# Personnel issues spark heated debate

## Longwood commissioners discuss pay raises for public safety workers

**LONGWOOD** — Longwood's battle of the budget shifted focus late Monday night from hiring additional fire and police personnel to raising salaries to a level that would stem the city's exodus of public safety workers for bigger paychecks.

In a lengthy verbal debate among board members that pushed Monday's meeting well past midnight, commissioners shifted gears over an earlier decision and wound up voting 3-1 to hire

three additional firefighters but no new police officers. A month ago commissioners gave preliminary approval to hire two more police officers, consider the possible hiring of an additional two, and gave a "maybe" nod to adding three more firefighters to the 2000-2001 spending plan.

The board shifted its priorities following a lengthy statistical presentation by Public Safety Director Terry Baker.

"I don't support 100 percent of the suggestion to hire four more police officers," Baker told board members. "I'm more concerned with the pay scale for our current staff and all city employees."

Baker presented the commission with statistical evidence that report-writing and response calls by the city's police department had experienced a sharp spike increase in the past two years, but acknowledged the spike was at least partly attributable to traffic citations issued during major road construction on U.S. Highway 17-92 and the fact that the department now filed written reports on all response calls.

"At this time and for the next year, I feel we have enough officers on the street

# School board mulls free computer deal

**SANFORD** — Some Seminole County schools may get computer upgrades next year.

The ZAPMEI Corporation is offering the school system a free 15-station computer lab in each high school and middle school in Seminole County. The labs will include hardware, software, training and technical support.

However, several School Board members questioned during Monday's meeting why the corporation was offering the free computers.

"There is always concern when people say it's free," Board Chairman Sandra Robinson said. "What's the motivation?"

According to George Kosmac,

computer technology specialist for the school system, sponsorship advertisements will appear on each screen while students are using the computers. The advertisements are non-intrusive and must follow strict guidelines.

The school system is required to make a three-year commitment guaranteeing the labs will be used at least four hours a day, Kosmac said. However, after discussing the contract with a ZAPMEI representative, he said if the school system is not satisfied with the program, the computers can "be unplugged and put in a corner."

"The word 'use' had a broad meaning," he said.

The labs will have a limited function, provide filtered access

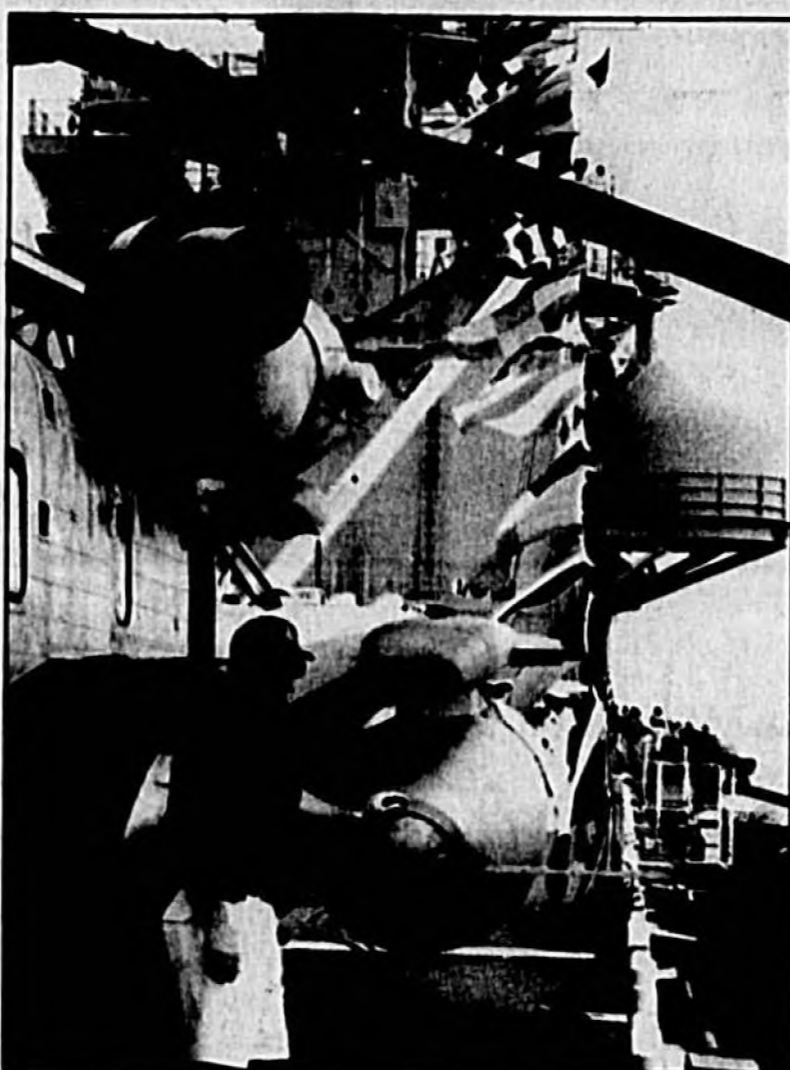
## Lake Mary Police Chief invited to International Naval Review

**LAKE MARY** — The Fourth of July was a very special day for Police Chief Richard Beary.

While many people were enjoying fireworks displays and backyard barbecues, Beary was aboard the USS Nassau watching President Clinton arrive in New York harbor for the sixth International Naval Review (INR) 2000. The by-invitation-only event also gave the police chief "the chance of a lifetime" to shake hands with the commandant of the U.S. Marines, Gen. James Jones.

"I got the invitation in the mail just a short while before the event was going to happen," Beary said. "After I picked myself off the floor from the surprise, I thought, This is really an invitation to the

International Naval Review." In 1996, Congress passed a joint resolution directing the U.S. Navy to conduct an International Naval Review in observance of the millennium. On July 4, President Clinton reviewed nearly 40 naval ships

from 24 nations, including nine of the most technologically advanced warships in the U.S. Navy. Along with the Review, more than 100 tall ships from dozens of countries participated in Operation Sail.

# Adams throws hat in ring for District 3 race

**SANFORD** — If Win Adams has guessed correctly, politics is the art of the possible. Adams, 58, has decided to make another run at the Seminole County Commission.

He filed papers Monday at the Elections Office to try for the District 3 seat held by Dick Van Der Weide, who is seeking a third term.

Adams is running despite the fact Van Der Weide has nearly \$70,000 in his war chest after spending nearly \$30,000. Adams must qualify for the race by

Friday, which in his case requires a \$2,525.92 fee — one-fourth the current annual salary for a county commissioner (\$63,148).

"Dick Van Der Weide isn't going to buy this election," Adams said Monday. "It isn't for sale. The people are going to decide this."

Adams also said he was running.

# State OKs vouchers for disabled students

**SANFORD** — A law passed this spring provides additional options for parents of children with disabilities regarding the school their children attend.

The state Legislature this spring approved a law which enables parents to receive full scholarships for private schools if they believe their children do not receive adequate service in public schools.

Unlike the state's controversial two-year-old A+ education plan, the public school does not

need to receive an F on the state's annual accountability report for the vouchers to be awarded.

"What it does is give parents a choice if they feel the needs of their child are not being met," said Tom McDowell, executive director of Exceptional Student Education for the Seminole County school district.

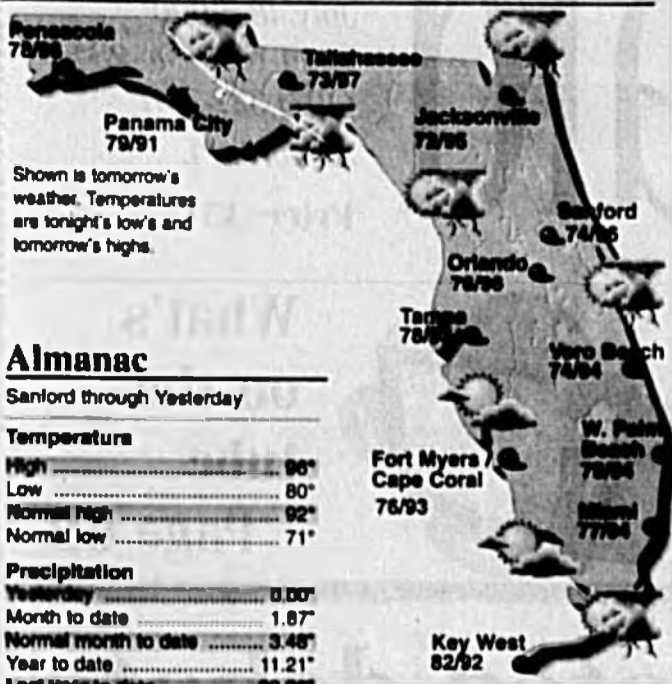
Student are eligible if their academic progress in at least two areas must fall to meet state standards; or if the student has performed below grade level on

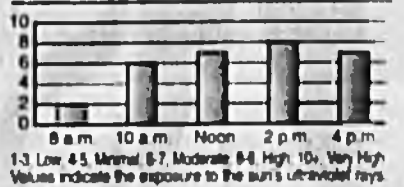

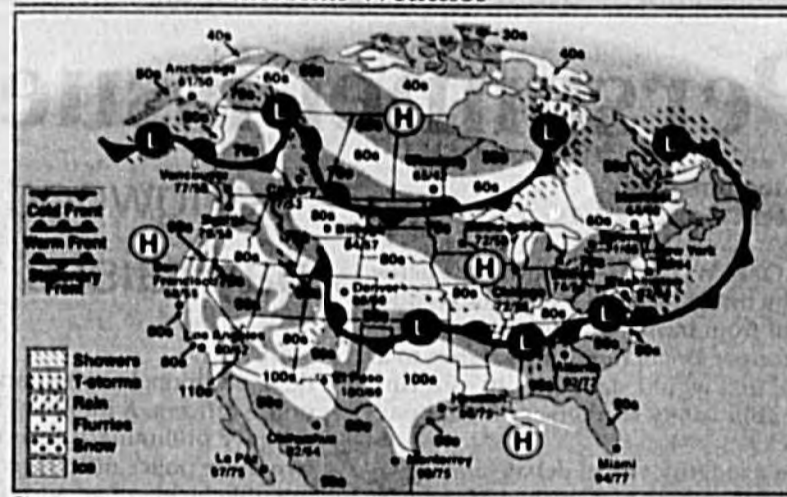

## Beyond 55, learn to drive to survive

There was a fellow I met a few years ago who was driving a car at 100. That was his age not how fast he was going. He went out once or twice a week — provided he could find his car keys.

Florida, of course, has oodles of older drivers.

"People complain we drive too slow," said Peter Oliva, who is 77. "The truth is we observe the speed limit but that doesn't satisfy those who are complaining."

Oliva, a resident of Casselberry, is the associate state coordinator for the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) 55-ALIVE Mature Driving Program. He's trying to get older motorists to take an eight-hour program designed to give them better "defensive" road skills.

In other words, to help them stay alive through the madness of drivers not as mature as they are.

"There's more to it than just driving safely," Oliva said Monday. "As we get older we have to be more conscious than ever. It's not that we don't drive well, it's that we may not see or expect what some other drivers may be doing. Been on Interstate-4 lately? It's a battlefield. Cars going in and out at high speeds."

We wonder, of course, what are these drivers thinking? And what are they drinking?

If you check the DUI reports for the county, younger drivers outnumber seniors by a wide margin. You find kids 18 and 19 in the reports, others in their 20s, 30s, 40s, some 50s. Most are pulled over between 11 p.m. and 2 a.m.

Upon hitting the 60 mark, I'm in no hurry to go travel

beyond my years — nor drive in the dark. I don't like what's happened on the road. Every time someone gets a DUI, I imagine 10 other worse drunks don't get caught. Each is a potential killer.

I hope senior drivers take notice of the AARP Mature Driving Program that is being offered in Seminole County. We may not be the ones causing accidents, but we need to know how to compensate for the loss of our own hand-eye skills and poorer eye-sight. Plus, seniors who complete the program may be eligible for discounts from their insurance company.

"This is no time for any of us to be day dreaming," Peter Oliva said. "A lot has changed since we started driving. The cell phones, for instance. Sure, some of us think that having one is a good thing in case we have trouble. Talking on them when we're driving isn't good. We've got enough to do just driving."

The AARP driving programs will be offered in late August and early September in Winter Springs, Lake Mary and Altamonte Springs. For information on these courses, the number to call is (407) 351-0932.

## Seashore Paspalum: A new warm-season grass for Florida lawns

Seashore paspalum is a warm-season grass and grows naturally in coastal environments. It also grows well in areas that receive heavy rains and low light intensity.

It grows best during warm temperatures and long day conditions. This grass does not produce viable seed and therefore must be planted as sod, plugs, or sprigs. It looks similar in appearance to hybrid bermudagrass, producing a high-quality, prostrate and dense turf.

### Fertilization

Seashore paspalum responds well to low levels of fertility in the soil after established. In central Florida, 2 to 3 pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet per year will produce a high quality turf. It is best to apply fertilizer in small amounts from late March or early April through August.

If needed, apply phosphorus at to the amount of nitrogen levels on your fertilizer. Potassium requirements are also to the levels of nitrogen but may be higher during rainy periods, when potassium can be leached through the soil.

Additional quantities of potassium may be needed if salt-water intrusion or storm surge problems occur.

### Mowing

Seashore paspalum used in home lawns should be mowed at 0.75 to 1.5 inches in height. Higher mowing heights will reduce turfgrass density and increase weed problems. Mower blades should be kept sharp to avoid tearing leaf tissue.

Never remove more than 1/3 of the leaf blade at any one time. If the lawn is under stress from drought, shade, nutrient deficiencies, insects, or diseases, it is best to maintain a higher cutting height until the stress situation is over.

Do not mow when the grass is wet or the soil soggy. Grass clippings can be left on the lawn.

### Weed Control

Current herbicides are generally not labeled for seashore paspalum. Herbicides that do not injure this grass include pendimethalin, halosulfuron, and mixtures of 2,4-D, dicamba, and MCPP.

### Irrigation

Apply to inches of water only when grass shows signs of water stress.

### Pests and Diseases

There are no important pest or disease problems on this grass.

### Advantages

This grass has an excellent tolerance to saline or recycled water, to the point that it can be watered with seawater. It has a good drought tolerance under proper management and will tolerate low levels of fertility.

It will grow in a wide range of soil pH, from a very acid 4 to a highly alkaline 9. It requires little or no pesticide applications and produces minimal quantities of seed-heads.

### Disadvantages

This grass produces moderate amounts of thatch during periods of active growth and does not grow well under shade.

### Varieties

At the present time, there are only three varieties available for use in your home lawn.

Sea Isle 1, released by the University of Georgia in 1999, is a dense growing selection from Argentina, which has fine leaves. It has a good tolerance to drought and wear, that under moderate fertility rates produces an excellent lawn that can be used in commercial, residential landscapes and even athletic fields.

Salam and ET are two varieties of seashore paspalum released by private companies.

### Establishment

The best time for establishment of this grass is during periods of most active growth, which occurs when temperatures exceed 70 degrees. Optimal soil pH is 5.5 to 8.0 for best growth.

To encourage root development, phosphorus should be applied at rates equal to or greater than the nitrogen.

Potassium needs are also greater during the establishment period. Use a 1:2:3 fertilizer ratio of N:P:K in biweekly applications to provide good fertility levels.

## Beep doesn't always register

DEAR ABBY: Have you noticed how often people fail to get out of the way of electric cars used to transport people who can't walk long distances at airports? It isn't pure cussedness. It's because the "warning beep" used by these carts is near a sound frequency that cannot be easily processed by the human ear. (See "How We Localize Sound" by W.M. Hartmann in the November 1999 issue of Physics Today.) Thus, airline commuters cannot tell where the sound is coming from, which is hazardous to both walkers and riders.

This is actually a common engineering blunder. The "beep" to announce an incoming taxi on a computer modem and the beep of a modern range timer are both typically at a pitch just above the hearing range of a host of older people. The back-up beeper on trucks and heavy equipment is also in the same frequency range. (The higher sound frequencies are usually the first to go.) We all know that engineers are set in their ways, but perhaps a wake-up call from you will jolt them out of their ruts. JACK SALISBURY, PALM COAST, FLA.

DEAR JACK: Yes, I have observed pedestrians failing to get out of the way of carts at airports — but I had assumed it was because they were electric vehicles and didn't make much noise. Of course, the drivers of those vehicles usually wind up warning pedestrians

to "step aside!" However, assuming that engineers responsible for designing modern equipment are younger people in full possession of all their faculties, your letter should serve as a reminder that our population is aging, a condition frequently accompanied by some degree of hearing loss.

to maintain our level of service," he told the commission. "Longwood is facing the same problem all police agencies throughout the U.S. are facing — we can't retain the officers we've spent money and time on in training and equipment expenses.

"We can't blame police officers for leaving when they can earn substantially more elsewhere."  
Baker lobbied the board hard to focus budget consideration on increasing pay for current police and fire personnel to a more competitive level.

"We are getting hurt particularly hard with employees that have been here for five years or longer," Baker said. "It hurts when we lose mid-range staff because on average we've spent \$14,000 per officer in training time and equipment only to see them leave."

"What you are telling this board is that the major problem is not the number of police, but Longwood's ability to retain them?" asked Commissioner Butch Bundy of Baker's presentation.

"Yes. I would love to have four more police officers, but when it comes to that point, I'll notify you," Baker said.

In a lengthy debate that swayed back and forth between additional hiring and increasing pay for current employees, City Administrator John Drago pointed out the commission was taking a different path to budget formulation compared to last year.

"You are doing the budget different this year over last year," Drago said. "A year ago we set the millage rate and then you added additional personnel. This year personnel issues have come before millage rate adoption. I can factor in two

police officers, four police officers, three fireman, no firemen or any combination of the above, but I need to know."  
Drago suggested a police division study should be conducted to justify hiring more police.

"The city is above the level of service called for in Longwood's Comprehensive Plan," Drago said. "I've never been a big fan of equating statistical data with manpower levels. My recommendation is to put money in the budget to do a study of the risk level in the community."

At one point during the debate, when discussions meandered from staffing levels to pay increases, an exasperated Baker told the board, "This is going totally backwards. You asked me for my recommendations and my recommendation is to

concentrate on pay inequities." Commissioners Dan Anderson and John Maingot agreed with Baker.

"We can't put a numeric value on a trained officer in terms of dollars and cents," Maingot said. "Unless we improve pay of current staff, we could hire four this year and turn around and lose six next year because of pay issues."

Mayor Paul Lovestrand said his biggest concerns were that the city's police union had yet to approve the hiring of three firefighters.

Bundy cast the dissenting vote, siding with Drago's original manpower suggestions and said he favored holding the line on hiring in lieu of increasing pay to a competitive level for current police and fire personnel.

to the Internet and use Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint. No other software can be added to the system.

The labs will be on a stand-alone network, connected to the Internet via a roof mounted satellite dish at each school. There will be no connection to the school or district network.

Kosmac said the school system is currently considering not giving students e-mail access.

"We don't want any inappropriate communication," he said.

Kosmac said the value of the equipment and software for each lab is \$28,000. Installation and services, including satellite communication and support, are also provided at no cost.

The ZAPME Corporation will also provide home to school connection, college and career information and a teacher's toolbox in

each lab.

In return, each school must provide a secure, supervised area containing appropriate furniture and electrical wiring.

Kosmac said he has talked to representatives from two school systems, including Monroe and Hernando, who have implemented and are satisfied with the ZAPME program.

If contract negotiations are successful with the ZAPME Corporation, the school system would like to begin the program by installing labs in two schools.

Also during the meeting:

• The School Board agreed not to accept the low and sole bid of \$100,100 from IRN of Central Florida Inc. for the Velma Mitchell Annex property. In March, the board approved a resolution declaring the property surplus. The parcel of land was appraised to have a fair market

value of \$435,000, and the staff recommended the Board reject the one offer because there was no competitive bidding and the offer is far below market value. The property will continue to be marketed.

• The Board approved a resolution authorizing a revenue anticipation note in an amount up to \$10 million to finance Phase B of the Lyman High School project.

• The Board scheduled two work sessions. The first work session will be held 6 p.m. July 31 in the Educational Support Center to discuss the city of Winter Springs' request to use school property for the Town Center project. The second work session will be held 4 p.m. Aug. 15 in the Educational Support Center to discuss Crooms Academy of Information Technology master plan and floor plan design review.

The INR has only been held six times, including 1893, 1907, 1957, 1976, 1986 and 2000. Although the events are open to the public, only a handful of people are invited to board one of the naval ships anchored in the harbor.

"I really don't know why I was invited," Beary said. "But, when I met Gen. Jones, I didn't ask why, I just thanked him for inviting me."

However, Beary has had a working relationship with the

U.S. Marine Corps for the past 20 years, including the recruitment and hiring of several former Marines. He has also known several of the previous commandants.

Recovered from his surprise, Beary arrived in New York on the Sunday before the event and traveled to several typical and not-so-typical tourist destinations. Along with stops at the Empire State Building and Macy's, he also visited the city's police academy.

"I couldn't be a block away

from the academy and not stop in," he said. "That would have been sacrilegious."

On July 4, Beary, along with his brother and mother, passed through a security check point and boarded a ferry at 6 a.m. to travel to the USS Nassau, a Tarawa Class Amphibious Assault Ship anchored in the harbor.

"It didn't matter if you were a law enforcement officer or a congressman, you were going to go through the secret service's metal detectors," Beary said.

"They had to make sure the president would be safe."

Once on board the naval ship, Beary had the opportunity to watch the parade of ships and see the president arrive by helicopter and land on the USS Kennedy, which was anchored right next to the USS Nassau. He also spoke with Gen. Jones and the crew aboard the ship.

"It was so motivational to talk to the young Marines who said they would give their all for this county," Beary said. "In a day of dwindling patriotism, this was a

real renewal."

Beary said he admired how Gen. Jones also spoke to each crew member on board the USS Nassau.

"For the rank and file, it is just an amazing thing to see the commandant," Beary said.

"It was amazing talking to him and seeing him interact with everyone," he said. "The whole thing was a heck of an opportunity that I will never forget."

It was also life altering. On his return to Lake Mary, Beary

announced he is running for Seminole County Sheriff against incumbent Don Eslinger.

Beary, who has been thinking about running for quite some time, said he made his final decision while standing on deck of the USS Nassau.

"During my discussion with the commandant, he told me that one trained Marine can make a difference," Beary said. "That also applies to law enforcement. One good law enforcement officer can make a difference."

ning as a non-partisan candidate. Adams served four years (1994-98) as a Republican on the County Board but was beaten for the District 4 seat in 1998 by Carlton Henley, the current County Chairman.

Van Der Weide is a Republican, as is former Altamonte Springs Mayor Dudley Bates, who left that position to run for the District 4 seat. Another candidate for the seat is Zea Proctor, a Libertine Party member.

"I'll match my accomplishments in four years to that of Dick Van Der Weide's record in eight years," Adams said. "Of course, it will be tough. It was a race before I came in here — a better one now. Don't forget, Dudley Bates is one heck of a statesman."

As a non-partisan candidate, Adams would be on the November general election ballot against either Van Der Weide or Bates. That's as it stands today. Another Republican candidate — Jim Daly of Longwood — may also for the District 3 seat.

"I'll say this about Win Adams, no one can question his work ethic," County Commissioner Randy Morris said Monday. "Win's a busy, little beaver. He'll work for this. He was a very hard working commissioner — especially his last two years."

Adams is currently employed by National Finance Resources in Altamonte Springs. His wife, Jeanne Adams, passed away three months ago after a long battle with diabetes.

state or local assessments and the parent believes that the student is not progressing adequately.

The law provides that the student must be enrolled in the same school district where the scholarship is being sought.

Private schools accepting funding for the vouchers must agree to meet state standards. So far, no private school in Seminole County has agreed to accept the vouchers, McDowell said.

School districts are obligated to offer parents an opportunity to enroll their child in another district public school, including transportation.

Parents need to notify the state Department of Education and school district of their child's acceptance to a participating private school no later than Aug. 1. There is a district cap on the number of vouchers to be awarded.

TALLAHASSEE - The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) offers to the public a new 2000 manatee decal with any \$5 donation.



The "Protect Florida's Wildlife" theme for this year's manatee decal encourages everyone to do their part in preserving the ecosystem that both man and manatee depend on for survival. The manatee decal is available at the county tax collectors offices throughout the state. The 2000 manatee decal artwork was created by Dawn "Spider" Warren.

A native of Columbus, Spider painted southwestern art and wildlife illustrations in the past. After moving to Florida, an opportunity to paint the environmental artwork was offered to her. She spent six months in Dallas, Texas, and spent six months in Florida with manatees and eventually learned the artwork to support this cause.

The full color decal is rectangular and is designed to stick to boats and other vehicles. Spider's artwork, the best of the year's manatee decal has the "Protect Florida's Wildlife" caption and the resource protection number 1-800-DIAL-FWP.

"Donations benefit manatee protection efforts and are essential to the recovery of the endangered manatee. These funds support research and education programs and help pay for the cost of the decal. ## Gruden will join Sunshine Network for UCF Football

ORLANDO - Jay Gruden, head coach of the Arena Football League's Orlando Predators, will be Sunshine Network's analyst on live coverage of University of Central Florida football games this fall.

Gruden has been the head coach of the Predators for the past three seasons, and led the team to an AFL Championship in 1998.

Before joining Orlando, Gruden served as offensive coordinator for the Nashville Kats, where he led them to a Division championship. When he was named Orlando's head coach in 1997, Gruden became the youngest head coach in the AFL. One season later, he became the most successful rookie coach in league history as he led the Predators to a 12-5 record and an ArenaBowl XII victory.

As a quarterback, Gruden began his professional career with the Arizona Cardinals in 1989. He spent time with the World League of American Football, before signing with the Tampa Bay Storm in 1991.

He had his greatest amount of success as the signal caller for the Storm, where he set Arena League records for career pass completions, passing yards and passing touchdowns. He led the Storm to four World Championships and was named league MVP in 1992. With Gruden under center, the Storm compiled the best six-year winning percentage in AFL history.

As a heralded quarterback at the University of Louisville, under legendary head coach Howard Schnellenberger, Gruden set school passing marks in practically every statistical category, and was named team MVP following the 1987 and 1988 seasons.

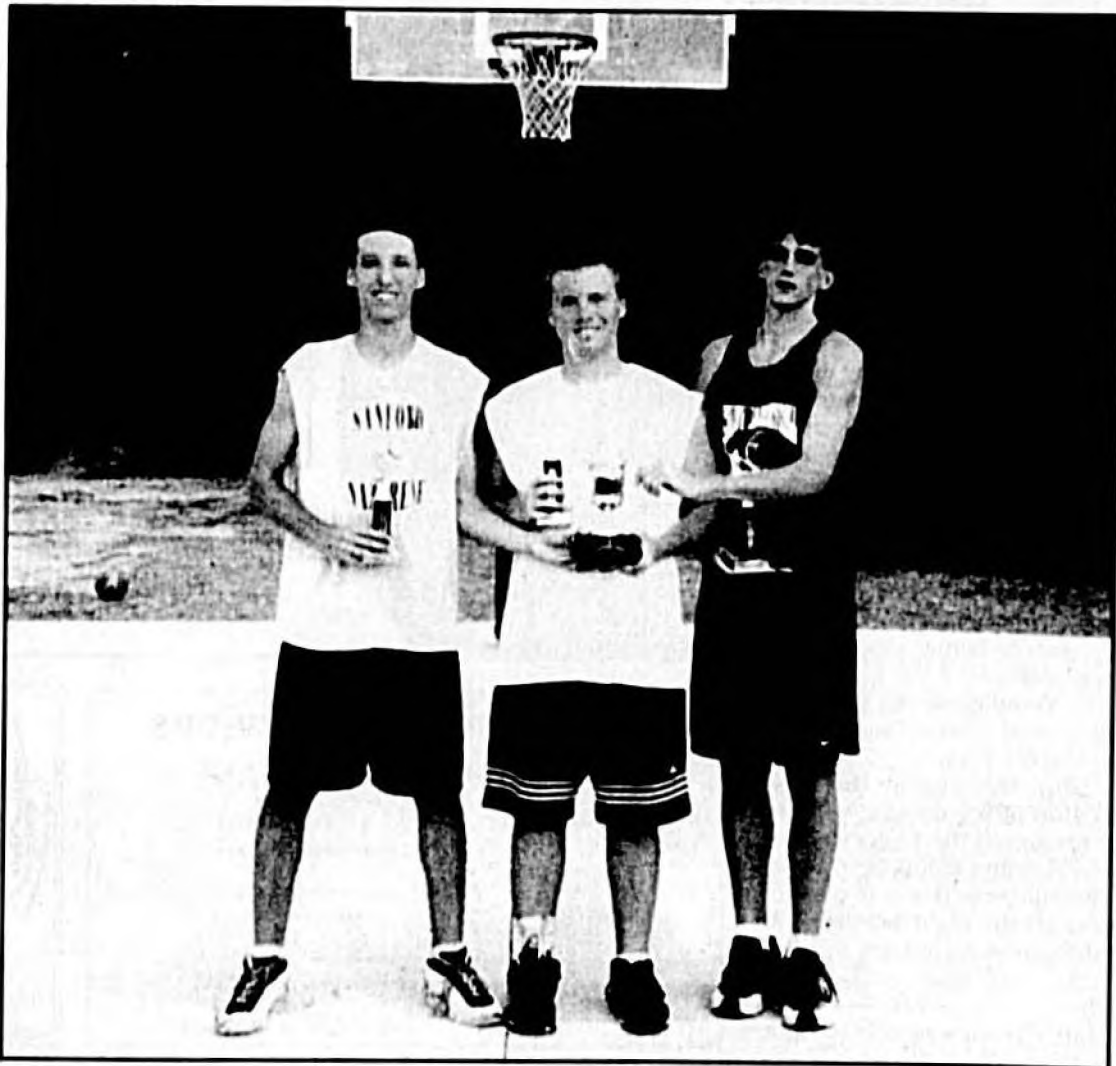

of Puzzle Lake. Low water levels are making bass very easy to locate and catch. These river bass tend to bunch up in holding areas such as deep bays, creek mouths, sandbars and other irregular features. They will hit a wide variety of lures such as topwater, plastic worms, and small rapalas.

Sebastian Inlet has big king mackerel just off the beach and good catch-and-release snook action in the inlet. Also expect flounder, trout, and a few redfish.

## Captain Jack at Port

Canaveral reports that king mackerel are just off the beach and the buoy line. Cobia and king mackerel can be found on Pelican Flats and 8 A reefs. Look for sheepshead and flounder inside the Port, while trout and redfish are rated as fair in the Banana and Indian Rivers.

Ponce Inlet has good action with sheepshead, drum, redfish, jack crevalle and ladyfish. Live or dead shrimp are the top baits. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.
