WASHINGTON (AP) - Congressional hearings on the Wounded Knee affair open today. Militant Indians refused over the weekend to surrender their arms and peace talks were broken off between protest leaders and

The House Indian affairs subcommittee has scheduled three days of hearings on the seizure of the historic South Dakota reservation village by members of the American Indian Movement


(AIM). Hearings also will cover occupation of the Bureau of Indian affairs building in Washington last year.

Russell Means, leader of the Wounded Knee group, was to be the main witness today. Rep. Lloyd Meeds, D-Wash., chairman of the panel, said the hearings will be the prelude to a lengthy investigation of the relationship between Indians and the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

Means arrived Friday for what was scheduled to be a negotiating session with Leonard Garment, special consultant to the President. But telephoned Wounded Knee to tell his followers to lay down their arms. Means refused.

The government contends that under an agreement reached at Wounded Knee last Thursday, Means was to have made the call once his meeting with Garment began. Means said no such agreement was reached.

A six-point agreement negotiated by the Justice Department with Means and others was supposed to have cleared the way for disar-



Al Fatah Founder Slain

Israel Pierces Heart Of Lebanon

Associated Press Writer

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Israeli commandos invaded the heart of the Lebanese capital early today, killing three Palestinian guerrilla leaders in their apartments and attacking refugee camps.

It was thought at first that the raid was in retaliation for Arab attacks Monday in Cyprus on the residence of the Israeli ambassador and an Israeli airliner. But an authoritative Lebanese source said there were indications that preparations had been made by an advance

Al Fatah, the biggest Palestinian guerrilla organization, said the victims included its No. 2 man, Mohammed Yussef Najjar, known as Abu Yussef. He was one of the founders of Al Fatah. The Lebanese Defense Ministry said 11 persons were killed and more than a dozen wounded in the strike that began shortly after midnight. The statement indicated the casualty total might

The Israeli military command said the raiders' only casualties were four wounded. Another group of Israeli commandos blew up a Beirut, but there were no casualties there. The Israelis said the garage was used by guerrillas. President Suleiman Franjieh held an emergency session of the Lebanese Cabinet, and a protest to the U.N. Security Council was

believed imminent. The Israelis, some dressed in civilian clothes and some in fatigue uniforms, apparently landed by helicopter at Ouzai, a village three miles south of Beirut, and split into two groups. Boarding unlicensed cars, one party headed for the center of the city and the apartments of

So far we have only hearsay evidence to suggest that former Attorney General John Mitchell and perhaps White House assistant H. R. (Bob) Haldeman might have played "directional" roles in one or more of these enterprises. Proofs are altogether lacking. Yet the evidence is of course strong that lesser White House and Nixon Re-election Committee aides were in volved, and three already have been convicted of complicity in the Watergate bugging case. This carries with it a presumption of high-aide involvement and raises the big question about the President's own possible knowl-

edge of these matters. If it turns out high aides were involved, how could he The answer, and it is rooted in the aforementioned theory, is that Richard Nixon works in a personal isolation that is so extreme as to be beyond the understanding of most men-including many in the White House

Washington today is sprinkled with a surprising number of Nixon critics who stop short of asserting that he must have known of this unsavory business if key aides gave it guidance. But they do not stress the isolation And those who do think the President had to know appear to rest their judgment in conventional no tions which do not seem to fit him at all. For instance, it is an easy jump for a good many people

to assume that if a man is described as a "confidant" of the President, he naturally has at least fairly continuous and reasonably intimate access to him. In the view of one significant private source, this assumption is "entirely wrong." The man adds: 'This fellow (Nixon) doesn't talk to anybody that way.

Nobody has that kind of relationship with him." Haldeman, in effect guarding the door to the President's office and generally thought to have the chief say as to whom he sees, is perceived as the most logical candidate for "confidant" in the conventional sense. The News Revelation of tortures the North Vietnamese employed @ against U.S. servicemen they held captive should add to the determination of Congress not to approve President Nixon's \$2.5 billion aid program for Hanoi.

In any case, the proposed assistance to the tyrannical North Vietnamese government, which has ignored key ceasefire rules, is an act of political tribute uncharacteristic of the United States throughout its history. The idea of aiding North Nietnam is morally offensive. Smith Hempstone, chief editorial writer of the

Washington Star-News, has rightly said that the aid program "means that part of the federal income tax of Navy Lt. Everett Alvarez Jr., who for more than eight years refused to give the North Vietnamese more than his name, rank and serial number, will be earmarked for the rebuilding of his captors' country, a country against which nearly 46,000 other imericans died fighting.

The administration is trying to sell the program on the grounds that the U.S. aided the defeated Germans and Italians after World War II. But this is a false analogy. The Nazi and Fascist governments were crushed. The U.S. sought to build free political institutions in the former Axis countries. In the case of North Vietnam, the U.S. would be lavishing money on a cruel totalitarian government committed to aggression in Southeast Asia. Al Crawford, in an article prepared for the Educational

"Why, voters are rightfully asking, spend as much in the next four years to rebuild the war-making potential of North Vietnam as the Soviet Union poured into it in the last four years to wage war against the South? Why rebuild North Vietnam's industrial capabilities at all? Why not let those who supplied North Vietnam with weapons take the initiative of rebuilding their own allies?"


The administration cannot justify putting Hanoi on the U.S. payroll, especially at a time when the President is rightly insisting that federal spending must be curbed. The White House must be compelled to accept the illogic of its position, the contradiction between calls for economy at home and demands for money to reconstruct North Nietnam The aid proposals doesn't make sense on any basis, certainly

not as a peace-keeping measure. As the Virginia Taxpayers Association has noted, the U.S. won't be safer as the result of an effort to "bribe a bandit country into being 'good' for a little while." U.S. Rep. James Broyngill (R-Va.) undoubtedly ex-

pressed the views of millions of Americans when he said that the accounts of North Vietnamese tortures "convince me that not a cent of American aid should be spent on rehabilitating a country that is apparently run by savages. Henry Kissinger apparently sold the Hanoi aid proposal to President Nixon. But Kissinger's advice is politically dangerous, as well as economically, strategically and morally mistaken. President Nixon would be well-advised to back away from Kissinger's scheme.

The opposition to aiding Hanoi, which is evident in the Congress, is of a grassroots character. Americans don't want to reward the moral moral monsters in charge in Hanoi, the

Agencies Probe Oviedo Pollution

State and county pollution control authorities are investigating reports that two small streams flowing through the Oviedo Oaks subdivision at Oviedo are polluted with 70 per cent human and animal fecal material.

The investigation started this week when the Oviedo Oaks Civic Association reported to pollution control officials results of federal laboratory tests on water samples from the

Seminole County pollution control officer Langley Adair said red dye is being used in septic tank drain fields in both Mead Manor and

"We also are doing some bacteriological samplings," Adair said. The ditches in question flow eventually into Sweetwater Creek. "So if people find the creek

turns red they shouldn't disturbed." Adair said.

pollution to its sources.

Joel Kimery, head of the U. S. Geological Survey's Winter Park water resources bureau,

said the federal agency tested water samples from the Oviedo Oaks streams and found "a high fecal coliform count."

Oviedo Mayor Leon Oliff said this morning he has received a copy of the homeowners letter to pollution control authorities. He said the city council hasn't seen the three-page letter yet but he will distribute copies at a special call council

Oliff said he doen't expect any discussion of the letter, however, until Monday's regular

"I don't know of any action we can take. Oliff said, "since we have no control over septic tanks." The city of Oviedo has no sewage treatment plant of collection systems.

Dr. Tom Morgan, president of the Oviedo Oaks Civic Association, said the streams are connected to ponds in the Mead Manor sub-
