Harvester Schedule Pondered

In an effort to trim the county's budget for the operation of the hyacinth harvester, Intergovernmental Coordinator Bob Ellis and Department of Natural Resources representative Jerry Perryman have been meeting to figure a projected "work

Last week, the state extended their deadline for county certification of the \$60,000 budget so that the county could re-evaluate budget needs.

Over \$30,000 in state matching funds for harvester operation are being delayed until commissioners certify the budget - which they hope to do tomorrow.

Ellis said that meetings with Perryman, and with county engineer Bill Bush should result in a cost analysis that will give a more realistic estimate of how long the harvester will be in operation, the amount of weeds it will cull from waters. and the man hours necessary to maintain the machine.

Problems arose last week after commission Chairman Sid Vihlen Jr., said he was surprised that the harvester's output of hacked hyacinths would be so prolific. During a demonstration of the machine in the Lake Monroe harbor several weeks ago, the harvester had a much higher production level than the one budgeted truck and front end loader could handle.

Vihlen said that because of the air in the root systems (of the hyacinth plant) that most of the loads of hyacinths carried away in dump trucks were virtually weightless. Many trucks and drivers would be needed instead of the anticipated single vehicle, he said.

But Ellis said that he had since learned that "If the (harvested) plants can be stored five or six days, they lose 6 90 per cent of their volume which is mostly water." Ellis

Southern Bell Split Gets 'Busy Signal'

Public Service Commissioner (PSC) Paula Hawkins called today for splitting Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Co's Florida operation from the rest of the southeast.

"I feel it is incumbent upon this commission to insure Floridians that they are not subsidizing the Bell system operations of any other state," Mrs. Hawkins said in a strement.

Seminole County Southern Bell officials issued a brief statement in reply to Mrs. Hawkins' proposal. "We have not had an opportunity to evaluate the

full impact of such a measure. At this time it's impossible to comment further until we could make a full assessment of what this would do to our company and to our subscribers," Southern Bell Commercial Manager Tom Hunt said.

However, Hunt did promise additional in-

formation once the phone utility has had an op-

portunity to study the proposal. "Following an assessment we would be willing to make a more comprehensive statement," Hunt

It's no secret that such a proposal has been discussed in the past by PSC members. Also, company officials have privately discussed

the possibility of turning the Florida operation into a separate company. Due to Florida's high rate of growth, speculation

is that a "Florida Bell" would be a highly lucrative firm and a leader in the Bell system. However, company officials are reluctant to put

their ideas on record, especially in answer to a commissioner who sits on the decision-making board which sets rates for Florida's utilities.

The most recent decision by the PSC to grant an interim rate hike will cost consumers \$2.85 a month because of an increase in one-party residential customers from \$7.65 to \$9.40 a month.

The request was granted Southern Bell last Monday. The firm is the largest Telephone utility in the state.

Mrs. Hawkins asked to file a separate explanation today of her affirmative vote in the PSC order. granting Southern Bell a \$85.9 million interim rate increase to bring its profits back to a level previously approved by the P.S.C.

Mrs. Hawkins said Southern Bell's Florida operation is big enough to be an independent corporate entity. It makes up 40 per cent of the Atlantabased operation which includes Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina, she said.

Mrs. Hawkins said that she voted for the interim rate hike because of a previous Supreme Court ruling. But she objected to the increase which was granted under bond for possible refund as the first

step in a requested \$216.5 million increase. "It is my feeling that as a result of the Supreme Court's ruling in 1973, this \$85.9 million interim increase, which is the largest telephone increase in Florida's history, was granted without sufficient

staff examination," Mrs. Hawkins said. The Supreme Court opinion in another Southern Bell case said that an interim increase must be granted if no one disputes a company's claim that its profits have fallen below the approved level.

PSC lawyers advised the commission last week that Southern Bell's claim was supported in

OPEC Gets The Message

The Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries finally got the message. In agreeing to take part in a world economic conference at the bidding of their customers, the OPEC ministers are conceding that they cannot use their oil monopoly solely to build up their own economic and political

The message is as old as Aesop, who said it all in his fable about the man who was not satisfied when his goose began laying golden eggs. He wanted more - too much - and wound up with a

Resistance to the high oil prices dictated by OPEC has already led to declines in demand which have forced some Arab exporters to cut back on production. President Ford's decision to impose a new tariff on U.S. oil imports as part of a tough new energy conservation program portends a further decline. Although the United States of America and Western Europe are not in full agreement on how best to approach the economic problems created by the oil cartel, they have committed themselves to the principle of a cooperative response.

The Arab oil producers surely are beginning to see the magnitude of the crisis building in the Free World economic system - the system on which their own future prosperity depends. The \$3.1 billion deficit in the U.S. trade balance last year, caused by the quadrupling of oil prices, has given another jolt to the interantional monetary system. Our bill for foreign oil rose by \$16.8 billion over 1973 even though we cut our oil imports by 5 per cent. The trade balances of many other oil-importing nations have been hit much harder.

It should be apparent by now to the oil exporters that they are forcing their customers into developing alternate energy sources and otherwise planning further cutbacks in their oil purchases.

The oil exporters are accusing Secretary of State Henry Kissinger of saber-rattling in his remarks about the possibility of war if the energy squeeze on the industrialized world reaches the point of "strangulation." His candid appraisal of what might happen probably had more than a little to do with the recent OPEC decision in Algiers, but not because the oil producers see any threat of military action in Mr. Kissinger's words.

They know the industrial nations are not spoiling for a war. What worries them, we are sure, is the threat of what the victims of their policies might manage to do in an effort to avoid the kind of economic strangulation that would precipitate a

No doubt about it, America has found its scapegoat. It's the automobile. We have saddled it with blame for air pollution and urban sprawl, and everybody knows that its appetite for gas is causing the energy crisis. Some scientists even say that tornadoes are caused by air currents churned up by cars passing each other on freeways.

Any day now we expect to hear that the recent flurry of earthquakes in the Imperial Valley was triggered by the vibrations of cars and trucks pounding across Interstate 8. Why not? The nice thing about blaming all our troubles on the automobile is that it can't talk back.

WASHINGTON - (NEA) - Larry Pressler. freshman representative from the First District of South Dakota, is a most unusual young man. He's decided that as long as he's in Congress, his income tax returns, all personal financial dealings and business connections will be open to the public. Top members of his staff will follow

Pressler plans to co-sponsor a bill to levy the same requirement on all senators, represen-

He refuses honorariums for speech making, an congressmen. In his campaign, he turned back all contributions from organizations - business, agricultural, lator and educational. Threefourths of his money came in donations of \$25 or

When running for office, Pressler promised to return 10 per cent of his congressional salary. Finding he could not legally take a unilateral pay cut, he's turning a tenth of his pay over to the government of his state. The big, fancy, expensive congressman's chair



Alarm System Foils Try At Theft Of Art Gems

VENICE, Italy (AP) - An alarm system foiled an attempt during the night to steal paintings by Titian, Donatello and other Renaissance masters from the Basilica of the Friars, the Venetian police reported today. The attempt came four days after thieves made off with three priceless paintings by Raphael and Piero della Francesca from the Ducal Palace in Urbino, 70 miles east of Florence. Officials blamed that theft on the lack of an

The target of the thieves in Venice was a chapel of the basilica containing a dozen masterpieces, including an altarpiece of the Madonna by Titian and paintings by Donatello, Bellini and Vivarini,

The police said the burglars apparently had studied the basilica very carefully and broke through two metal gates and two doors without setting off alarms. But when they tried to get into the chapel, they set off an alarm siren installed two years ago and all the lights in the basilica went on automatically. The thieves escaped.

IRA Cease Fire Begins

BELFAST, Northern Ireland (AP) - The Irish Republican Army begins a new cease-fire tonight. But fears that Protestant extremists would sabotage it were heightened by a machine-gun attack on a crowd of worshipers leaving a Roman Catholic Church.

The IRA's Provisional wing announced it would suspend its guerrilla war at 6 p.m. (1 p.m. EST). No time limit for the cease-fire was set, but London newspapers reported an IRA spokesman in Dublin warned: "This is only a peace initiative. A permanent cease-fire is still a long way

William Craig, leader of the extremist Protestant Vanguard Movement, said the IRA's Catholic leaders were probably trying "to gain credibility and win a breathing space." He demanded the Catholic guerrillas "surrender of their arms."

Blacks Issue Africa Warning

DAR ES SALAAM, Tanzania (AP) - Black Africa will insist on black rule in South Africa and will never agree to apartheid even if the blacks get control of Rhodesia and South-West Africa, President Julius Nyerere of Tanzania

"The majority of people in South Africa will continue demanding the rights of democracy that have been denied to them and Africa will continue supporting them," said Nyerere in an interview with The Associated Press. "You can't say majority rule is all right in Rhodesia but because South Africa is an independent state then majority rule is not an objective of Africa." Nyerere conceded that the South African government

Loch Arbor Woman Dies In Midnight Fire



Maxine Thompson Succumbs

Maxine Thompson, 57, a secretary for local government agencies for 15 years, died in a midnight fire that destroyed her Sanford home at 215 Vinewood Drive, Loch Arbor, sheriffs deputies

Mrs. Thompson, a widow, lived alone at the address, and had been recuperating at home for the last two weeks with a cracked wrist in a cast, of-

She joined the Sanford Airport Authority as secretary to Airport Manager J. S. "Red" Cleveland in 1970 after serving as secretary to the late Bob Brown, Seminole County Zoning Director

Neighbors reported flames leaping from the south end garage and kitchen area of Mrs. Thompson's concrete block home at 11:50 p.m. Sheriff's deputy R. S. Morton arrived on the scene four minutes later, according to sheriff's reports and said he was unable to gain entry to the smoke-

Seminole County Fire units arrived minutes later and broke through a bedroom window on the north end of the house.

Deputies said firemen found Mrs. Thompson lying on the bedroom floor near the window but were unable to revive her. She was pronounced dead at Seminole Memorial Hospital.

Fire units, using water tanker trucks because the Loch Arbor residential area has no fire hydrants, contained the blaze to the garage, kitchen, rear porch and central areas of the house which were gutted by the fire.

Authorities said Mrs. Thompson is believed to have died of smoke inhalation but an autopsy was to be performed today to determine the cause of

Sheriff's and County Fire Department investigators started a probe today in the ruins of the hcuse in efforts to determine the cause of the fire. An automobile in the double-car garage was also destroyed by the fire.

















