Dollar Plunges In Markets

After Diplomats Escape

LONDON (UPI) - Gold speculators returned and the U.S. dollar plunged on world money markets today in response to the OPEC oil price increases and the possibility of reprisals from Iran for the escape of six

The United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Kuwait and Iraq increased their crude rates Tuesday by \$1 per barrel, retroactive to Jan. 1.

Shortly afterward, news broke that Canadian Embassy officials in Iran hid six American diplomats for the past three months and helped them escape this

Within hours of the two announcements, the price of gold shot up \$86 to \$721 an ounce at the opening of the Hong Kong market. Gold closed in Hong Kong at \$720

Bahamas Executes 3 Men

NASSAU, Bahamas (UPI) - When Charles Dickenson dropped through the gallows Tuesday morning at eight, he became the first man executed in the Bahamas since 1976.

Two other convicted killers - Vernal Storr and Winsette Hart — followed Dickenson to the gallows at hourly intervals. Prison officials said none of the convicts were sedated and all went to their deaths without a struggle.

Dickenson, 21, was executed for the murder of 19year-old Desiree Darville. As grave diggers prepared to cover Dickenson's blue plywood coffin with dirt, Miss Darville's brother, Vern, jumped over a restraining fence and spat in the grave.

Thailand Warns Joan Baez

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) - Phnom Penh authorities put their border troops on alert today and said they would repe! and "punish" any forces trying to enter their territory - the strongest warning yet to Joan Baez and 180 Western celebrities planning to truck 200 tons of food to staring Cambodians. Fierce fighting between Kemer Rouge guerrillas who support the deposed Pol Pot and the Vietnameseled troops of Heng Samrin raged over a 12-mile area less than half a mile from the Thai frontier, Thai military sources said. The sources said the fighting was the heaviest since the new year and was in-












Nothing Changes In Soviet Union


laureate Andrei D. Sakharov is to be a good and decent man, outraged at the sinister designs and moral hypocrisy of the closed Communist society in which he is confined. His arrest demonstrates that in the Soviet Union nothing changes. After 63 years of absolute power, the regime still cannot brook criticism that lays bare its sham concern

Sakharov, a famous physicist and father of the Soviet hydrogen bomb, is well-known in Western scientific circles. His persecution will be costly to Soviet scientific exchanges. That it would endanger an important source of information by suppressing this courageous moral rebel is an indication of how much the Soviet regime fears a single cry for freedom

Any degree of tolerance depends upon the regime's interests of the moment in cynically cultivating foreign approval. When foreign anger at the Russian occupation of Afghanistan was at its height and there was no prospect of finding favor abroad, the regime silenced Sakharov. To that extent, he is a casualty of renewed Cold War. There was, of course, the additional imperative to clear Moscow of embarrassing dissenters before the summer Olympic Games.

It is a measure of the growing self-confidence of the Communist regime — or of a slight but lingering concern for foreign opinion — that the measures taken against Sakharov were less harsh that those employed in the Stalin era. The Nobel
Peace Prize winner was simply bundled onto an
airliner without pretense of a trial and shipped off to a closed city out of contact with foreigners.

Rationing: America May Suffer

By ANTHONY HARRIGAN With every threat of a disruption in foreign oil supplies, the Carter administration feels the itch to apply gas rationing. If Congress allows the administration to employ these controls, the American people will suffer

Rationing means misallocation of supplies.

Alan Reynolds, vice President and economist of the First National Bank of Chicago, threw light on this situation in a recent speech. He traced the history of energy

"If anything was in short supply in a few cities," he said, "and abundant in most made this illegal. Rather than send fuel to where it was most in demand, as the price system does naturally all the time, the Energy Department required that shortages

Reynolds explained that "In practice, that meant that a cutback of 20 percent, after 15 percent had been delivered to politicallyfavored users, had to be applied to all dealers based on where the motorists had been buying gasoline in 1978. That left a glut in remote vacation spots and on interstate highways, and a shortage in several urban centers. The exact same thing happened in 1974."

Unfortunately, the Carter administration and its supporters in Congress persist in refusing to recognize these economic realities. They continue to support allocation

Reynolds pointed out that in World War II the government spent a total of \$662 million (about \$2.6 billion today) and employed a maximum 18,000 people to produce large quantities of synthetic rubber. "Today," he said, "the Energy Dept. spends about \$12 billion each year and employs 22,000 people to produce absolutely nothing but paperwork and obstructions." It is this do-nothing agency that's supposed to solve America's

DeWitt, IRS District Director for Florida also noted that payers o interest, dividends, commissions and other types of recipients with their information statements by the

The IRS is urging taxpayers to file their tax returns as early as possible this year "Early filers generally will receive their refunds quicker providing they file complete and accurate tax returns, DeWitt said.

The IRS is estimating that nearly three out of every four Floridians will receive refunds this year and it may take up to 12 weeks for some taxpayers to receive their checks if they file later in the tax season. "Failure to provide W-2 forms and in formation statements by the end of the month would penalize many Floridians who are expecting refund checks,' DeWitt added.

DeWitt urged employees who do not receive their W-2 forms by Thursday to contact their employer immediately "If employees are unable to obtain the form from their employer or former employer by February 15, they should contact the IRS by calling the toll-free number listed in the telephone directory," DeWitt stated. Only after February 15 will the IRS assist employees in obtaining the forms by contacting the employers

The IRS Director reminded taxpayers that they must have a W-2 form from every employer they worked for during the year. "People should not file their returns until they have all their W-7 forms since an amended return would be required later to include the missing tax statement," DeWitt





Judge Denies Request By Bundy For Acquittal

ORLANDO, Fla. (UPI) - Theodore Bundy says he cannot see how any judge or juror could find him guilty of kidnapping and killing a 12-year-old school

"I cannot imagine that a court or any other individual would find me guilty of murder in the first degree," Bundy said Tuesday. His rambling request for acquittal, delivered in the chambers of Circuit Judge Wallace M. Jopling, was denied after the state

Prosecutors claim Bundy somehow convinced young Kimberly Leach to get into a stolen white van parked across the street from her Lake City school the rainy morning of Feb. 9, 1980. The state produced only one witness, ex-paramedic C. L. "Andy" Anderson, who could identify Bundy as the man seen leading the sobbing Leach girl into a van.

MIAMI (UPI)- The Miami Herald reports today that at least nine Dade County police officers who were on the scene when a black insurance executive was fatally beaten after a police chase will be fired this

Dade County Sheriff Bobby Jones said Tuesday that several police officers would be disciplined for their role in the Arthur McDuffie case, but declined to release their names or detail what action would be taken against them.

"We are still trying to make sure the charges are appropriate and precise," said Jones. However, the Herald said formal dismissal notices already have been prepared for each of the officers by the Dade County Safety Department's Internal Review

MIAMI (UPI)— Preserving four months of court proceedings, U. S. District Judge James L. King refused to declare a mistrial Tuesday and replaced a sick juror with an alternate junor so deliberations could continue in the Black Tuna drug smuggling trial. The defense requested the mistrial after doctors told King Monday that juror Isidore Zalc, 77, had suffered a mild heart attack during jury deliberations Saturday. The doctors said Zalc would need two weeks of rest before he could continue deliberations.

King had three options: continue the deliberations with an alternate juror, declare a mistrial or continue the 41/2-month long drug trial with an 11-member jury.

Another helpful additive is guar gum, which is used as a food binder, thickener or texturizer. It is made from leguminous plants grown in the United States, India and Pakistan.

milk products, fruit ices, snack foods, processed fruits, gelatin puddings, fats and oils. Reiser says guar gum may be even more effective than pectin in reducing cholesterol levels in the blood. Two other fibers with anti-cholesterol effects are gum ghatti, which is also known as Indian gum, and carrageenan, an ex-

tract of red algae that is sometimes called Irish moss ex-Gum ghatti, obtained from trees in India and Sri Lanka (formerly Ceylon), is used primaily as a stabilizer in frozen dairy products and non-alcoholic beverages. Carrageenan is used chiefly as a suspending agent in foods, as a clarifying agent in beverages and to control crystal

growth in frozen confections. Of course, processed foods have only small amounts of these additives, considerably less than the quantities that lowered






