

French President **Appeals For End** Of Cabinet Crisis

PARIS 'M-President Vincent Auriol sharply told France's political leaders today to put aside their jesiousies and blekering and major out an agreed program which will bring an end to the country's 30-day cabinet crisis.

The president acted after the National Assembly had thrown out nis fourth candidate for the lob-Radical Socialist Andre Marie sarly this morning. Marie got only 172 votes, far short of the 314 needed for investiture. Paul Reynaud, Pierre Mendes-France and Georges Bidault had been defeated before Bidault had been defeated before

The president, largely a figure-head who usually acts only as a moderator, called in 20 of the most influential deputies in the National Assembly and bluntely told them they must work out a solution among themselves.

He said "continuation of the erisis is running the cisk of damaging the republic and weakening France both in the Frech union and the world."

In the group he assembled were all the premiers since the war, men who have been nominated for the job but turned down by the National Assembly and heads of the political parties. Only the Communists were excluded.

After the verbal dressing down, President Auriol directed the 11 former premiers and defeated candidates to sit down around a table and draw up a program, in cooperation with the parties.






