

The world bank and international monetary fund may be a good thing, but we have never yet discovered an instance when lending money to other people ended otherwise than in estranged relations.

Great things are happening at Potsdam where the "Big Three" are meeting. We have it on absolute authority that a state designer has been held and that several luncheons have been on the agenda. Lesser matters are barred from publications due to strict censorship.

Prompt response by the Sanford Fire Department and the Naval Air Station, plus heroic efforts of neighbors saved a house from destruction by fire yesterday in the Lake Onro section yesterday. All are to be commended. It is just one of those little episodes in every-day life that re-establishes ones faith in humanity.

The blackout of news from Potsdam has had no effect on dispatches arriving from the Western Pacific where the Japs are going into detail about the unseasonable weather conditions on the home islands. Ed's scheme is a daily occurrence, but unlike the ones we are familiar with over here the Nips are getting theirs in the form of steel and lead.

French Elections

The announcement, by the French Council of Ministers of a national election for October 14, to create a new National Assembly which will frame a new Constitution to be submitted to general referendum, sounds good to the rest of the world.

The government of France in the last quarter century has been far from satisfactory. Whether the 1875 Constitution was at fault, or the spirit of the people failing, or simply that the men of an age to be leaders were killed in the first World War, the fact remains that there were too many parties, none very clear as to its own purpose.

France needs to have a few simple, strong, important issues set before it by two or at most three parties, and presented by a free, honest and forward-looking press. The crooked press of the past should be tossed out of the window.

The fruit of that trip is the birth of wonder and search for knowledge.

News Fighters

It is evident that war corresponding isn't what it used to be in the days of Richard Harding Davis and his followers. For them it was journalistic fame and glory in neat uniforms, safely behind the lines, where they notched with the commanders and mostly wrote what they were told.

And many of them are so keen about their work that they are captured or killed in the process. A recent count showed that more than thirty correspondents had been lost in battle—literally giving their lives for their profession.

It may be well to think of that while skimming lightly over the day's war news. If they also serve who only stand and wait, according to the poet Milton's formula, surely they also fight who only tell about the fighting.

"TOO LATE TO CLASSIFY" BY RUSSELL KAY

For over ten years the writer has been pointing out the enormous agricultural and commercial possibilities offered in the development of ramie in Florida. It is gratifying to note that the Research Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta recently took cognizance of these opportunities and published in its monthly review one of the most complete and comprehensive articles on the subject that have yet seen.

It points out that at the present time 1,000 acres have been planted in this state and 10,000 acres have been set aside for additional planting. Among the larger planters are the Florida Ramie Products Corporation, Newport Industries, Inc. United States Sugar Corporation, the Sea Island Cotton Mills of New York and Dr. Brown Landone of Winter Park. The State itself has between four and five hundred acres planted at the Belle Glade prison farm.

Ramie is a fiber-producing plant that promises to revolutionize the textile industry when its production is reached. It is truly a wonder fiber. Its tensile strength is four times that of hemp and nearly eight times that of silk. Its unusual strength and toughness make it the most durable fiber available today and fabrics made from it wear like iron.

WASHINGTON. The story is current here and so far as I know indicated that when Claude E. Wickard first suspected that his resignation as Secretary of Agriculture might be accepted, he went to President Truman and asked if he might step out of the post of Rural Electrification Administrator.

Getting kicked upstairs in Washington is one thing; getting kicked down or even stepping down on one's own accord is quite another.

But if very well may turn out that Wickard is crazy like a fox. The first place the food committee is going to be bad for a long time, even with all the official reports in the hands of Secretary Clinton P. Anderson. Under the pre-Anderson set-up, with authority scattered over the whole government quadrangle, it was utter confusion, but to single agency, department or executive head can be blamed for that.

In the second place REA is being launched in the greatest year of its history, with \$200,000,000 to lend, exactly twice as much as it had to lend in the two years of 1941 and 1942.

Minute Corner Of Europe Is Seen As Bone Of Contention

By HERMAN R. ALLEN
WASHINGTON. As peace conferences and border settlements approach we are going to hear a lot about stray corners of Europe over which two or more countries have been haggling for years—if not for centuries.

One of these is the district of Teschen, a patch about 30 miles square (area 852.6 square miles) at the point where pre-war Germany, Poland and Czechoslovakia came together. It has been a bone of contention ever since World War I, when both Poland and Czechoslovakia were set up. It had been part of Austrian-Silesia.

Both countries wanted it then. It was finally split between them. In 1938, just after Germany had occupied the Czech Sudetenland,

Council of Ambassadors awarded the western tip third to Czechoslovakia, including the important north-south railroad, called the Oderberg line, and the Karwin coal-producing area. Poland, however, got the city of Teschen and the agricultural section east of the Olsa. The city of Bielitz in the Polish area is an important textile manufacturing center, populated heavily by Germans. It is tied economically with Bielitz. In Polish Galicia, Czechoslovakia got the western suburb of the city of Teschen, called Czecha Teschen.

As far as nationalities go, the ambassadors seem to have drawn a questionable line.

Dr. Isaiah Bowman, now a State Department adviser, included a line in his book, "The New World" which shows the Polish speech boundary as well to the west of the ambassadors' line. The Encyclopedia Britannica says that in 1921 Poles made up more than three-fourths of Teschen's 145,000 population. Czechs were only 3 percent, according to the Encyclopedia, and the rest were Germans and Jews.

It was this spotty and population situation which the Poles claimed as justification for occupying all Teschen in 1938. The 1938 treaty transferred Poland and gave Teschen to its principal, Slovakia, formerly part of Czechoslovakia.

The Karwin coal mines supplied Czechoslovakia with more than half its fuel before the war. They produce the only good bituminous coal in Czechoslovakia. It is inferior to the bituminous produced in Poland but good enough for both gas and coke, essential in smelting iron. Teschen iron ore is good, but the Czechs always had to import more.

The Karwin area also produces "brown coal" or lignite, suitable for heating but not smelting.

Florida As Hub Of Commerce Is Seen By Economic Group

WINTER HAVEN, July 19.—Florida will be made the hub of commerce with nations to the south if plans of the Inter-American Economic Development Commission, appointed today by Dr. A. J. Hanna, chairman of the Inter-American Affairs Division of the Florida State Chamber of Commerce, are successful. Earl W. Brown of Detroit has been named chairman of the commission. Its program will include interpreting to the people of Florida the advantages and the necessity of widely expanded exports and imports. It will analyze and publicize the long-range development plans of the respective countries with particular attention to the bearing of these plans upon the lines of activities which the business of the United States can most successfully undertake and upon the imports which we can most advantageously receive.

Two special projects will be worked out by the commission. They are:


- 1. Provision of necessary research facilities, paying primary
