## Two Peace Moves Made To Stop Russo-Finnish War

League Of Nations  
Machinery Set In  
Motion By Finnish  
Arbitration Plea

Russia Hindered  
By Falling Snow

Roman Crowd Demons-  
trates In Favor  
Of Baltic Republic

Two peace moves were  
foot to end hostilities on the  
snowy northern battlefields  
where Finnish-Russian fighting  
has drawn the world's  
attention from the stalemate  
of Western Front war.

League of Nations machinery  
was set in motion for arbitration  
on the demand of Finland.

The Swedish legation in Moscow  
was asked by Finland on the possi-  
bility of peace without violating  
the "independence and vital  
interests of Finland."

The Soviet press denied Russia  
intended to convert Finland into a dependency and attacked  
Britain, France and the United  
States' attitudes toward the war.

Russia reported the capture  
of five islands in the Gulf of  
Finland and continued land ad-  
vances in Karelia, Isthmian  
North of Leningrad. Three  
land Soviet soldiers were said  
by frontier dispatches to have  
been captured by Finns.

Clifford Nichols pleaded guilty

Heavy Russian casualties were  
reported by the Finnish high com-  
mand which said land mines,  
machine gunners, and ice  
coating on many frontier  
lakes caused a growing toll.

Some Gavels observers said  
sudden League activity looked as  
though League members were  
eager to force Russia to arbit-  
rate or withdraw from the  
League.

Reprisal from the Finnish-Soviet  
conflict sounded in Rome  
where a crowd demonstrated in  
front of the Finnish legation,  
cheering Finland and boozing  
Russia.

Britain and France started a  
joint blockade of all German ex-  
ports. Britain said its German  
merchant ships have been put  
out of action since the war started  
in Germany and Britain.

Conflicting versions of the British  
air raid on Hans Island Sunday.  
Britain said "direct hits" were  
scored on warships. Germany  
said only a "little fishing boat"  
was hit by a bomb. The  
British reported a German sub-  
marine was sunk by a bomb in  
the North Sea.

In Tokyo the United States  
Ambassador conferred with the  
Japanese Foreign Minister who  
was reported to have presented  
tentative formula for the  
settlement of their problems. King  
George landed in France from  
a British destroyer to make a  
conference on Paris Day.

**Government Wins  
Anti-Trust Cases**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—(AP)—  
The government won its Supreme  
Court effort to prosecute anti-  
trust proceedings charging a group  
of corporations, organizations and  
individuals with conspiracy to fix  
steel prices, control supply and  
suppress competition in a Chicago  
area.

Chief Justice Hughes delivered the opinion on the litigation—  
one of the most important of the Department of Justice in the recent  
history of the country.

Other cases against Agricultural  
Marketing Agency, American  
Cottonseed Oil Company, and

favor of the government.

## Scandinavia Makes Moves Toward Peace

Norway, Sweden, Denmark Alarmed Over Russian Invasion; Swedes Mobilizing

## Soviet Renews Bombing Attacks

Norway Calls Conference Of Northern Nations Thursday

Embassy Finland's Plight Under the Russian Invasion Stirred Her Alarmed Scandinavian Neighbors to New Peace Efforts and Preparations Against War Today.

Sweden called about 40,000 more men to the colors bringing its armed forces to 150,000. Norway invited the foreign ministers of Sweden and Denmark to a conference Thursday on ways of bringing peace between Russia and Finland. Both accepted.

Rejecting participation in the League of Nations meeting on Finland's arbitration appeal, Russia reported Soviet troops were continuing into Finland from the south and north.

Russian bombing operations were renewed after a lull because of bad weather. Finland rushed fortification of the Åland Islands to keep open sea communications with Sweden, a vital route if aid is given by the Scandinavian nations.

Soviet Premier Molotoff construed the Geneva bid as an insult, and said the Soviet is not a state or race with Finland. A brief anti-Soviet demonstration in ten days occurred in Moscow, where demonstrators, shouting "Death to the Comintern," gathered before the Soviet embassy.

Britain counted new maritime losses. The German pocket battleship Admiral Scheer was credited with sinking the 10,086-ton refrigerator ship Doric Star, loaded with meat, in the South Atlantic.

Artillery fire enlivened an otherwise dull day on the West Coast. Finland, the Soviet sank back. The Soviet by air bombardment at Valdiki, the Baltic port Russia leased from Estonia. This was unconfirmed.

Norwegian-Finnish frontier dispatches told of unconfirmed reports that 60 Russian planes were destroyed by Finnish flares.
