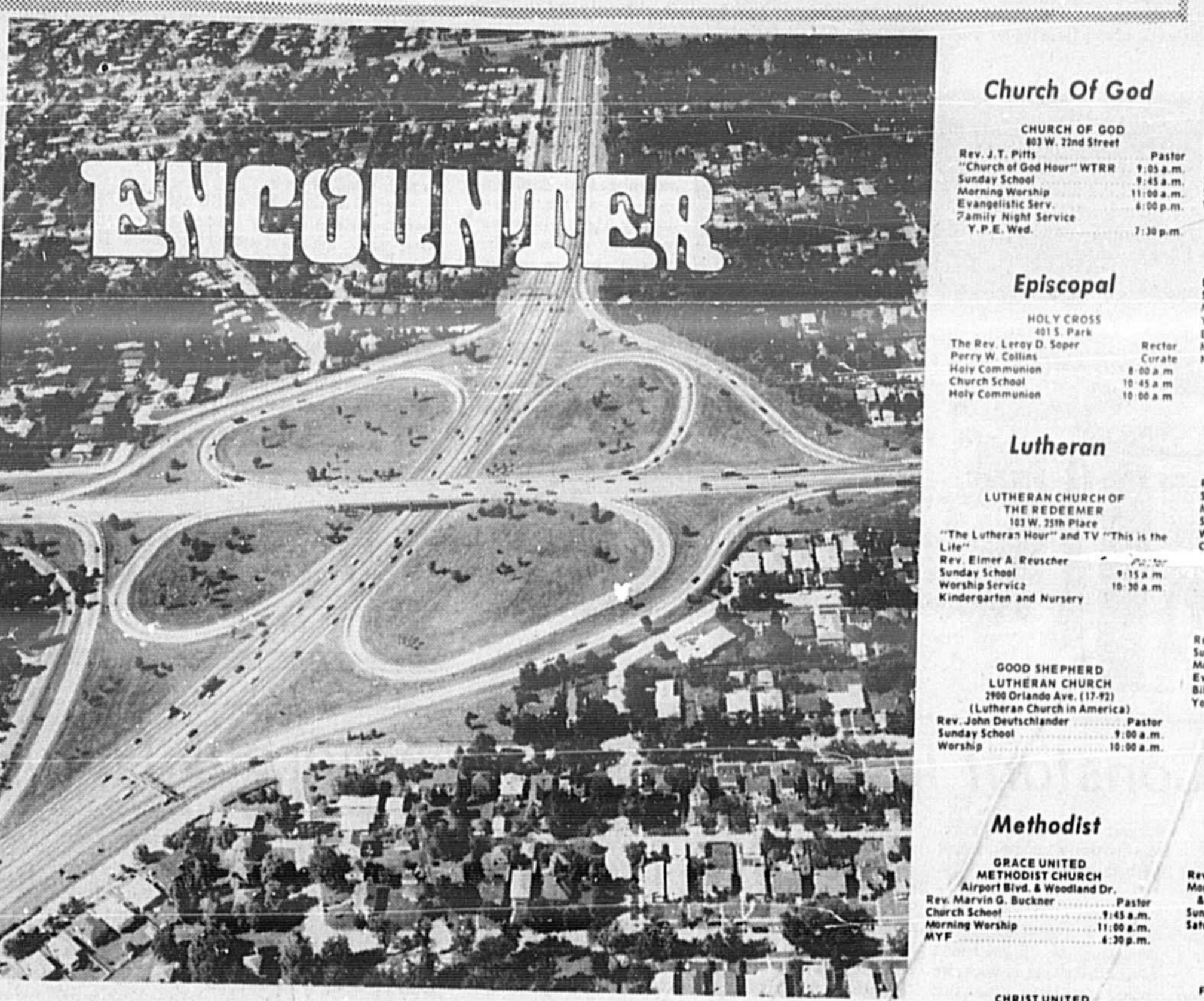

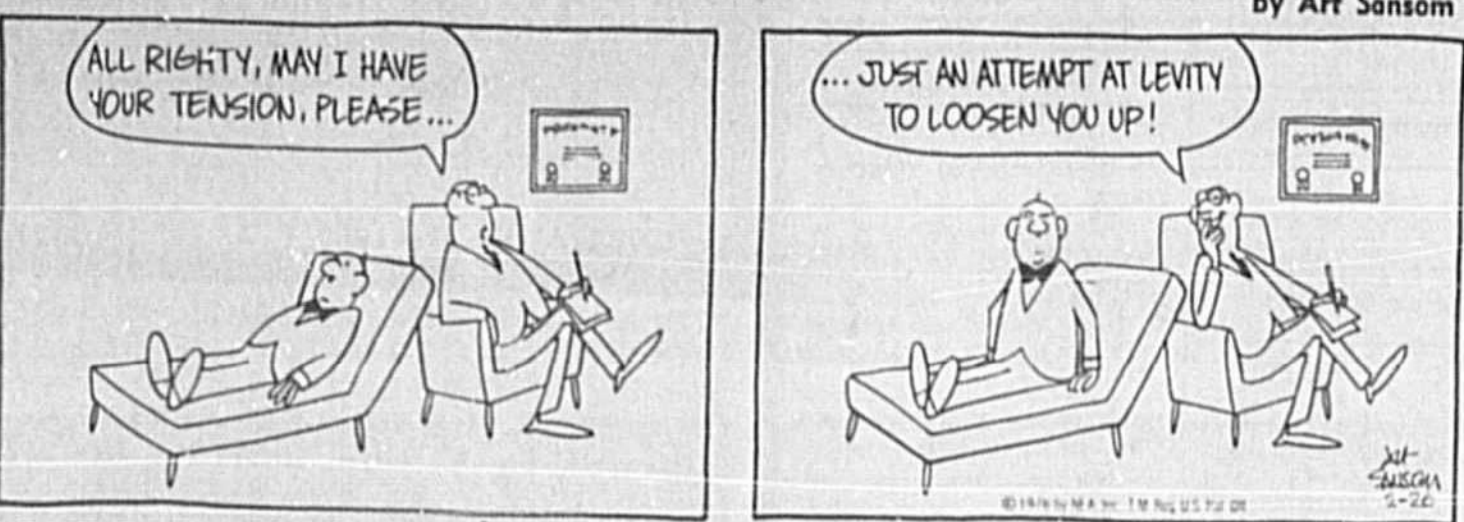

Hypoglycemia Is Controversial

DEAR DR. LAMB—I have low blood sugar (hypoglycemia). The first doctor I went to said I'll never be completely cured, but my symptoms would become less severe. I've just gone to another doctor who says it can be cured. Who am I to believe?

DEAR DR. LAMB—You are correct. I also suffered from numbness first starting in my upper lip and spreading to my hands and feet until my whole body was numb, but I never fainted. Was this hyperventilation or was it caused by the insulin level being too high at that time? My big attacks at night have been occurring only once in a while. The first doctor said I should see a psychiatrist. Will this help?

Whether or not you cure low blood sugar depends on if you have it in the first place and what causes it. If it is caused by a tumor of the pancreas producing too much insulin, removing the tumor cures it. If low blood sugar is a response to diet and emptying of the stomach, a proper diet may control it.

DEAR READER—First things first. I'm not at all sure you ever had hypoglycemia. A report in the New England Journal of Medicine in 1974, pointed out that 25 per cent of a normal population had blood glucose levels below 50 and had no symptoms at all. Other studies note that 42 per cent of normal people have such levels and values as low as 34 and 37 have been noted by several different investigators in perfectly normal people with no symptoms whatsoever of low blood sugar.

Your value of 60 doesn't impress me. No diagnosis of low blood sugar or hypoglycemia should be made unless the low blood sugar can be demonstrated at the time symptoms are observed and the symptoms can be corrected by raising the blood sugar. Anxiety and hyperventilation (which may be caused by anxiety)

They're 2 Miles From Closest Stop Families Fight For School Bus

A battle is brewing between six families in the Black Hammock section of Oviedo and the Seminole County School Administration over the lack of busing down Stone Road for the 13 children, ages five to 13, who live there.

According to Mrs. Gwynne Turner, spokeswoman for the small group of Oviedo parents, the nearest school bus stop is almost two miles from the six homes. All children involved are elementary and middle school age.

If the children walk to and from the bus stop, it is not only a long walk but it is through a lonely wooded area, Mrs. Turner said.

More to the point, however, is the inconvenience to parents who drive their children to and from the bus stop, she said.

One parent, she reported, made three separate morning trips, and three more in the afternoon to transport her kindergarten, elementary and middle school age children to the school buses in the morning and home again in the afternoon.

Some parents are driving up to 15 miles a day, just to and from the bus stop, and together the six families clock 54 miles a day on transporting their children, Mrs. Turner said.

Williams Warns County To Check Out Applicants Today

In a memo to the board, Commissioner Richard Williams warns it would be "foolish" to fill the newly created executive assistant's position with applicant the commission doesn't know all the facts about.

Williams' memo arrives as the commission has narrowed its choice down to about six candidates — most of whom are out-of-town applicants.

The commission hopes to fill the executive assistant's position by March, and Commissioner Harry Kwiatkowski says he hopes to have the individual hired "on board" sometime by the middle of March.

Williams said his fear is that the individual hired will look good on paper but may not be able to handle day-to-day tasks assigned under the assistant's supervision of the board.

The administrator hired will report directly to the board and handle all administrative functions of county government. He will have the power to hire and fire.

In short, the assistant will have powers second only to an elected commissioner.

Both Williams and Commissioner John Kimbrough opposed creation of the position. The slot was recommended by management consultant E.H. Underwood in a study outlining methods of streamlining county government.

Underwood gave special emphasis to the hiring of the assistant. The same position in better known as Florida State University's Flying High Circus — is in the area this weekend for two performances. See story in Seminole Magazine, Page 4 and 5.
