Thursday there is no immediate cause for alarm and that any major outbreaks of the disease could be controlled by modern vaccines. But, he said, precautionary steps are being taken, including consultation with the World Health Organization.

An Army recruit died Feb. 4 in an outbreak of the new Influenza A strain which affected five persons at Ft. Dix. N.J., said Dr. H. Bruce Dull, assistant director for programs for the CDC.

#### **Economy Outlook Brighter**

WASHINGTON (AP) - Fairly stable food prices for the next few months and a further drop in unemployment are among the latest optimistic predictions for the economy by the Ford administration.

Administration economists also expressed confidence that the January consumer price report today will show that inflation is continuing the slower pace of recent

Consumer prices increased five-tenths of 1 per cent luring December, and the administration has indicated it would be satisifed with a similar increase for January. Wholesale prices have not increased at all during the past three-month period.

MIAMI BEACH (AP) - AFL-CIO President George Meany, while calling for investigation of overseas corporate payoffs and administration of the federal food stamp program, refuses to say whether he favors a congressional investigation of the Teamsters union.

The agreement with ALEA provides that unresolved economic issues will be submitted to a federal arbitrator to assure contract settlements without disrupting operations. His decision would be binding for up to two

#### **No Charges For Helms**

WASHINGTON (AP) - In two developments arising from intelligence investigations, the Justice Department says it won't prosecute former CIA Director Richard M. Helms for his role in a break-in, while the House says if will investigate CBS newsman Daniel Schorr for arranging publication of a secret document.

Despite the Justice Department decision not to prosecute Helms, he remains under investigation for possible perjury. Other former intelligence officials are under Justice Department scrutiny for their roles in mail opening and electronic surveillance programs.

LONDON (AP) - Iceland's decision to break off diplomatic relations with Britain because of the cod war between the two members of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization raises a new question mark over one of the Western alliance's major observation posts.

Iceland's only contribution to NATO is its Keflavik air base, from which the U.S. Air Force monitors the movements of Soviet forces in the Atlantic corridor. Eighteen months ago, Prime Minister Geir Hallgrimsson's government called off the previous leftist cabinet's plans to close the base, and Foreign Minister Einar Agustsson said the break with Britain would cause no change in Iceland's ties with NATO "in the near future." But the dispute was certain to give the Icelandic Communists new arguments to use against membership in NATO.

# The Marines **Role Unique**

Every now and then somebody discovers that the United States doesn't need a Marine Corps. A recent study by the Brookings Institution think tank does not go so far as to say the Marines are unnecessary but declares, since the Marines' specialty of amphibious warfare is outdated, that the Corps itself should be materially reorganized and reduced in size.

The truth is, while they are indeed skilled in the amphibious art, the Marines have actually won their respect in the eyes of the American people through their determination to be ready to respond to an unexpected call, without regard to the nature of the crisis.

More often than not the crisis has not involved an amphibious attack. Fighting in the trenches in France in World War I, protecting American lives and property in the West Indies, Central America or China, guarding the U.S. Mails, responding to an emergency call to help save the Pusan Perimeter in the first days of the Korcan War, facing up to trouble in the Dominican Republic or in Lebanon, rescue of the freighter Mayaguez - all were shortnotice crises. None of them was an amphibious operation.

The law which fixes the Marine Corps as a part of the U.S. military establishment had this ready for-crisis function clearly in mind when, in addition to talking about amphibious warfare, it requires specifically that the Marines shall be ready to perform "such other duties as the president may

This all has application in the modern scheme of things. Today we characterize dentente as a balanced military circumstance which provides the climate in which peaceful intercourse can flourish. This military balance, however, cannot be confined to nuclear weapons alone. It must be faced up to at every level of confrontation, so that our enemies are never free to present us with lesser magnitude crises that we cannot handle.

And that is where the Marines' dedication to instant and genuine readiness is serving us today. If, for example an increasingly militant Fidel Castro were to confront the United States with a challenge in Guantanamo or Puerto Rico or Panama, a nuclear response would not be appropriate. A swift reaction by a force of ready Marines would. And that is exactly why we are not likely to face such a crisis, because we have such a force of Marines, they are ready to meet the crisis. and Castro is quite aware of the fact.

Put another way, the only war you win is the one you don't fight. And the best way to keep from having to fight it is to be completely prepared that nobody will take you on. This is the niche that the Marines occupy in our

defense structure, and it is more important in today's world than ever before.

## **Unsecret Secrets**

The vote, however, is nothing more than a gesture. Wellcirculated "leaks" already have revealed details of such operations as U.S. submarine spying on Soviet missile launches and CIA involvement in Angola and Italy's politics.

The House vote cannot undo the harm done by unauthorized revelations of acceptable CIA methods, nor can it erase concern over activities proscribed under the CIA's role. Environmentalists, welfare rightists, consumer advocates and the like are learning that nobody holds an exclusive patent on "the public interest." More and more of these groups are finding themselves on the defensive end of legal actions.

The list also includes at least one government agency, Kaiser Aluminum & Chemical Corp., for example, has filed suit against the U.S. Consmer Product Safety Commission to prevent the commission from continuing to release "misleading, incomplete, inaccurate and unfair" information relating to the safety of household aluminum wiring.

The company charges that this information as caused numerous local government agencies to ban or propose to ban aluminum wiring and has led contractors to stop buying the product. Whether this suit is in the public interest as well as that of Kaiser stockholders is for qualified, impartial experts to decide. But it does suggest that companies are no longer as willing as they once were to roll over and play dead to

# Profile: The Nation's First Voter

DIXVILLE NOTCH, N.H. - At one minute past midnight on the 24th of Feb. 76-year-old Neil Tillotson will deposit his primary ballot in a box normally reserved for the U.S. mail, and become the first American to formally vote in the 1976 presidential elections.

The honor will not come by accident. Dixville Notch is the place name for a frosty New England resort which the millionaire Tillotson owns. The 21 residents here are his employes and he is, quite naturally, their mayor. Partly for the publicity then, the community has since 1960 opened its polling place at the break of every federal election day to cast the nation's initial

Tillotson will register on the Republican side of this primary, probably for Gerald Ford, But however he decides, he says, it will be for what he considers the best interests of the United States. Gimcrackery aside, Tillotson believes the nation's first voter has a responsibility to light the way for the millions of others, not concerning party or person, but in regards to motives and thought.

In this sense the country is fortunate that Tillotson votes first. Better he than some hot dog performing for the "Guinness Book of Records." Born poor and now rich, Tillotson has been on both sides of the American experience, and has an appreciation for citizenship that comes only from a long view from opposite poles. So far, one trial shipment of decorative planters has been sent to the U.S., where it was reportedly received with enthusiasm Faircloth plans regular shipments to follow.

All the work is done by about 20 men, from young boys to grandfathers. Pottery is men's work in Guatemala. They labor in an L-shaped group of rooms, all facing a central courtyard. To one side is a large brick kiln fired by a fuel made from husks of coffee beans, a local crop.

Three potters turn out fruit bowls, vases and large plant pots on their treadle wheels. Designs are inscribed swiftly and skillfully by artists using sharpened sticks as their engraving tools. They draw the old Aztec gods - the god of war, of the harvest. Then the artists-intraining - boys aged 10 or 12- stipple the background with a round-tipped stick

After firing, the pots are painted - dramatic black against the fawn background of the clay, or in the vivid reds, blues and greens so beloved by the Guatemalans. Some artists use paintbrushes; other dab on the color with their fingers. The pots are glazed, fired again and packaged for shipment.

"All six families involved are properly owners. We pay our taxes; we're entitled to the same services as others." said Mrs. Turner. Her group plans to approach the Seminole

County School Board in an effort to obtain home pick-up.
