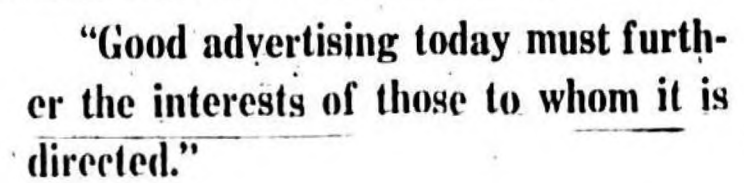

Russians Crush Nazi Infantry Attacks At Kharkov, Sevastopol

Indications Are War Machine Of Enemy Is Losing Punch; RAF Pounds Port

(By Associated Press) In the Soviet campaign, Russia's armies today beat off a series of furious new German assaults around Sevastopol and shattered tanked German infantry attacks on the Kharkov front amid indications the Nazi war machine is losing some of its knockout punch.

RAF bombers pounded the German U-boat nest at St. Nazaire and attacked airfields and railways in northern France and Belgium. No German night raiders appeared over Britain.

On Wednesday at the Sevastopol direction, German forces repelled fierce enemy attacks. In the Kharkov direction, our units fought fierce battles, destroyed 18 tanks, and killed some 1500 Germans.

The government newspaper Izvestia reported earlier that the German command had stopped the offensive at the city of the Ukraine with a normal population of 150,000, of all Soviet civilians. It said the move, revealed when the tide of battle was turning, was a desperate attempt to break the Red Army drive last month, obviously was aimed at removing the chance of a revolt by the people against their oppressors.

The Russians had charged previously that Germany had removed thousands of Ukrainians to the East for forced labor in industry and agriculture.

The high command said the Red Air Force yesterday destroyed or damaged many German trucks carrying men and material to the front, silenced seven artillery batteries, blew up six depots and one railway train, sank a torpedo boat, and dispersed five companies of infantry.

The communists said Polish patriots in Warsaw had killed a German tank and killed 10 German soldiers and nine soldiers were reported slain in a suburb of Warsaw recently, while many more were killed or wounded in an explosion at a cinema in the Polish capital.

Jap Losses In Sea Battles Are Much Heavier Than U.S.

ABOARD A FIGHTING SHIP PEARL HARBOR, June 18, (AP)—Admiral Nimitz, commander-in-chief of the Pacific fleet, said yesterday, Japanese personnel losses in the Coral Sea and Midway battles were at least 10 times greater than those of the United States and enemy plane losses were in the same proportion.

The admiral, whose masterful strategy set the stage for one of the world's greatest naval battles and utterly destroyed a formidable Japanese fleet to occupy the Hawaiian Islands, asserted in an address to the fleet the ship power "has taken the leading role in fleet engagements of the war in the Pacific and will continue to do so as the war progresses."

In an emotion stirring scene aboard this fighting ship, he declared:

"We are greatly increasing our fighting strength. Our ships, planes and pilots are being added in constantly increasing numbers. Our air will be able to organize additional (air-raft) carrier groups. Until that time, the admiral asked the fleet to hold the line until our reinforcements are ready to take over."

Florida Pipeline And Canal Bill Passes In House

Fate Of Measure In Senate Is Reported To Be Uncertain

MIAMI, June 18, (AP)—A loaded gasoline barge, in a trial run to test the value of the South Florida route canal was towed from the coast to the city of Miami in 36 hours. It was announced today.

WASHINGTON, June 18, (AP)—The House passed and sent to the Senate Wednesday a bill authorizing construction of a canal and an oil pipeline across Florida, a pipeline from Savannah, Ga., to Tinley, Ill., and enlargement of the Gulf Intracoastal waterway.

Passage on a voice vote came after a motion to recommmit the bill was defeated on a roll-call vote announced as 208 to 134 and adoption of an amendment authorizing construction of the line from the Savannah (Ga.) to Tinley, Ill.

Authorized cost of the total project was \$23,000,000.

Fate of the measure in the Senate is uncertain. The Senate Commerce Committee has pending two bills by Senator Pepper to build a Florida pipeline and to deepen the waterway from Miami to Jacksonville. When the measures later were brought up they were laid aside on objections of some committee members that interested shippers could not be presented. They may be brought up next week.

The faculty on the program of the short course is outstanding and will include some of the foremost physicians and surgeons in the United States. Among them will be Dr. R. W. Wilkins, Assistant Professor of Medicine, Boston University; Dr. Alton Coleman, Professor of Surgery, Tulane University; Dr. Nicholas J. Eisenman, Professor of Obstetrics, Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine; Dr. Harold E. Hareless, New York Hospital; Dr. Theodore L. Montgomery, Professor of Gynecology, Temple University, Philadelphia; and Dr. Austin P. Bergson, Director, Division of Venereal Diseases, Medical Center, U. S. Public Health Service, Hot Springs.

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Chinese Lose Hold On Vital Supply Line

(By Associated Press) The announcement that Col. Caleb Haynes, North Carolina colonel of the battle of Burma, has been appointed chief of the United States bomber command in China today indicated a new American force will soon be in action.

Other reports indicated that the Japanese were transferring planes and the Netherlands East Indies, where major operations have ended, but also Burma, where every available bomber and fighter plane would seem to be needed for operations in India after the monsoon or for pressing the drive up the Burma road into China.

These are reinforcing the 33 divisions perhaps more than 50,000 men, already already placed in Manchuria to strike at the Russians.

Those who are convinced that Japan is about to launch an offensive in the north offer the following arguments:

1 The Japanese fear that the Washington Moscow agreement on the opening of a second front in Europe this year may upraise Russian assistance against Japan in the future.

2 Tokyo's best move to keep Germany in the war would be to open up a new front in the Far East.

3 The Allies have become too strong in Australia and India for Japan to attempt invasion.

4 Japan's conquests in southeast Asia are useless as long as Russia's maritime power threatens her homeland.
