



Sanford Needs A Port Terminal - - NO

There has been a long determined belief that Sanford should have a port terminal although our city is on "dead-end street" as far as water traffic is concerned. Efforts toward this end have proved to no avail as of

But in view of present operations and announcements in recent weeks of new operations slated for the St. Johns River and Lake Monroe, The Herald believes that the time has arrived for action in establishing a port terminal. Even though the federal government is balking at giving assistance.

Barge traffic already using the waterway between Jacksonville and Senford is operated by Standard Oil, Gulf and Orange State petroleum firms, Allied Chemical and Sanford Pipeline (for jet fuel for the Navy

On tap is Merry Bros. of Georgia who has obtained a franchise to operate a commercial barge line into this city. Another barge line has held but never used a barge fran-

Now we have reached the point where the St. Johns-Indian River canal appears to be a certainty within the next few years. It is a matter of record this canal was approved by the State Legislature and necessary funds appropriated . . . prior to the Civil War. The conflict halted the operation . . . until now. This last Legislature approved a canal district and Governor Bryant named the directors last week. Sanford's own John Krider and John Brumley are Seminole County's representatives on this five-man board, and they are its officers. As soon as their bonds and caths of office are accepted, they will commence with a vengeance to put through this waterway.

The St. Johns forms 'way south of here, south of Lake Helen Blazes, in the vicinity of Melbourne and meanders through here to Jacksonville. Pleasure and commercial craft coming up the St. Johns have no access to the East Coast but must turn about and return to Jacksonville.

This canal, connecting from the northern end of Lake Harney to the Indian River in the vicinity of Maytown, will permit water traffic from Jacksonville through Palatka and Sanford to the ocean and Cape Ca-

With the opening of the canal in a year or two or so, water traffic through here will leap a hundredfold. We should be ready with a port terminal to service these crafts and to provide dockage and warehouse facilities.

The City of Sanford has been dickering for a long, long time with the government for a loan to finance a feasibility study. The law provides that should this loan be granted and the plans resulting therefrom become reality, the city must repay the loan. But if nothing results, the law permits that the loan need not be repaid.

Some 17 years ago the City asked for and received a loan for a feasibility study for a water expansion system. The plans were junked. The law provides the loan need not be

repaid. But the federal government specifically the Housing and Home Finance Administration—is holding this 17-year-old loan over the heads of the City fathers. They want that old loan repaid . . . and are balking at granting the new loan for the port terminal study.

The Herald sent off a telegram a week ago to HHFA at Atlanta requesting a statement for this editorial. A lengthy answer was received in the mail yesterday. Boiling it down bluntly, the answer said HHFA is not about to grant the City a \$10,-000 loan until it repays the loan made back in 1946, "Repayment was requested after a plans comparison revealed," the letter reads, in part, "that the facilities under construction served the same areas and satisfied the same community need for which the original plans were developed." So - the answer is "No"the City is NOT going to get this

At the same time The Herald telegraphed Harold Scott, of the Jacksonville engineering firm of Smith. Reynolds and Hills, who was representing the City in its efforts to obtain the loan from HHFA. And who would have received the \$10,000 loan—if granted—as payment for a feasibility study.

The St. Johns - Indian River Canal District is authorized and the directors appointed. Activity is expected to take place on the canal from the St. Johns River to the Indian River.

At present, Sanford is on a dead-end route. It is desirable that Sanford establish a port and obtain barge operations approval by the Interstate Commerce Commission to take advantage of through navigation from Jacksonville to the Cape; also to serve Central Florida with cheap navigation transporta-

The HHFA loan is not required to put through this proposed port terminal. It would be of tremendous help, of course. But the refusal of HHFA to go along does not mean the desire for a port terminal has to be junked.

The City . . . if the Commission members can "find \$10,000 . . . can make its own feasibility study. True, much, much more than \$10,000 would be required to finance a port terminal. This could be done, too . . . whether by federal or state loan or by a bond issue.

The Herald, feeling it is not alone in the great desire to have a port terminal established, queried several responsible leaders. Six, to be exact, over and above Mr. Scott. Local leaders, we mean. Men who have a great and honest desire to see Sanford, Seminole County and East Central Florida grow and prosper.

We present these opinions for your perusal and study: Howard H. Hodges, president of

Sanford Atlantic National Bank: In considering the question of establishing port terminal facilities in Sanford, there are three basic factors that come to mind. Primarily, the purpose of developing port facilities would be to prepare our city for the ultimate construction of the cross state barge canal and the Sanford-Ttiusville canal. Secondly, the development of a port terminal would be the key for opening the door to commercial service up and down the entire East Coast and would place Sanford on the "main street" of this traffic. Third, the general pattern in other cities in the past has proven a direct relationship between an increase in port facilities and in in-

If Sanford lacks good port facilities, we will be by-passed by any benefit to be derived from the cross state barge canal. With the present rail installation and with the addition of an airport and port terminal facility, Sanford could be a distribution point for all of Central Florida. People of Central Floride would benefit economically by freight rate advantages which would most likely occur if the port were developed. For instance, under construction in Jacksonville at the present time is a brick foundry. This is a high cost item to the Central Florida user due to the present transportation and terminal problems. With the advent of a port terminal, brick could be handled in bulk by the most economical method and distributed through warehouse facilities which we would have.

Sanford now has most limited dock accommodations, therefore the tonnage handled is insignificant in comparison to the potential for a river port which has a 12-foot channel leading to its door. I want to reiterate the fact that port terminul facilities come first before we can reap the benefits of statewide progress in transportation. In other words, if we have the terminal, tonnage will logically follow, but without the terminal the handling of tonnage is impossible.

John Alexander, Seminole County Commissioner:

With indications being that the Cross State and Sanford-Titusville Canals may become a reality, Sanford could be the "Doorway to Central Florida" as a major distribution center for water transported goods so a port terminal is certainly necessary to take advantage of this opportunity.

Mack N. Cleveland Jr., State Senator:

The establishment of a Port Terminal in Sanford along with the construction of the St. Johns - Indian River Canal would open the door to the greatest industrial and commercial development in the history of Sanford and Seminole County and could easily result in Sanford becoming the commerce trade center of Central Florida. Commissioner: With a port terminal here at Sanford we would become the center of shipping activity for Central Florida and it would be the connecting link to the economy of the

Development of such a facility on Lake Monroe will certainly become a reality when the Cross State Barge canal and the Sanford-Canaveral canal are built.

With the growing missile industry stretching further out from Cape Canaveral all the time, it will become more and more necessary to have a water route safer and shorter than the present route around the state of Florida to the Cape.

The City of Sanford requested a loan from the Federal government for a study to ascertain the feasibility of the immediate construction of a port terminal. If proven feasible the best method of financing this project will have to be determined; whether by the City or from private investors. William C. Hutchison Sr., traffic consultant:

Quoting from another newspaper, the proposed port terminal opens new doors of opportunity for the development of the City's potential.

Working with the Chamber of Commerce some years ago, I made a survey of shippers from this area and they all expressed a desire for water service. All surveys were favorable for a port terminal at Sanford.

The City Commission retained a bond representative and his survey was also favorable. But there was a change in the Commission, the bond representative was paid off and the matter dropped until the present time.

I can remember before World War II when there was water traffic on the St. Johns. Shippers from throughout Central Florida shipped by water; and goods brought in were trucked to Orlando and other

I feel we should capitalize on our natural advantages. It will be a boon to Sanford, Orlando and East Central Florida.

The Sanford Herald feels, with the letter from HHFA published on the front page Monday, that it has presented a true and complete need for a port terminal here to provide the economic boost needed for the City and the County and the area.

We feel the time has arrived when those-in-power should discontinue "kicking around the proposition," should not let the port terminal die in favor of other promotional schemes, such as \$50,000 for recreational developments — but rather should "go after" this port terminal to provide the economic boom which could finance these other thoughts. Let's forget politics and think of

Aviation Plan Commission Will Study Field

TALLAHASSEE (UPI) Gov. Farris Bryant named two members today to the newly-created Aviation Study and Advisory Commission. Bryant named B. L. Mullis, Oklawaha, and E. L. Williams, Miami.

Two House members and two Senators are still to be named by Senate President Wilson Carraway and House Speaker Mallory Horne.

The commission was set up by the 1963 Legislature to study aviation and recommend to the 1965 session changes in laws governing this field.

The Legislature said private and commercial aviation are of great importance to economic development of Florida. But, it said, with well over 2,000 aircraft now registered in the state, laws for promotion and regulation of the industry lack uniformity and scope, hampering an effective program of promotion and development.

The visitors, ranging from scientists to schoolboys and tourists to tradesmen, were lining up coveted sites to watch the awesome phenomenon of the moon passing between the sun and the earth, The nearly plateau-like sum-

mit of 1,532-foot Cadillac Mountain, highest Atlantic Coast elevation between here and Argentina, offered a perfect vantage point of the spectacle that will turn day into night.

The total eclipse will be seen along a 60-mile-wide swath from Japan, across the North Pacific to Alaska, Canada and Maine before ending in the Atlantic at Sunset.

The celestial event will be Observed as a partial eclipse elsewhere in the Northern Hemisphere and as far south as Venezuela,

At 5:47 p.m., EDT, the moon will block out the sun entirely ever this area. The air temperature may drop; stars will be visible, and the sudden darkness will trick nocturnal insects and animals into stirring prematurely.


