



"This country is in deadly peril", writes J. Edgar Hoover, chief G-Man, head of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, "We can win this war, and still lose freedom for all in America. For a creeping rot of moral disintegration is eating into our nation".

Mr. Hoover has reference to juvenile delinquency which every thoughtful person recognizes is the paramount prob-lem of our domestic front. "I am not easily shocked nor easily alarmed", continues Mr. Hoover, who has been a criminal investigator all his adult life. "But today, like thousands of others, I am both shocked and alarmed".

He mentions a number of cases which have gained na-tionwide notoriety involving almost unspeakable orimes committed by 'teen-age' boys and girls. (He nites itstiffs its which show that assaults, drunkenness, murder and rape are increasing among the younger generation at an astounding rate. He points out that crime among girls is increasing faster than among boys.

For all this he lays the blame directly at the door of the parents. It is part and parcel of a policy which started about the time of the last war and reached the height of the ridiculous during the next two decades. It is the lunacy of child psychologists who say that children should be permitted absolute freedom of self-expression, that they should not be curbed or inhibited, that grandpa's doctrine of "spare the rod and spoil the child" was a relic of barbarism.

"And that, I insist", says Mr. Hoover, "is the kind of crackpot theory which has laid the groundwork for our present surge of 'teen-age trouble. For years, we have istened to some quack theorists and pseudo-psychologists who have preached that discipline and control were bad for children-that they should be left uninhibited to work out their own life patterns, their own self-discipline. But you don't acquire self-discipline if you never learn what disci-pline is: neither can life's problems be worked out without experience which can be secured only through hard knocks

or by guidance from the experience of others".

Mr. Hoover insists he does not blame the youngsters for all the trouble they are getting into. "I am trying to ut the blame where it belongs", he says, "on my own generation, which has failed in its responsibility to its children. We failed in the years before the war, in that we let discipline slide, some deliberately as a matter of "theory", the est of us thoughtlessly, because it was the trend of the

"Obviously", he continues, "wartime conditions call for extra guidance, extra control, extra discipline. Parents should take stock of discipline-or the lack of it-in their families, and consider how it might be improved or tightened up. They should follow definite rules as to what young people may do, where they may go, and when-determined by the standard of whether or not it is good for the child. They should insist on obedience, and not shy
