WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (AP)—President Truman today sent Congress an \$85-billion spending budget, an unprecedented figure except in all-time war years, and it was a heavy burden on the price of peace.

To lawmakers, taking heed of the budget in this election year, the President outlined an \$11 billion dollar program for atomic energy facilities with \$2 billion for the fiscal year starting July 1. Mr. Truman said, beginning from a start on building the Air Force from 90 wings to 143.

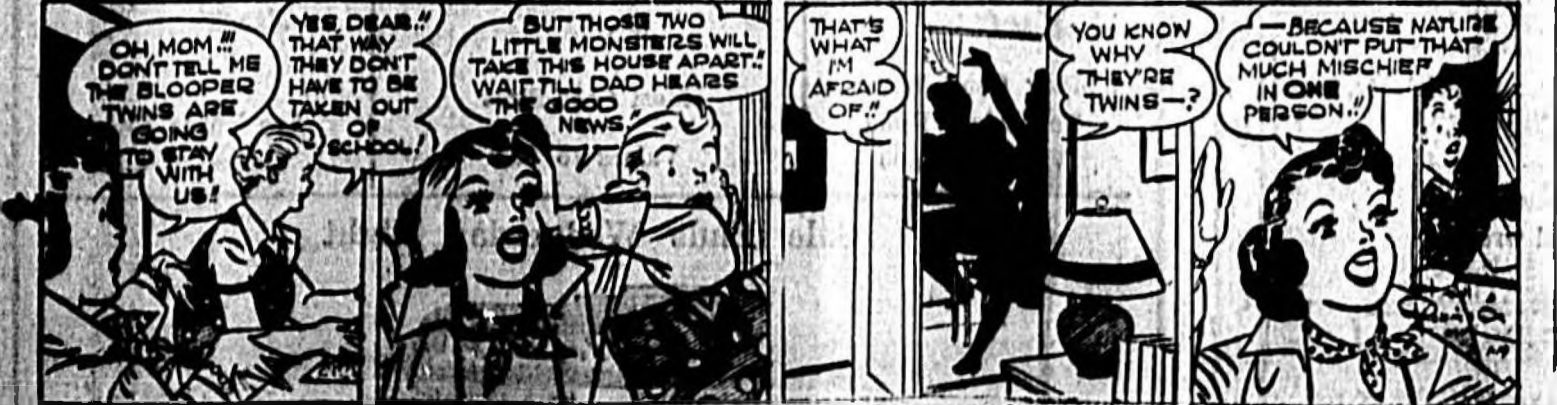

## Billion Dollar Naval Program Is Given House

Vinson Introduces

WASHINGTON—A billion dollar Navy shipbuilding bill was before Congress today, as part of President Truman's request for a 30 per cent increase in defense spending here and abroad.

The bill would authorize construction of the country's second nuclear powered submarine and its second giant aircraft carrier of nearly 60,000 tons and capable of berthing craft bearing an atomic bomb.

Mr. Truman said the increased military expenditures would help finance a 10,000 man increase in the armed forces, to 3,700,000 by June 1953, a boost by the Army, from 3,000,000 to 3,400,000, another division for the Army from 20 to 21, expanding the Marines from two divisions to three, and increasing naval forces from 200 to 210 large carriers.

WASHINGTON—John Foster Dulles told a Senate committee today no plans are being made right now for a master Pacific pact. One of the reasons for this, he said, is the "reluctance" of some Pacific nations to line up with the United States.

Dulles said, however, that he believes a Pacific pact is a good thing. Such a pact would put Far Eastern nations into a mutual defense group akin to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO).

Dulles said the security agreements represent "the only thing we could do quickly" toward setting up a Far Eastern pact.
